

Press Row

Eastern Kentucky working press facilities are located on the north side of floor level inside McBrayer Arena. Press row offers space for sports writers, home and visiting radio and television commentators. Only working press, coaches and game administration personnel with valid credentials are allowed on the floor level of McBrayer Arena.

Press Passes

All requests for working press credentials should be directed to the Athletic Public Relations Office. Passes not furnished by return mail must be picked up in person at the "Press Will Call" table located at the floor-level entrance near the tennis courts adjacent to the coliseum. The attendant will have credentials available to you upon presentation of proper identification.

Photographers

Only those accredited photographers working on assignment will be issued sideline credentials. Photographers should shoot from the designated end zone locations. No photographers are permitted in the bench area of either team.

Parking

Parking space can be reserved with a request received by EKU's Athletic Public Relations Office at least one working day prior to the game. Media parking is located in the parking lot at Alumni Coliseum. An attendant will direct you to the media parking area.

Services

Game notes, flip cards and statistics are provided at every Eastern Kentucky home game. A meal and drinks will also be served prior to every contest. Post-game interviews will be conducted in room 125 on the southwest side of Alumni Coliseum. Wireless internet is available on press row.

Player Interviews

Players are available for interviews, but prior arrangements should be made with the Athletic Public Relations Office. Players are available for both in-person and telephone interviews; however, no personal phone numbers for players will be given to media members under any circumstance. Please make sure to allow enough notice to set up the interview in a time frame that works for your purposes.

How to Get to EKU

From Cincinnati, Ohio and Points North:

Take I-75 South through Lexington, Ky. Continue south on I-75 Richmond/Knoxville to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Huntington, W.Va., and Points East:

Take I-64 West for 104 miles to exit #96 (Fort Boonesborough S.P.) and remain on State Highway 627 until intersecting I-75 at exit #95. Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Lexington, Ky.:

Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Bowling Green, Ky., and Points West:

Take I-65 North to exit #43 (Glasgow) and travel east on the Cumberland Parkway through Somerset to exit #41 on I-75. Travel north on I-75 to exit #87. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Knoxville, Tenn., and Points South:

Take I-75 North approximately 162 miles to exit #87 in Kentucky. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

Coach Interviews

The best time to interview Coach Neubauer or any member of the basketball coaching staff is in the mornings. Please call the Athletic Public Relations Office to set up all interviews.

Practice Coverage

Practices are open to the media with few exceptions. Media wishing to attend practice are encouraged to contact the Athletic Public Relations Office in advance. All videographers wishing to shoot practice should make prior arrangements to do so. Team meetings before, during and after practice are private.

Radio Coverage

Radio station WCYO (100.7 on the FM dial) will serve as the flagship station for the 2010-11 EKU Basketball Network. WCYO "The Coyote" is the flagship station for Wallingford Broadcasting of Richmond and Irvine. With 25,000 watts of power, The Coyote signal reaches more than 625,000 people.

This year's broadcast team will again be headed by longtime play-by-play announcer Greg Stotelmyer, who will be serving his 27th season as "The Voice of the Colonels" and his 31st season overall covering EKU basketball.

Stotelmyer has been employed the past 23 years as a reporter for WTVQ-TV in Lexington and also serves as the producer and host for the Coach Jeff Neubauer Show and Coach Dean Hood Show seen on Channel 36.

In addition to the radio broadcasts, the EKU Basketball Network features pre-game interviews with coaches and players, and Neubauer joins Stotelmyer after each game for the informative Coach Jeff Neubauer Postgame Show.

Eastern Kentucky University is known as the Campus Beautiful, and for good reason.

The EKU campus is one of the most scenic college campuses in the nation and it features several striking features. From the James E. van Peurse Music Pavilion and the Ravine, to the Chapel of Meditation and the Keen Johnson Building, EKU features some of the most diverse and attractive locales on any college campus anywhere.

However strong Eastern Kentucky University's reputation is for its visual aesthetics, the real character of the University can be found in its students, faculty and staff, and outstanding academic programs.

EKU offers more than 160 degree programs and features an excellent 17-1 student-to-faculty ratio. The University serves more than 16,500 students, which represent almost all 120 counties in Kentucky, all 50 states and over 60 countries worldwide.

The University, which celebrated its centennial in the spring of 2006, had humble beginnings. EKU's origins can be traced back to a conflict between the northern and southern branches of Kentucky's Presbyterian Church.

A group of alumni and supporters from the Southern branch lost control of Centre College in Danville and set out to start their own institution of higher learning. From that conflict, Central College was chartered in 1873 and the school opened in September of 1874.

Financial problems led to Central College's consolidation into Centre College in 1901, but Richmond's place in higher education did not move with Central College. Walters Collegiate Institute offered a preparatory curriculum for college-bound men and served as a transitional institution between Central College and what would become Eastern Kentucky University.


In 1906, the Kentucky General Assembly approved a bill that would establish two normal schools in the eastern and western parts of the state in order to prepare teachers to enter the classroom. The eastern school, which was located in Richmond, was called the Eastern Kentucky State Normal School, later evolving into the regional institution now known as Eastern Kentucky University.

Modern-day EKU now encompasses three branch campuses in Corbin, Danville and Manchester. The University also boasts one of the state's strongest distance learning programs, giving students from around the world an opportunity to receive an EKU education.

EKU is also home to the College of Justice and Safety, which educates students from around the world. As EKU's Program of Distinction, the College of Justice and Safety is involved in numerous worldwide research projects. It also educates a vast majority of the law enforcement officers in the Commonwealth.

The University also boasts 17 championship sports at the NCAA's Division I level, competing in the Ohio Valley Conference. The Colonels' history includes several national championships, conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances. However, the best is yet to come as the school's athletic department is committed to ensuring that EKU student-athletes are given the necessary resources to continue to compete at a national level.

All told, Eastern Kentucky University provides a safe and attractive environment in which its students can learn and become productive members of society. The lessons learned at EKU will follow students for a lifetime and the performance of its graduates will, in turn, continue to enhance the already strong regional and national reputation of the University.





Richmond is home to many interesting and convenient activities. Whether it's arts and entertainment, recreation, or shopping and dining out you are looking for, Richmond has it all.

With more than 100 buildings in Richmond on the National Register of Historic Places and three areas on the National Register of Historic Districts, it is one of Kentucky's finest restored 19th Century commercial districts.

Arts and entertainment take center-stage with the Eastern Kentucky University theatre program. They offer several shows each year from classical theatre to modern musicals. Local artistic talents are on display year round at Gallery On Main. This is a perfect showcasing of local talent and an opportunity for community involvement.

There is never any lack of recreational activities in Richmond. An array of parks and recreational centers across the city offers something for everyone. Lake Reba Recreational complex includes golf, little league baseball and softball fields, soccer, fishing and a water park which opened in the summer of 2008.

If it's shopping you want, downtown Richmond can accommodate you. Locally owned businesses line the historic streets of downtown Richmond with everything from fine antiques to exquisite jewelry. There is a wide variety of stores at the brand new Richmond Centre as well. The outdoor mall offers shoppers convenience and style.

Dining isn't hard to find either. Family-owned and major chain restaurants give Richmond a unique variety of menus. Local hot spots include Madison Gardens, which is uniquely Richmond, to restaurants such as Applebee's, Logan's Roadhouse, O'Charley's and Outback Steakhouse. Whatever your pallet craves, Richmond dining offers a variety of tastes made to satisfy.

Never far from mainstream, Richmond offers the comforts of simplicity with the convenience of the city.

Only 29 miles from Lexington and the Bluegrass Airport, Richmond is easily accessible to all travelers. Interstate 75 is a major artery of both state and national motor transportation. Richmond's location on I-75 makes it an important factor in making the city a commercial hub.

In fact, the ease of travel to and from Richmond makes the city an ideal spot for those who enjoy outdoor activities.

Fort Boonesborough State Park is located only 12 miles from EKU's campus, while Natural Bridge State Park (63 miles) and Cumberland Falls State Park (100 miles) are located nearby.

Also within easy driving distance of Richmond are the Kentucky Horse Park, the state capital in Frankfort, Herrington Lake, My Old Kentucky Home at Bardstown, White Hall State Shrine and thoroughbred horse racing at Keeneland.

A Brief Richmond History


Richmond was founded in 1798 by Colonel John Miller, a Revolutionary War soldier. In 1798, the Kentucky Legislature authorized the moving of the Madison County seat from nearby Milford to land owned by Colonel Miller.

The move was bitterly opposed by about 300 residents of the Milford area and a fight to retain the seat resulted between Dave Kennedy, who represented the Milford location, and William Kearly, who represented the new site.

Although history does not record the results of the brawl, the county approved the move in March of 1798 and two acres of land were purchased from Colonel Miller. Court was held in his barn.

On July 4, 1798, the site was officially named Richmond in honor of Miller's birthplace, Richmond, Va.

The Outlook

The Eastern Kentucky University men's basketball team will have an entirely new look in 2010-11 as 10 of the 15 players on the roster are either new to the program or did not see any game action last season. Four transfers and five freshmen have to integrate themselves into the EKU program.

"We had a really good summer session, especially the second one," Eastern head coach Jeff Neubauer said. "There is still a lot of learning to be done, but the challenge now is to get all of the players up to speed with the Division I game and to get everyone on the same page."

There are a few familiar faces who return from the 2010 postseason trip to the College Basketball Invitational. Senior Justin Stommes was one of just two OVC players to total at least 400 points and 100 assists in 2009-10. Fellow senior Josh Daniel brings another veteran presence to the table. Senior Spencer Perrin and sophomore Willie Cruz can both rebound and are adept at passing the basketball. Meanwhile, junior Joshua Jones does all of the little things well on the court.

"Our returnees do give us a level of comfort heading into preseason practices," Neubauer said. "They give us a good starting point and will need to help the newcomers learn our system."

As always under coach Neubauer, the Eastern Kentucky offense will revolve around unselfish play and the ability to shoot the basketball. The Colonels ranked second nationally in three-pointers made

(9.9 per game) and 11th nationally in three-point shooting (39.7 percent) one year ago. Stommes, Jones and Daniel are all proven shooters who fit well into the offense. Newcomers Jeff Allgood, Jeff Johnson and Ryan Parsons have the ability to hit the long range shots as well.

Players are needed to step up in the post area. Perrin is the lone returning true forward on the roster. Johnson, Taylor Filipek and Deverin Muff are three new additions who will battle for playing time alongside of Perrin. All three players are true freshmen and will need to adjust to the pace and play of collegiate basketball very quickly.

"We will spend lots of time on defense in the preseason," Neubauer said. "We have to be a better one-on-one defensive team this year. On offense, we have to get everyone to understand the system."

The Players

Four seniors hope to lead the Colonels back to the postseason for the second straight year – Josh Daniel, Devin McDonald, Spencer Perrin and Justin Stommes.

Daniel, a 6-5 guard, was a member of the last EKU team to qualify for the NCAA tournament, back in 2007. A steady three-point shooter, Daniel's role on the team has continually grown since his freshman season.

McDonald spent last season playing for the University of New Orleans. The 6-1 true point guard could be an important piece to the success of the 2010-11 team.

Perrin is probably the team's best defender and rebounder. His athleticism is hard to match in the Ohio Valley Conference. The 6-6 forward averaged a team-high 4.9 rebounds per game as a junior.

Stommes is quickly closing in on 1,000 career points. The 6-7 guard needs just 39 more tallies to become the 30th Colonel to reach that milestone.

Only one of the three juniors was on the roster last season – Joshua Jones. The 6-4 guard can fill a variety of roles on the perimeter for coach Neubauer. As a sophomore, Jones ranked fourth on the team in scoring (8.9 ppg) and second in assists (2.5 apg).

Juniors Jeff Allgood and Jaron Jones are new additions to the roster. Allgood, a 6-2 guard, is another long-range threat while Jones, a 6-6 guard, adds length and athleticism to the guard position.

Willie Cruz and Ruud de Jong make up the sophomore class. Cruz, a 6-4 guard, is a crafty rebounder and excellent passer who posted a 3-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio in 33 games as a freshman. De Jong did not see any playing time last year, but his 6-8 frame

gives the team a big body to play in the post.

The freshman class features five successful players at the high school level. Taylor Filipek, a 6-6 guard/forward, averaged 20 ppg, 9 rpg and 5 apg as a senior at Willmar High in Minnesota. Jeff Johnson, a 6-8 forward, was a part of the 2009 Illinois 3A state championship team at Centennial High. Deverin Muff is a 6-8 forward who finished second on his team in both scoring and rebounding as a senior.

The final two freshmen – Jabs Newby and Ryan Parsons – are guards. The 6-2 Newby is more of a point guard who can also slash to the basket to score. Parsons, standing at 6-3, is an outside shooting threat.

Mike DiNunno, a 6-0 guard who spent the previous two years at Northern Illinois, has to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules.

The Schedule

The 2010-11 schedule does not give the Colonels much time to work on their cohesion. EKU begins the year at a three-day tournament hosted by Loyola Chicago on Nov. 12-14. There, Eastern will face one of the better Horizon League teams in Loyola, an up-and-coming Missouri Valley Conference team in Indiana State and UTPA.

In early December, Eastern has the opportunity to play an important home game against OVC favorite Murray State. The Racers were one possession away from advancing to the 2010 NCAA Sweet 16.

As always, the Colonels take to the road to face some of the top teams in the nation. This year, EKU travels to Minnesota (Dec. 11) and Georgia (Dec. 31).

This year's OVC tournament will feature a new format as the top eight league teams all advance to Nashville with a chance to earn a berth in the NCAA tournament.

"I think this is a great change for the OVC," Neubauer said. "College basketball is a tournament game. I think the entire OVC tournament should be played at a neutral venue just like the NCAAs."



Jeff Neubauer

The 2010-11 season will be Jeff Neubauer's sixth year as head coach at Eastern Kentucky University. The Colonels have twice reached the postseason in five years under Neubauer and twice reached the 20-win plateau. Last March, ECU earned a spot in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational thanks in part to setting a program single-season record with 15 home victories.

In Neubauer's second season at ECU, the Colonels went dancing in the 2007 NCAA tournament after defeating Austin Peay in the Ohio Valley Conference championship game, 63-62. The 2006-07 Eastern squad won the OVC title without a first team all-conference player on the roster.

"We have been very fortunate here at ECU to attract and coach a group of outstanding young men," Neubauer said. "We have been incredibly pleased with the way that our teams have competed and represented the University throughout our first five years. It is our intention to continue to build on the unselfishness and consistency that we have continually encouraged here at ECU."

Neubauer, 39, is quickly moving up the all-time ECU coaching win chart. He is currently fourth on that list with 87 victories and a .554 career winning percentage at Eastern Kentucky. This past season, the Colonels ranked among the top 15 Division I schools nationally (out of 334) in three-point shooting (11th at 39.7 percent), three-pointers made per game (second with 9.9 per game) and fewest turnovers per game (third at 9.7).

In 2008-09, the Colonels were especially impressive against opponents from the Mid-American Conference (MAC) with victories over Ball State, Ohio and 2009 NCAA tournament participant, Akron. Former ECU player Mike Rose led the nation in three-point shooting that year at 48.1 percent.

Under Neubauer's guidance, the Colonels went on an amazing run at the end of 2006-07, winning 11 of 13 games to earn a

spot in the NCAA tournament. During that stretch, ECU shot 47.5 percent from the floor while holding the opposition to just 59.8 points per game.

The 2006-07 Eastern Kentucky team led the nation in fewest fouls per game (13.6) and also paced the Ohio Valley Conference in field goal percentage (46.2).

In his first season as head coach, Neubauer and the 2005-06 Colonels qualified for the season-ending OVC tournament. Along the way, ECU tallied five conference road victories, the most by an Eastern squad in over 30 years. The Colonels nearly pulled off a dramatic upset over Big Ten opponent Wisconsin at the Paradise Jam tournament in the U.S. Virgin Islands, but fell to the Badgers in double-overtime.

Neubauer has coached six all-conference players, an OVC Co-Freshman of the Year, an OVC tournament MVP and the program's top two all-time leading scorers in his five years at Eastern Kentucky.

Before arriving at Eastern Kentucky, Neubauer served three seasons as the top assistant at West Virginia under head coach John Beilein where he helped fuel the Mountaineers' rapid rise to national prominence.

The rebuilding process at West Virginia culminated in the Mountaineers' dramatic run through the 2005 NCAA tournament. WVU earned triumphs over five top-20 programs in the regular season that year before reaching the Big East tournament's championship game. Then, after upsetting second-seeded Wake Forest in double overtime in the NCAA tournament's second round, the Mountaineers knocked off Bobby Knight's Texas Tech team in the Sweet 16. The spirited march came to a halt when the University of Louisville prevailed in overtime to complete a highly-contested Elite Eight battle. West Virginia finished 2004-05 ranked 12th in the country.

In 2003-04, West Virginia secured its first NIT victories since 1997 while also defeating a pair of nationally-ranked opponents.

Neubauer followed Beilein to Morgantown, W.Va., in 2002 after the two enjoyed similar success together for five years at the

University of Richmond, where the Spiders won 100 games. While at Richmond, Neubauer helped recruit and coach numerous all-conference players, a pair of league rookies of the year, a conference player of the year and a student-athlete of the year.

In Neubauer's second season at Richmond, the Spiders qualified for the NCAA tournament and then proceeded to surprise SEC foe South Carolina in the opening round, 62-61. Richmond earned a winning record in five of the six years Neubauer was on staff while notching NIT victories in both 2001 and 2002.

"I've been doing this for 30 years and I've had a lot of assistants, and Jeff's basketball IQ is just terrific," Beilein said. "He understands the game and is not afraid to be innovative, but he also knows how important it is to be fundamentally sound."

Prior to Richmond, Neubauer served three seasons as a graduate assistant coach at The Citadel, where he also earned an MBA degree.

A native of Slidell, La., Neubauer was an outstanding student-athlete at La Salle University in Philadelphia, where he played point guard under head coach William "Speedy" Morris. The Explorers went 30-2 and earned an NCAA tournament berth in Neubauer's freshman season. La Salle accumulated two more post-season berths and an overall record of 83-36 during his four years on the squad. Neubauer, team captain as a senior, earned honorable mention GTE All-Academic accolades as a cum laude graduate in finance.

He is married to the former Karen Feret of Hackettstown, N.J.

Everick Sullivan is now in his third season on the Eastern Kentucky University coaching staff.

Sullivan, who has almost 10 years of experience as a collegiate basketball coach, was promoted to associate head coach this past summer. In his two years at ECU, Sullivan has helped the Colonels average 19 wins per year and advance to the 2010 Collegiate Basketball Invitational postseason tournament.

“Everick has done a tremendous job at ECU over the last two years,” ECU head coach Jeff Neubauer said. “He came to us with a wonderful reputation as a coach and has lived up to that reputation every day on the job in Richmond. Promoting Everick to associate head coach makes a lot of sense because this shows people outside of the program that I’m confident in his abilities to lead our student-athletes. The 5,000 square foot weight room contains 16,000 pounds of total weight. Built in 2001, the facility features Eleiko model Olympic weights, York dumbbells with two sets each


from five to 150 pounds and Nebula power stations and racks. Tools such as bands and medicine balls are used as well to help round student-athletes into peak shape.

Men's basketball strength and conditioning coach Tony Sarver, along with Chad Scott, are supervised by head strength and conditioning coach Jon-Michael Davis. The group oversees the conditioning of every ECU student-athlete. With year-round lifting for basketball, Sarver has designed regimented workout schedules for the Colonels, which allows the athletes to focus on different muscle groups on specific days.

"Tony Sarver has a unique bond with our players," ECU head coach Jeff Neubauer said. "He is able to push the players to their limits, but still have a good time in the process."








Alumni Coliseum (Paul S. McBrayer Arena) has been the home arena for Eastern Kentucky University basketball since the 1963-64 season when the team moved from the Weaver Health Building where it had a record of 225-51 in the previous 31 years.

Located on a southern slope of the EKU campus, Alumni Coliseum forms the nucleus of a thoughtfully-planned sports complex. The Coliseum is a massive physical plant and features a great triumph in architectural design with its wooden laminated cross-arched roof — the world’s largest of its kind — spanning 309 feet and providing an unobstructed view of events held in the main auditorium. A total of 616,276 board feet of lumber form the 170 beams and roof, which arches gracefully 81 feet above the floor level. The wood is southern pine finished in its natural beauty.

In addition to the main auditorium, which seats 6,500 for basketball games and 8,000 for other programs, the building contains four basketball courts in an auxiliary gymnasium on the east end, numerous athletics offices, both indoor and outdoor swimming pools, shower and locker rooms, a projection room, an athletic training room and a weight room. A hydraulic-operated stage is located at the east end of the main arena floor.

Since the basketball team began playing its games in Alumni Coliseum, the Colonels have compiled an overall record of 393 wins and 203 losses. In the 47-year history of McBrayer Arena, EKU has suffered only eight losing seasons on the floor.

Eastern was a perfect 14-0 in McBrayer Arena in 1990-91 and nearly achieved the same feat on four other occasions, when the Colonels lost only one home game.

The 2009-10 season was filled with both ups and downs for the Eastern Kentucky University basketball team, but in the end there were certainly more ups for the Colonels as they advanced to a postseason tournament for the second time in five years under head coach Jeff Neubauer. Below are some more highlights from the 2009-10 campaign ...

2010 College Basketball Invitational

Eastern Kentucky was one of 16 teams invited to play in this postseason tournament. The Colonels drew an opening round home game against College of Charleston on St. Patrick's Day, but unfortunately the Cougars edged ECU, 82-79. Senior Josh Taylor tallied a career-high 28 points in his final game as a Colonel.

20-Win Plateau

Eastern Kentucky reached the 20-win plateau for just the seventh time in program history and the second time under head coach Jeff Neubauer. The Colonels finished 20-13 overall.

New OVC Record, Again

For the second consecutive year, Eastern established a new OVC single-season record for three-pointers made (327). The Colonels made at least 10 three-pointers in 19 games, including a season-high 17 long range shots in the victory over West Virginia Wesleyan.

In the National Stats

The Colonels were ranked among the top-15 nationally in three-pointers made per game (2nd – 9.9), three-point shooting (11th – 39.7 percent) and fewest turnovers per game (3rd – 9.7).

Home, Sweet Home

Eastern won a program record 15 games in the friendly confines of McBrayer Arena. The Colonels won all three home games during CBE Classic in late November, including a 74-72 thriller over UTSA which came courtesy of a late Justin Stommes three-pointer.

Double-Digit OVC Victories

Eastern Kentucky went 11-7 against conference competition, marking the sixth straight year the Colonels have posted double-figure league victories. Only Murray State (seven) has a longer active streak.

Taylor Leaves Mark on Program

Senior Josh Taylor, a second team All-OVC honoree, played in 127 games throughout his collegiate career, the most ever by an ECU player. The native of Pittsburgh, Pa., also became the 29th Colonel to reach 1,000 career points when he scored 20 in the win over Winthrop on Feb. 20. Taylor concluded his ECU career with 1,058 points.

MVP Honors for Stommes

Junior Justin Stommes was named MVP of the CBE Classic (Richmond sub-regional). Stommes led the team in scoring (14.2 ppg) and assists (3.5 apg). He was also one of just two OVC players to total at least 400 points and 100 assists in 2009-10.

BracketBuster Success

EKU Still Perfect Against Jacksonville State

Thanks to a last-minute 66-65 win over Jacksonville State on Feb. 6, the Colonels improved to 7-0 all-time against the Gamecocks at home.

Daniel Delivers

Junior Josh Daniel tallied career highs in points (17) and assists (three) in the win over Tennessee Tech on Feb. 4. Daniel netted 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) three-pointers against TTU to become one of six Colonels to make at least four trifectas in a game in 2009-10.

Winning Streak Snapped

The Colonels set a McBrayer Arena record with 19 consecutive home victories between Dec. 2008 and Jan. 2010. Morehead State snapped the streak with a 69-53 win on Jan. 23. At the time, the winning streak was the sixth longest active home court winning streak in the nation.

Movin' on Up!

Head coach Jeff Neubauer moved into fourth place on the all-time ECU coaching win chart following a 67-59 victory over Eastern Illinois on Jan. 14. Only Paul McBrayer (1946-62 – 219 wins), Rome Rankin (1935-46 – 135) and Max Good (1981-89 – 96) own more program victories than Neubauer (2005-pres. – 87).

Cruz-ing Along

Freshman Willie Cruz tallied a personal-high 19 points in his first collegiate start on Jan. 9 at Tennessee Tech. Cruz was perfect from the field (8-for-8) and also notched four assists.

All-Tournament Honors

Junior Justin Stommes and sophomore Joshua Jones were named to the Dr Pepper Classic all-tournament team on Dec. 30. Jones averaged 14 points and 4.5 rebounds per game while shooting 50 percent (7-of-14) from three-point range in the two-day tourney. Stommes led the Colonels in scoring each night and hauled in a personal-high eight rebounds against Morgan State.

Oppong's Career Night

Senior Papa Oppong finished with a career-high 21 points in the win over FIU on Nov. 28. The guard netted 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) three-pointers to go along with personal highs in steals (four) and assists (three).

Three-Point Shooting Success

The Colonels netted 17 three-pointers in the season opener against West Virginia Wesleyan, marking the most three-pointers ECU has made in five years under head coach Jeff Neubauer. Eastern made 65.4 percent (17-of-26) of its shots from behind the arc that night.

Entering its 63rd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jackson-

ville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championship. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. In the second round the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

Through its 62 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a conference-record 21 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

Among the coaching greats in men's basketball have been Western Kentucky's E.A. Diddle, who retired with 759 victories and 10 OVC titles; John Oldham, who was a member of the very first All-OVC squad and went on to win seven OVC crowns during his coaching tenure at Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky; Paul McBrayer, who guided Eastern Kentucky to 219 wins and three OVC crowns; and Cal Luther, who is the only person in conference history to win men's basketball Coach

of the Year honors at two league schools – Murray State and UT Martin.

There have been an equal number of great players including Western Kentucky's Clem Haskins, who is the only three-time OVC Player of the Year. Several players have won OVC Player of the Year honors twice: Western Kentucky's Jim McDaniels (1969-70 and 1970-71), Murray State's Les Taylor (1971-72, 1972-73), Jeff Martin (1987-88, 1988-89), Popeye Jones (1989-90, 1990-91) and Marcus Brown (1994-95, 1995-96), Austin Peay's Otis Howard (1976-77, 1977-78), Middle Tennessee's Jerry Beck (1980-81, 1981-82), Akron's Joe Jakubick (1982-83, 1983-84), Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers (1992-93, 1993-94) and UT Martin's Lester Hudson (2007-08, 2008-09).

The OVC also has the honor of being the only conference to boast the nation's leaders in scoring, rebounding and assists all in one season. That feat was accomplished in 1991-92 by Morehead State's Brett Roberts (28.1 ppg), Murray State's Popeye Jones (14.4 rpg) and Tennessee Tech's Van Usher (8.8 apg).

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Colonels in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational

Behind the effort of a 20-win season, Eastern Kentucky earned a berth in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational. However, the College of Charleston ended EKU's postseason with an 82-79 victory in the opening round.

Matt Sundberg's three-pointer with 28 seconds on the clock broke a 77-77 tie and gave the Cougars a lead they would not relinquish.


Senior Josh Taylor scored a career-high 28 points and connected on 4-of-8 three-pointers in the final game of his Colonel career.

Both teams shot the ball well as the Colonels shot 59 percent (31-of-52) from the field and 50 percent (9-of-18) from three-point range. The visiting Cougars, out of the Southern Conference, shot 57 percent (29-of-51) from the field and 48 percent (13-of-27) from three point range.

A bucket in the paint by Taylor tied the game at 75-75 with 1:30 remaining, but Tony White, Jr. responded on the ensuing possession with two free throws to put the Cougars ahead, 77-75. Taylor scored on the opposite end and was fouled, but missed his free throw allowing the game to stay tied at 77-all.

Sundberg then nailed a three-pointer from the left wing with 28 ticks on the clock to break the tie for good. Stommes brought the Colonels back to within one point on a put-back with 12 seconds left only to see Andrew Goudelock push the advantage back to three points with two free throws.

EKU was able to get Taylor one final look at a tying three-point attempt, but the shot was slightly off target.

Colonels in the 2007 NCAA Tournament

After trailing by as many as 27 points in the first half, the Eastern Kentucky men's basketball team fought back to within four before falling to top-seeded North Carolina, 86-65, in the opening round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

Darnell Dialls led EKU with a season-high 17 points, 13 coming in the second half, including his first-ever three-point field goal. Adam Leonard added 14 points and a team-best three steals.

With 8:46 remaining in the first half, the Tar Heels took their largest lead of the period (27) off a Ty Lawson three-point field goal, but Eastern Kentucky responded with six unanswered points to ignite a 15-4 scoring run. During the six-minute span, the Tar Heels turned the ball over five times and managed to get off just two shots.

Eastern Kentucky scored the first seven points of the second half, cutting its deficit to single digits (47-39) off a Julian Mascoll fast-break dunk, before a reverse lay-up from Mike Rose got the Colonels within four (48-44) just prior to the first media timeout.

North Carolina responded with seven straight points to keep control of the contest. From there, the Tar Heels put together a few more runs to pull away from the Colonels.

Paul McBrayer

219-144 (.603) 1946-62

McBrayer, who coached at ECU from 1946-62, is the winningest coach in Eastern history. For his achievements in college athletics, he was inducted into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987 and more recently, into the inaugural class of the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006.

A native of Anderson County, Ky., and 1930 All-American guard at the University of Kentucky, the veteran cage coach guided the Maroons from the "small college" status to a nationally-recognized basketball power.

McBrayer immediately produced at ECU as he guided Eastern to 11 consecutive victories to begin the 1946-47 season. That team went on to finish 21-4. Two years later, Eastern Kentucky climbed to 24th in the national polls before the 1949-50 squad missed by a mere half point of finishing in the nation's top 10 as it compiled a 16-6 record.

During his 16 seasons at Eastern, McBrayer-coached teams won three Ohio Valley Conference regular season titles and made two trips to the NCAA Tournament, losing games to Notre Dame and Louisville.

The arena inside Alumni Coliseum was formally dedicated "Paul S. McBrayer Arena" on Jan. 14, 1989.



ECU Athletics Hall of Fame

On Dec. 14, 2005, Eastern Kentucky University announced the creation of an Athletics Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame's mission is to commemorate and honor student-athletes, other individuals and teams whose accomplishments have contributed to the esteemed tradition of Colonel Athletics and whose character has reflected positively on the University.

The inaugural class of the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame, featuring 38 distinguished individuals, was inducted during an evening ceremony on Nov. 3, 2006, in the Keen Johnson Ballroom. Almost 300 people attended the induction ceremony. The honorees were also recognized prior to ECU's home football game against Murray State the following day.

The inaugural class was comprised of The Founders, a group of 25 who were previously honored at the 1974 Centennial Athletics Awards Banquet, and 13 members who were chosen by a selection committee.

The Department of Athletics accepts nominations for the Hall of Fame on a rolling basis. Nominations must be received by March 1 to be considered for that year's class.

This year's induction ceremony was held on Friday, Oct. 8 with the inductees also honored the next day at the home football game against Eastern Illinois.

Including the 2010 induction class, there are 12 men's basketball players/coaches enshrined in the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame – Jack Adams, John Allen, James Baechtold, Eddie Bodkin, Carl Cole, Fred Lewis, Paul McBrayer, Charles Mrazovich, Ralph Richardson, Goebel Ritter, Bobby Washington and Larry Wood.







History of the Colonel

Eastern Kentucky University athletic teams were known as the Maroons until 1966 and even survived one attempt to alter the school mascot to the Leopards.

In 1963, Eastern Kentucky University President Robert Martin was at a loss as to how he could create a physical "Maroon" to excite the audience. A man of vision and intelligence, Martin began searching for a mascot that would embody the glorious Bluegrass State.

He found it in the honorable Kentucky Colonel. The military title of "Colonel" had begun being used as an honorary title in the state by the late 1800s and by 1931 the now-famous Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels had been formed.

The finger-lickin' Colonel Harlan D. Sanders himself was inducted in 1935.

Like Minutemen of Massachusetts and Sooners of Oklahoma, the Kentucky breed of Colonel was a unique symbol of the state and so Martin selected it to accompany the school color as Eastern's mascot.

Further cementing the connection with Eastern was the fact that Centre College's mascot was already the Colonel and a faction of that school had occupied the Richmond campus before Eastern's founding.
