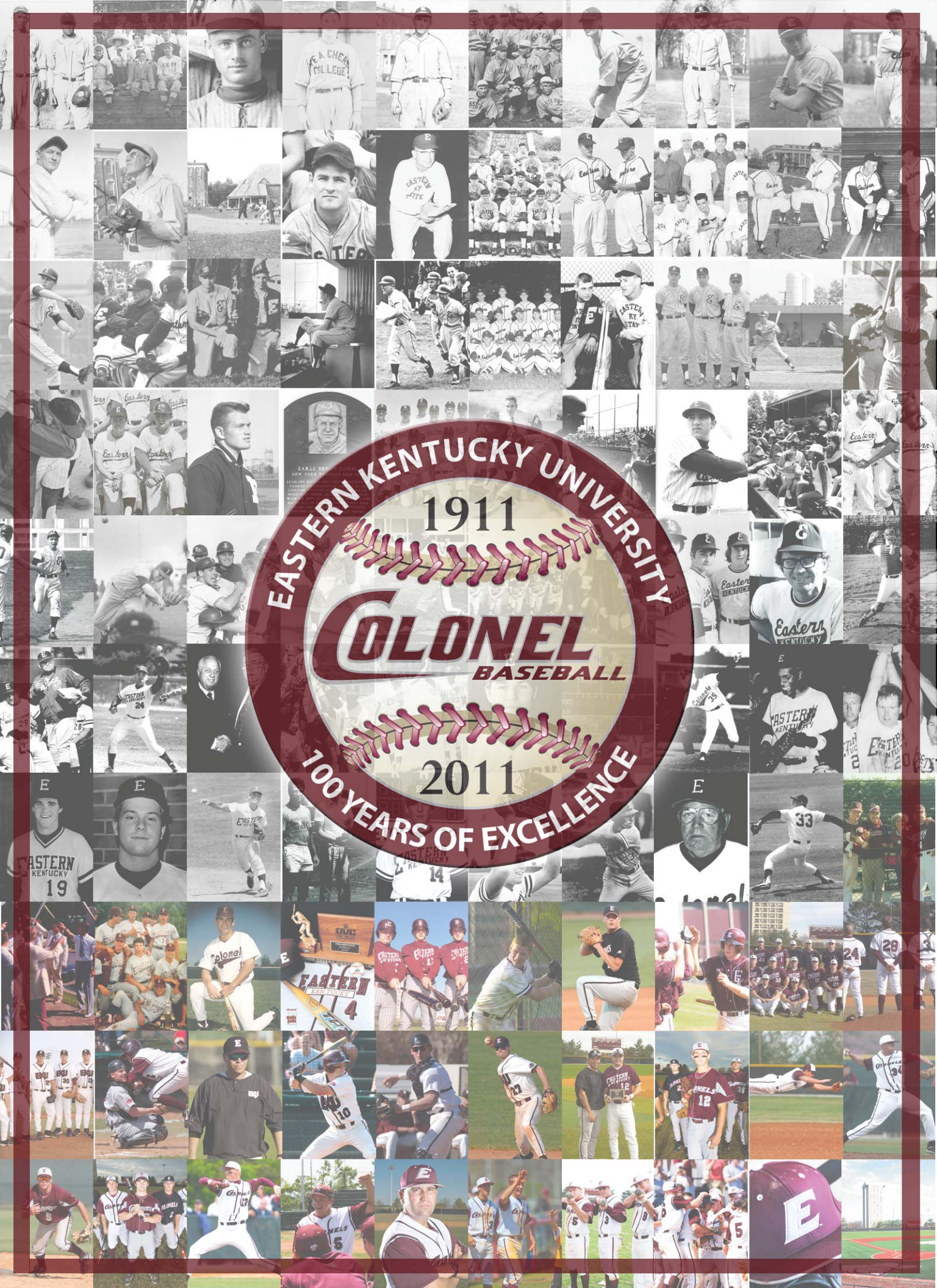

How to Get to EKU

From Cincinnati, Ohio and Points North:

Take I-75 South through Lexington, Ky. Continue south on I-75 Richmond/Knoxville to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Huntington, W.Va., and Points East:

Take I-64 West for 104 miles to exit #96 (Fort Boonesborough S.P.) and remain on State Highway 627 until intersecting I-75 at exit #95. Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Lexington, Ky.:

Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Bowling Green, Ky., and Points West:

Take I-65 North to exit #43 (Glasgow) and travel east on the Cumberland Parkway through Somerset to exit #41 on I-75. Travel north on I-75 to exit #87. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Knoxville, Tenn., and Points South:

Take I-75 North approximately 162 miles to exit #87 in Kentucky. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.





Turkey Hughes Field

Built in the 1960s and named after legendary coach Charles "Turkey" Hughes, Turkey Hughes Field has been the site of 13 E.K.U. Ohio Valley Conference baseball championships.

With its convenient and attractive location right on campus next to Alumni Coliseum, "The Turk" is a great place to take in a college baseball game.

The field has dimensions of 330 ft. X 410 ft. X 340 ft. and features a bullpen area, hitting cages, ample bleacher space and a press box. In 2009, E.K.U. invested over half a million dollars on Turkey Hughes Field, adding a state-of-the-art synthetic turf infield, a hitter's eye in center field, netting and a brick wall backstop.

The hitter's eye covers the right field line all the way to the scoreboard to give Turkey Hughes Field a new backdrop. The synthetic turf covers the entire infield, including the base paths and home plate. The only part that remains clay is the pitcher's mound.

Last year, Nearly \$100,000 worth of improvements went into extending a brick wall to enclose a beautiful, newly graded and sodded outfield.

The renovations will revolutionize the way the E.K.U. baseball program is able to develop its players. The synthetic turf infield will allow the players to practice in spite of bad weather, and far fewer games will be cancelled due to the improvement.

"We are very excited about the renovations at Turkey Hughes Field," head coach Jason Stein said. "The improvements will not only enhance the experience of our players but also the experience of our great fanbase."

The fanbase Stein alluded to plays an integral part in the team's success as the Colonels went 19-7 at home in 2009 and 15-6 at home in 2010.

Additional renovations to Turkey Hughes Field are expected to occur in the future.

Jason Stein is now in his third season as the head baseball coach at Eastern Kentucky University. In just two years on the job, Stein has already produced 11 All-Ohio Valley Conference performers, three All-Americans and one player selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Although his stated goal is to win championships, Stein (pronounced STEEN) moved the EKU baseball program in the right direction in 2010 as the Colonels posted a record of 28-27, a team batting average above .300 for the second consecutive season and qualified for the OVC Tournament following a two-year hiatus.

EKU's bright future was on display at the OVC Tournament as freshman right-hander Anthony Bazzani led the Colonels to their first post-season victory since 2007 by dominating Murray State on the first day of the event, going eight innings and nearly setting a neutral site OVC Tournament record with 10 strikeouts.

Stein's impact in 2010 also stretched outside of the baseball diamond and into the classroom as he was awarded EKU's Coaches Academic Enhancement Award for his emphasis on academics. The baseball team earned a cumulative GPA of 3.03 in the fall of 2010.

Upon taking over the Colonel baseball program in the summer of 2008, Stein inherited a team featuring just five pitchers with Division I experience, two of whom recorded a win the previous season and none of whom pitched more than 30 innings; however, powered by Stein's philosophy of smart at-bats, aggressive base running and solid defense, the Colonels won 27 games in 2009 and, astoundingly, were one win away from making a trip to the OVC Tournament. In just his first year on the job, Stein posted the fourth-best winning percentage (.529) of all 23 first-year Division I head baseball coaches in America.

Under Stein's guidance, EKU's offense was one of the best in the country in 2009. The Colonels were 10th nationally in batting average (.345), 10th in scoring (9.2 runs/game), fifth in triples (29), seventh in stolen bases (123) and fifth in stolen bases/game (2.41).

The Colonels' success under Stein in 2009 was legitimized by postseason awards. Sophomore third baseman Jayson Langfels, who won the OVC batting title with a .441 batting average and led the country with 1.67 RBI/game, was named a second team All-American by collegebaseballinsider.com and an honorable mention All-Ping performer by ping!baseball.com. Meanwhile, senior outfielder Matt Davis, who was fourth nationally with 1.45 runs/game, was named a Louisville Slugger third team All-American by Collegiate Baseball magazine.



At the conference level, four Colonels were named All-OVC following the season, none of whom had received All-OVC recognition before 2009. Davis and Langfels were named first team All-OVC while junior first baseman Anthony Ott-rando and freshman shortstop Richie Rodriguez were named to the second team. Rodriguez was the only freshman in the league to earn All-OVC honors. The four All-OVC honorees were the most from EKU since 2006.

On top of that, and as an indicator of the direction the program is headed under Stein, three Colonels were named to the OVC All-Freshman Team: Rodriguez, outfielder Michael Garcia and designated hitter Jacob Daniel.

A two-time All-OVC honoree for EKU Athletics Hall of Fame coach Jim Ward from 1992-95, Stein later served as an assistant coach to Ward from 1998-2000 before coming to Richmond from Belmont University where he served seven years as an assistant coach, the last two as assistant head coach.

"To be able to return to my alma mater and coach on the field where I bled and cried as a player is unbelievable," Stein said. "Every young coach wants the opportunity to take over a program with a history of excellence and winning championships. To inherit such a program to which I already have strong emotional ties is a dream come true."

Stein has done more than coach winning baseball for his alma mater. Since arriving in 2008, Stein and his staff have raised nearly half a million dollars to be used for renovations to Turkey Hughes Field. In the summer of 2009, a state-of-the-art synthetic turf infield was installed at the field, a brick backstop was put in place, new nets and poles were installed in the outfield and a hitter's eye was placed in center field. In the summer of 2010, the brick backstop was extended to enclose a beautiful, newly graded and sodded outfield. Stein plans to make at least one addition to the field every year henceforth.

Stein has embraced his role as a head coach in the college baseball community, as he has spoken at numerous state and national coaching conventions. In January of 2010, he was selected to give a talk about base stealing called "Stealing the Big Inning" in front of over 3,000 of the top college baseball coaches in the country at the American Baseball Coaches Association's national convention in Dallas.

A native of Ashland, Ky. and a graduate of Paul G. Blazer High School, Stein arrived at EKU as a player in 1992. Noted initially for his glove,

specifically his ability to turn the double play, Stein proved his worth at the plate as a sophomore when he won the 1993 OVC batting title with a .378 average. The second baseman was named second team All-OVC that year, and was selected to the OVC All-Tournament team after hitting .400 in post-season play. Stein collected 19 multiple-hit games his sophomore season.

As a junior, Stein posted a .301 batting average and was named honorable mention All-OVC, despite missing two weeks of the season with an injury. He was second on the team in hits that season with 56, and finished the year on a tear, hitting safely in 17 of his last 20 games. Stein moved to shortstop his senior year, and was just as productive as the previous two seasons. As a co-captain for the Colonels, he earned first team All-OVC honors in 1995. He batted .333 that season, led the team with 76 hits and only struck out five times in 228 at-bats.

Stein finished his Colonel career with a .334 batting average and was named OVC Player of the Week three times.

"I was very impressed with Jason when we met because of his baseball knowledge and his passion for EKU," Director of Athletics Mark Sandy said. "I am certain he will be an outstanding coach and an excellent representative for the University. Now that he has the opportunity to lead his own program, I believe Jason will prove that he is a rising star in the coaching ranks."

From 1996-97, Stein served as a student assistant under Ward, with his primary on-field duties including working with middle infielders and coaching third base. In 1998, Stein became an assistant coach, and a year later was named recruiting coordinator. As an assistant at EKU, Stein coached more than 15 All-OVC selections, 10 OVC Player of the Week honorees and seven OVC All-Tournament team selections. The Colonels won the OVC regular season title in 2000, and placed in the top three in tournament play all three years Stein was an assistant.

Stein served as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Belmont from 2001-05, and was named assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator in 2006. In Stein's tenure at Belmont, he coached 24 All-Atlantic Sun Conference selections, 120 Atlantic Sun Academic All-Conference selections and 16 Atlantic Sun Player of the Week honorees. He recruited or coached nine players selected to play in major league organizations, including the highest draft pick in school history, Blake Owen, who went to the Baltimore Orioles in the sixth round of the 2005 draft. Stein was also responsible for two or more players drafted in back-to-back years for the first time in Belmont's Division I era.

Stein recruited and coached the 2006 Atlantic Sun Freshman of the Year, Derek Wiley, and also recruited and coached the Atlantic Sun's first ever dual all-conference selection in Carlo Testa, who was named first team all-conference as a left-handed pitcher and first team all-conference as an outfielder.

With Stein's help, Belmont reached the final game of 2007 Atlantic Sun Conference tournament. The Bruins broke the school record for wins twice during Stein's tenure, and they also defeated three nationally-ranked teams.

Under Stein's guidance, the Bruins set school records in nearly every single-season offensive category, including most home runs, most RBI,

most total bases and most stolen bases. The Bruins swiped 518 bases during Stein's time, and posted school records of 103 stolen bases in 2002 and 124 in 2005.

Stein earned a bachelor's degree in ornamental horticulture from EKU in 1997, and received a master's degree in sports administration from EKU in 1998.

In 2005, Stein married the former Terri Edge. The couple resides in Richmond with their four-year old son, Ryker, two-year old daughter, Riley, and nine-month old son, Jaxton.





Assistant Coach • Third Year at EKU

Jerry Edwards

Alma Mater: North Carolina Wesleyan, 1999

Jerry Edwards is in his third season of his second tenure as an assistant/pitching coach at EKU. Edwards served as the pitching coach at EKU from 1999-2001 under former skipper Jim Ward, and was the interim head coach of the Colonels in between the tenures of Ward and Elvis Dominguez.

"Jerry brings 10-plus years experience as a pitching coach at the college level," head coach Jason Stein said. "As a recruiter, he is a tireless worker, and he has many connections throughout the country."

In 2009, Edwards inherited a pitching staff that had lost nine of 14 arms from the previous season. Only two of his pitchers recorded a win in 2008 and none of them worked more than 30 innings. Edwards, however, was able to piece together a staff that year composed primarily of raw underclassmen, freshmen, and career relief pitchers, and that staff was able to produce 27 wins.

One of the raw underclassmen Edwards was able to transform in 2009 was sophomore left-hander Paul Duncan. In 2008, Duncan threw just 14.2 innings and compiled an ERA of 9.20. Under Edwards' tutelage, however, Duncan recorded a team-high seven wins last season and was one of the OVC leaders with four complete games.

Then, on May 1, Duncan, pitched just the sixth no-hitter in school history against Chicago State. Following the no-hitter, Duncan was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball magazine and OVC Pitcher of the Week. He was also named to that week's College Baseball Foundation and Diamond Sports National All-Star Lineup.

In 2010, Edwards developed a relatively unknown freshman right-hander out of Georgia named Anthony Bazzani. Bazzani was knocked around early in the season in starts against High Point and Southeast Missouri. However, under the persistent guidance of Edwards, Bazzani transformed into one of the top pitchers in the OVC by May. He was named OVC Pitcher of the Week after he worked all nine innings, allowed one earned run, scattered seven hits and struck out six against a tough Jacksonville State lineup on May 15. He then led the Colonels to their first OVC Tournament win since 2007 as he dominated Murray State on May 26, going eight innings and nearly setting a neutral site OVC Tournament record with 10 strikeouts. Bazzani finished the season with a 5-3 record, led EKU in innings pitched (77.1) and opponent batting average (.282) and was named to the OVC All-Freshman Team.

Through his recruiting efforts, Edwards has begun to replenish the depth of EKU's pitching staff. He has brought 24 new faces into to the

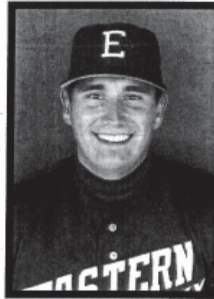

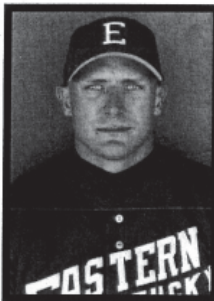

program in just over two years, and 13 of those faces have been pitchers.

"Jerry is exceptional at finding talented student-athletes from across the country," Stein said. "And, more importantly, he is great at instructing those student-athletes when they arrive on campus. We are lucky to have such an exceptional teacher of the game on staff."

Edwards arrived at EKU from Louisburg College in Louisburg, N.C., where he was the pitching coach since 2005. While coaching at the two-year college, Edwards saw nine of his pitchers signed by Division I schools, and two of his pitchers drafted and signed in the top 12 rounds of the MLB Draft.

Before Louisburg, Edwards served as the head coach at Hiwassee College in Madisonville, Tenn. While at Hiwassee, Edwards saw two of his players taken in the MLB Draft.

In between his stints at EKU and Hiwassee, Edwards was an Associate Scout for three years with the Atlanta Braves under the guidance of Area Scouting Supervisor Billy Best.

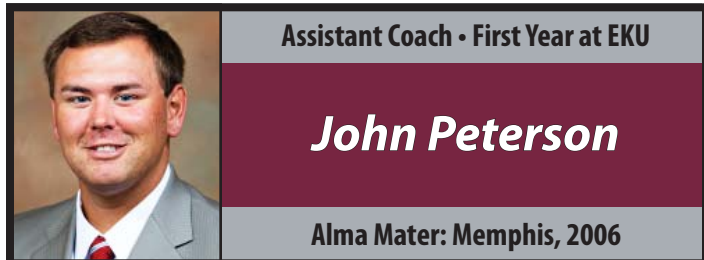
While serving under Ward at EKU, Edwards helped the Colonels to their most recent OVC regular season championship in 2000.

Before coaching at EKU, Edwards spent two years at North Carolina Wesleyan College as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator under current North Carolina head coach, Mike Fox. During those two years, he helped lead North Carolina Wesleyan to the 1999 Division III National Championship.

Edwards began his coaching career at the Enfield Academy in Whitakers, N.C. under the tutelage of current East Carolina head coach, Billy Godwin.

Edwards earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from North Carolina Wesleyan College in 1999, and he earned a master's degree in physical education/sports administration from EKU in 2001.

He lives in Richmond with his wife Amy and their two children Jacob (10) and Claire (8).



John Peterson is beginning his first season as an assistant coach for the Eastern Kentucky University baseball program. Peterson joins the Colonels after spending the last three seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Middle Tennessee State University.

His duties at EKU will include working with catchers and hitters and assisting with recruiting. He will also serve as the EKU baseball camps director.

"John brings a wealth of knowledge to our baseball program," Stein said. "He has won championships and he knows what it takes to be a consistent NCAA regional participant. He is an excellent teacher and communicator, and he will work tirelessly at developing our student-athletes and assisting in recruiting quality student-athletes into our program."

While at MTSU, Peterson helped the Blue Raiders win the 2009 regular season and tournament championship in the Sun Belt, one of the premiere college baseball conferences in the country. The Blue Raiders also broke nearly every offensive school record and were one of the top hitting teams in the country during Peterson's three years at the school.

On an individual level, Peterson, who was a catcher during his college playing years, worked with MTSU catcher Drew Robertson during his tenure in Murfreesboro and watched as Robertson was drafted in the 48th round by the Kansas City Royals in the 2010 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

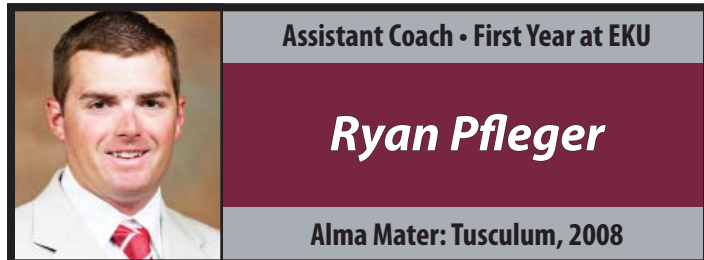
Before his stint at MTSU, Peterson served as the hitting and catching coach at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham, Ala. His duties at Jefferson State included assisting in recruiting, organization of practice and instructing players in hitting mechanics. While there, Peterson worked with a NJCAA third-team All-American catcher.

Prior to his stint at Jefferson State, Peterson served as a student coach at the University of Memphis. As a student coach at Memphis, he worked with the pitching staff, implemented defensive drills with small groups and assisted with on-campus recruiting.

Peterson played at Memphis as a catcher and first baseman for two years. He transferred to Memphis from Cleveland State Community College in Cleveland, Tenn., where he played as a sophomore. He played ball his freshman year at Jackson State Community College in Jackson, Tenn.

Along with his expanse of knowledge, Peterson touts a proven pedigree as he is the son of long-time and highly successful MTSU head baseball coach, Steve Peterson.

Peterson married the former Myranda Howland in the summer of 2008 and the couple will reside in Richmond.



Ryan Pflieger is entering his first season as a volunteer assistant baseball coach with the Eastern Kentucky Colonels. Pflieger arrives in Richmond following one season as an assistant coach at Columbia State Community College in Columbia, Tenn.

His duties at EKU will include working with outfielders, assisting with pitchers and performing other administrative tasks.

"Ryan comes very highly recommended to our program and he is a great addition to our staff," head coach Jason Stein said. "He is an outstanding young coach and his future in the world of college baseball is a bright one."

Before his stint at Columbia State, Pflieger was an assistant coach at Seymour High School in Seymour, Tenn. He was in charge of Seymour's pitching staff and helped lead the Eagles to a regular season district championship and a run to the regional finals.

In the summer of 2009, Pflieger helped coach the Wisconsin Woodchucks of the Northwood Collegiate Summer League, one of the country's premiere summer college wooden bat leagues. He served as the Woodchucks' bullpen coach and was also in charge of the pitchers' conditioning. Under Pflieger's tutelage, the Woodchucks compiled the fourth lowest ERA in the ten-team league.

Pflieger played his college ball at Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tenn. During his four years at Tusculum, he was a member of four conference championship teams, two conference tournament championships and three NCAA participant teams. As a senior, Pflieger went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA while leading the Pioneer pitching staff in appearances (all out of the bullpen).

Pflieger graduated from Tusculum in 2008 with a degree in history.

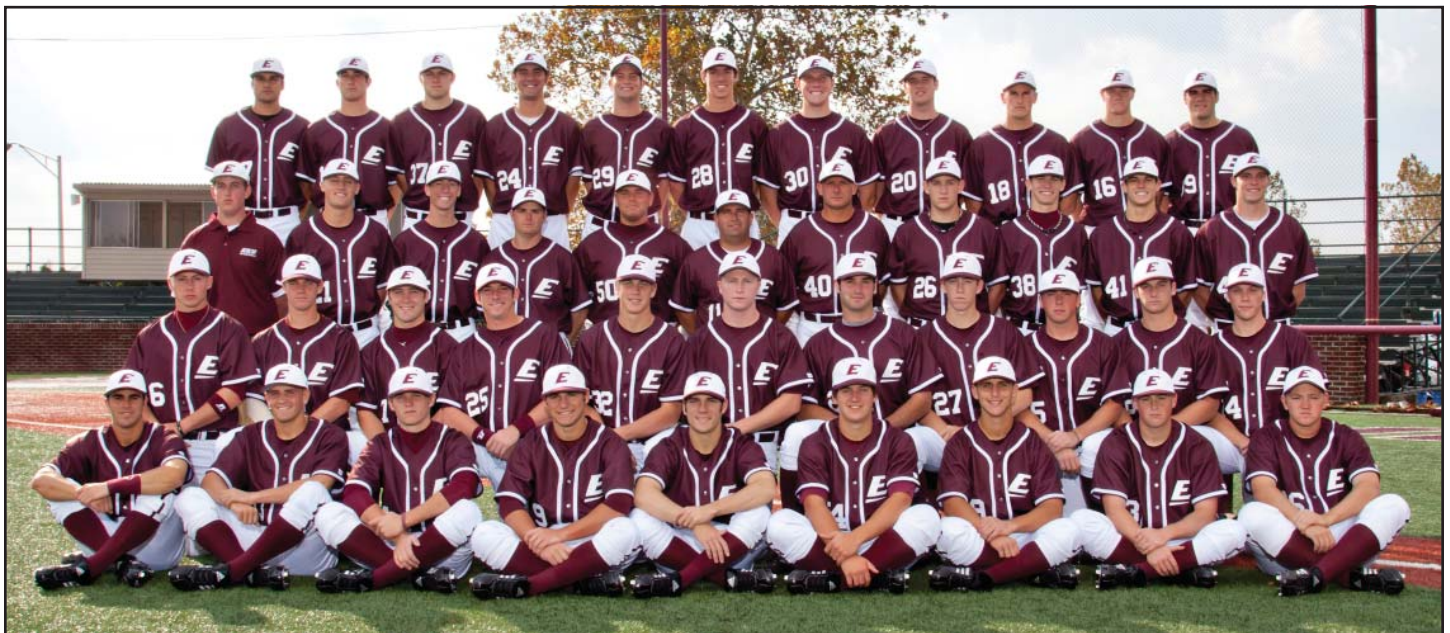

Season Outlook

Although its stated goal is to win championships, the EKU baseball program moved in the right direction in 2010 as the Colonels posted a record of 28-27, a team batting average above .300 for the second consecutive season and qualified for the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament following a two-year hiatus.

Picked by league head coaches to finish fifth out of nine OVC teams in 2011, the Colonels return all but three players who saw significant action last season and have their sights set on surprising people with a deep postseason run.

Pitching

"Baseball begins and ends with pitching," head coach Jason Stein said. "And, fortunately, our pitching staff was a bright spot in the fall and spring."

Plagued by graduation in 2009 and injuries in 2010, the Colonel pitching staff now looks to be as strong, quality and quantity-wise, as it has been in years. Sophomore right-hander Anthony Bazzani, who turned in a masterful performance against Jacksonville State late last season and then perplexed Murray State with a near-record breaking performance in the OVC Tournament, will likely be the opening day starter. Senior left-hander Paul Duncan and senior right-hander Stephen Hefler both worked more than 50 innings in 2010 and will compete for weekend jobs this season, as will senior Chris Hord and junior Matt Fyffe, both of whom missed all of last year due to Tommy John surgery. Freshman southpaw Kyle McGrath, who set the single game Kentucky state tournament record with 16 strikeouts against Boone County as a senior, has thrown well in the pre-season and will be in the mix for an immediate weekend job.

EKU also returns experienced short and middle relievers in senior closer Ryne Purcell, who tied a program record with 12 saves in 2010 and has been named to the 2011 NCBWA Preseason Stopper of the Year Watch List, junior right-hander Matt Harris, a 2010 OVC Pitcher of the Week who led the Colonels with 42 strikeouts a year ago, junior lefty Greg Terry, who was second on the team with a 5.76 ERA in 2010, sophomore right-hander Austin Rexroat, a midweek starter who picked up wins over Purdue and Marshall last season and solid, strike zone-pounding senior right-hander Macon Smith. Senior Jim Clancy, who served as the Colonels' closer in 2008 and once struck out six of the first seven batters he faced in an upset over then-No. 25 Louisville, is also back after missing all of last season due to Tommy John surgery.

Junior college transfer Lincoln Wagner is slated to serve as Purcell's set-up man and could also close games in a pinch. Freshmen right-handers Blake Bottoms and Brent Cobb, meanwhile, will earn innings based on their performances.

Infield

Despite losing a pair of All-OVC middle-of-the-lineup corner infielders in Anthony Ottrando and Jayson Langfels, the EKU infield returns the team's leading hitter from a year ago in junior shortstop Richie Rodriguez. Rodriguez batted .357 in 2010, started every game of the season in the leadoff position and was the fourth toughest batter in the OVC to strike out, registering just 0.31 strikeouts per game.

"Richie has exemplified what an everyday shortstop can do and should, both offensively and defensively," Stein said.

The other three infield positions, however, remain somewhat more fluid. Senior Bryce Labhart has won the opening day job at first base and, with his pesky attitude at the plate and .448 on-base percentage as a utility player last year, might bat leadoff. He will be pushed, though, by sophomore Alex Hughes and freshman Mitch Durbin, both of whom are big left-handed bats with power. There has been great competition at second base and the job will fall to, or spread evenly among, junior Dustin Dunlop, sophomore Matt Phipps or freshman Alex Arovits. Freshman Bryan Soloman has shown the ability to field and hit for power and is, thus, the front runner at third base; however, he is also being pushed by the trio of Dunlop, Phipps and Arovits.

"Defensively, we struggled in the infield in the fall," Stein said. "But that has been cleaned up of late and we're excited to see how the new guys mature."



Outfield

The Colonels return all three starting outfielders from a year ago, but with a twist. Senior Ryan Faidley, who played primarily in left field last year, will move to center field and will be counted on to provide middle-of-the-lineup power. Sophomore Austin Grisham, who played primarily in center field last year but can effectively play all three outfield positions, and junior Michael Garcia, who played exclusively in right field last year and junior Jacob Daniel, EKU's lone preseason All-OVC selection at designated hitter who has started just one game in the field his entire career, will compete for the remaining corner outfield spots. Stein noted how improved Daniel's defense has been in the preseason and how important that is to making the outfield positions more competition-based.

Sophomore Jeff Emerich is EKU's most valuable outfielder off the bench as he can cover ground and provide pinch-hitting. Freshman Michael Buschmann will be used primarily as a pinch-hitter and a designated hitter.

Catchers

Freshman Sean Hagen enters the season as the front runner to replace the graduated Joey Stevens. Stein noted that Hagen has the potential to be a complete catcher with the ability to catch, block, hit and handle pitchers. Behind Hagen, though, the Colonels have two solid options in freshman Steve Ferraro, who saw significant action in scrimmages this fall and spring, and junior A.J. Jamison, who will actually be the opening day starter at designated hitter but has started 24 games behind the plate in his career. Junior Brian Shrimpton, who started six of seven games between March 13-20 due to injuries and tied for the team lead with three sacrifice bunts last year, provides additional depth at the catcher position in 2011.

Designated Hitter

Junior Jacob Daniel, who hit .292 last season with six home runs, was named Preseason All-OVC at the designated hitter position; however, he might see more time in the outfield this season and will, thus, platoon with junior A.J. Jamison at DH. Jamison suffered through numerous injuries in 2010 and only recorded 24 at-bats, but he proved he still had pop in his bat when he played hobbled hero in the OVC Tournament by coming off the bench cold and providing a pinch-hit RBI double in the top of the ninth that sparked a come-from-behind 4-3 win over Murray State.

A slew of underclassmen will provide additional depth at DH, including sophomore Alex Hughes and freshmen Michael Buschmann and Mitch Durbin.

Schedule

The Colonels open the season in Malibu, Calif. with a series against Pepperdine, will host such non-conference foes as Penn State, Western Carolina and UNC Asheville and will travel to play at such power conference opponents as Kentucky and West Virginia in 2011.

"Our players have seen this tough schedule and are excited about the challenges it poses," Stein said. "Hopefully it has motivated them throughout the offseason to improve on their weaknesses and their strengths."


EKU's conference schedule begins on the weekend of March 26-27 when the Colonels travel to Charleston, Ill. to play Eastern Illinois. The Colonels will host conference weekends against Southeast Missouri (April 2-3), Morehead State (April 16-17), UT Martin (April 22-23) and Murray State (May 7-8). They will go on the road for the final conference weekend of the season (May 14-15) to face the defending OVC champion Jacksonville State.

The OVC Tournament will again be held at Pringles Park in Jackson, Tenn.

The Eastern Kentucky University Department of Athletics unveiled its All-Century Baseball Team in a special ceremony at the annual Diamond Legacy Dinner on Feb. 5, 2011 in the Keen Johnson Ballroom. Twenty-one of the 29 players and coaches on the team were able to attend the event, while two others were represented by family.

Infielders



***** Frank Borgia (1966-68)**

Borgia started at shortstop for Eastern for three seasons and was selected first-team All-OVC twice. He batted .475 in 1968 which still stands as the modern record at Eastern for highest single season batting average. He finished sixth in the nation in batting in 1968 and stole 18 bases in 19 attempts as a freshman in 1966.



***** Jimmy Cain (1967-69)**

Cain was a two-year All-OVC third baseman for the Colonels who batted .395 and .400 in those two seasons. His junior year, he finished second in the nation in home runs and runs batted in per game while being named the team's Most Valuable Player. He was also a member of the 1967 OVC championship squad.



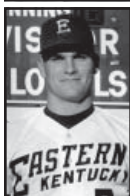
***** Lee Chapman (1997-2000)**

Chapman started four years for the Colonels at first base and received All-OVC recognition his junior and senior seasons. Still the holder of five Eastern school records, he hit 52 career home runs and knocked in 210 runs at EKU, while stealing 47 bases and collecting a .329 batting average.



***** Clay Elswick (1983-86)**

Elswick was a four-year letterman and three-year starter for the Colonels at first base from 1983-86. His senior year, he posted totals of 20 home runs, 82 RBI, a .426 batting average and was selected OVC Player of the Year in leading the Colonels to a third straight NCAA Tournament appearance.



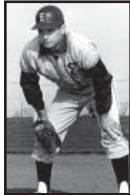
***** Frank Kremblas (1986-89)**

Kremblas was a two-time All-OVC performer that played both second base and catcher during his days at Eastern. He batted .381 as a junior with seven home runs, 43 RBI and 21 stolen bases, and he was a 23rd round draft choice of the Cincinnati Reds.



***** Jayson Langfels (2008-10)**

Langfels started at third base all three years he played for Eastern and was a first team All-OVC choice the past two years. EKU's all-time leader in triples with 18, he turned in a fantastic 2009 season when he hit .441 with six triples, 12 home runs and 72 RBI. He finished his EKU career with 203 hits, 32 home runs, 161 runs batted in and a .364 batting average. He was drafted by the Colorado Rockies.



***** Arnold Nyulassy (1965-68)**

Nyulassy was a three-time All-OVC first baseman who hit .378 as a junior in 1967 and was part of an Eastern infield that turned 38 double plays in 29 games.

***** Neil Sellers (2001-04)**

Sellers was a three-time All-OVC third baseman and is listed in the EKU record books for RBI, hits, at bats, doubles and home runs. His career totals at Eastern include 41 home runs, 62 doubles, 279 hits and 214 runs batted in while compiling a four-year batting average of .353. Drafted by the Houston Astros, he is now a member of the Florida Marlins' organization.



***** Jason Sharp (1997-2000)**

Sharp was a four-year starter for EKU and received all-conference notice from the OVC in 1998 and 1999. He played both shortstop and third base in his career for the Colonels and had career totals of 32 home runs, 145 runs batted in and a .337 batting average.

Outfielders



***** Josh Anderson (2001-03)**

Anderson was the OVC Player of the Year in 2003 and Eastern's first-ever, first-team Louisville Slugger All-American choice after leading the nation in stolen bases with 57 and batting a national third-best .447 his junior year. He was a fourth round draft selection of the Houston Astros and has played for four major league teams. Anderson is also an EKU Athletics Hall of Fame member.



***** Joe Banko (1989-90)**

Banko was a two-time All-OVC player for the Colonels and was a member of the 1989 OVC champion and NCAA Tournament Eastern squad that won 39 games. An All-South Region performer, his two-year career statistics showed him with a .341 batting average, 17 home runs and 89 runs batted in while stealing 64 bases.



***** Brandon Berger (1994-96)**

Berger was drafted after his junior season at Eastern in the 14th round by the Kansas City Royals. He received all-conference recognition his last two seasons at Eastern and batted .301 with eight home runs and 38 runs batted in his final year as a Colonel.



***** Earle Combs (1920)**

Combs is the most decorated of anyone selected to the team as he was inducted into the Major League Baseball Hall of Fame in 1970. The highlight of his Eastern experience came in 1920 when he batted .596 and hit at least one home run in all 12 games the Maroons played. He later batted leadoff and played center field for the 1927 Murderer's Row Yankees' team.


***** Robert Moore (1985-87)**

A three-time first team All-OVC selection, Moore posted career numbers of 54 doubles, 11 triples, a .386 batting average and 67 stolen bases. As a junior in 1987, he had 12 consecutive hits, one short of the NCAA record and was named OVC Player of the Year. He was a 16th round draft choice of the Kansas City Royals.


***** Sean Murray (1998-99)**

Murray was a two-year All-OVC pick. In his two seasons with the Colonels, he had career totals of 29 home runs, 109 runs batted in and a .377 batting average after hitting a team-leading .402 as a junior and making the All-OVC Tournament team.


***** Ron Pinsenschaum (1964-67)**

A three-time All-OVC player in the Eastern outfield, Pinsenschaum was inducted into the EKU Athletics Hall of Fame posthumously last October. He was a member of two OVC championship teams and as a sophomore in 1965 reached base an amazing 68 times in 99 plate appearances.

Pitchers

***** Jeff Cruse (1984-87)**

A two-year All-OVC pitcher who was also a member of three NCAA Tournament teams at Eastern, Cruse still holds EKU's career record for victories with 30 against just six losses and recorded 208 strikeouts in 278 innings. He also owns EKU's career mark for complete games with 20 and collected a fantastic 10-1 record as a junior. He was signed by the Kansas City Royals after his senior year.

***** Steve Engel (1981-83)**

A two-time all-conference pitcher for the Colonels, Engel finished fifth in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings with his 11.1 strikeouts average per game as a sophomore. The third highest major league draft choice in Colonel baseball history, the left-hander was drafted following his junior season in the fifth round by the Chicago Cubs, pitching for the National League team at Wrigley Field in 1985.

***** Don Feltner (1952-55)**

Feltner pitched four seasons for EKU and compiled a 21-3 record on the mound. He was a member of Eastern's 1954 OVC championship team and his career included four shutouts and a 1.92 earned run average. The right-hander also threw one of six no-hitters in Colonel baseball history and was recently inducted into the EKU Athletics Hall of Fame.

***** Christian Friedrich (2006-08)**

Friedrich was OVC Rookie of the Year in 2006 and OVC Pitcher of the Year in 2008 while being selected first team all-conference for three seasons. The first team All-American posted gaudy three-year career stats of a 1.84 ERA, 327 strikeouts, an opponents' batting average of .174 and 20 victories. He was a first round draft pick of the Colorado Rockies in 2008.

***** Dave Quick (1960-63)**

Quick was a two-time All-OVC pitcher for Eastern and was the OVC Player of the Year in 1963 when he posted a 1.38 ERA. A member of two OVC championship teams, one of the lefty's top outings in 1963 was a 12-inning, 2-0 masterpiece over Morehead State where he struck out 19 batters.


***** Randy White (1986-89)**

White was a two-time All-OVC player and the OVC Player of the Year in 1989 when he posted a 10-3 record with a 3.01 earned run average. In his four years at Eastern, the right-hander won 27 games, lost only 11, posted a 3.59 ERA and was a member of three OVC championship squads.

Catchers

***** Blake Barthol (1992-95)**

Barthol was a four-year starter for the Colonels and received All-OVC recognition his junior and senior years. Chosen in the 21st round of the 1995 Major League Draft by the Colorado Rockies, he batted .330 his senior year with six home runs and 46 runs batted in.


***** Brad Brian (1982-86)**

Brian was a three-year starter at catcher for the Colonels where he hit .356 with nine home runs and 42 runs batted in as a senior when he was named first-team all-conference. A career .337 hitter at EKU, he was drafted following his senior year in the 30th round by the Montreal Expos.


***** Roger Roberts (1969-72)**

Roberts was a two-time All-OVC performer and three-year starter at catcher who led the Colonels with 33 runs batted in in 1972.

Utility Players

***** Brett Bolger (2003-06)**

Bolger started four years for the Colonels and received all-conference notice three of those seasons. The pre-season OVC Player of the Year in 2006 by Collegiate Baseball magazine, he posted career totals at Eastern of 262 hits, 160 runs scored, 59 stolen bases and a batting average of .359, highlighted by his junior year when he led the conference in hitting with a .398 average.


***** Ron Pezzoni (1987-89)**

Pezzoni was a three-year all-conference performer for the Colonels and was one of the hitting stars for the 1989 NCAA Regional playoff team. He posted three-year career numbers of a .398 batting average and 91 stolen bases, which still stand as the second highest number of steals in school history.

Coaches

***** Charles "Turkey" Hughes (1941-71)**

Hughes served as head coach of the baseball program for 31 years. During that time span, he led EKU to 10 OVC championships and was voted OVC Coach of the Year in 1967. He is a member of the EKU, the OVC and the Kentucky Athletic Halls of Fame and coached five different sports at Eastern in his 43-year tenure with the EKU Athletics Department. The field the Colonels play on today is named in his honor.


***** Jim Ward (1980-2001)**

Ward served as head coach at Eastern from 1980-2001 and won 628 games, five regular season OVC titles and sent four Eastern teams to the NCAA Tournament. A member of the OVC and EKU Halls of Fame, he was five-time OVC Coach of the Year, coached five OVC Players of the Year and 64 All-OVC players. He finished his collegiate coaching career with 939 victories.
