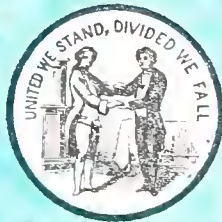

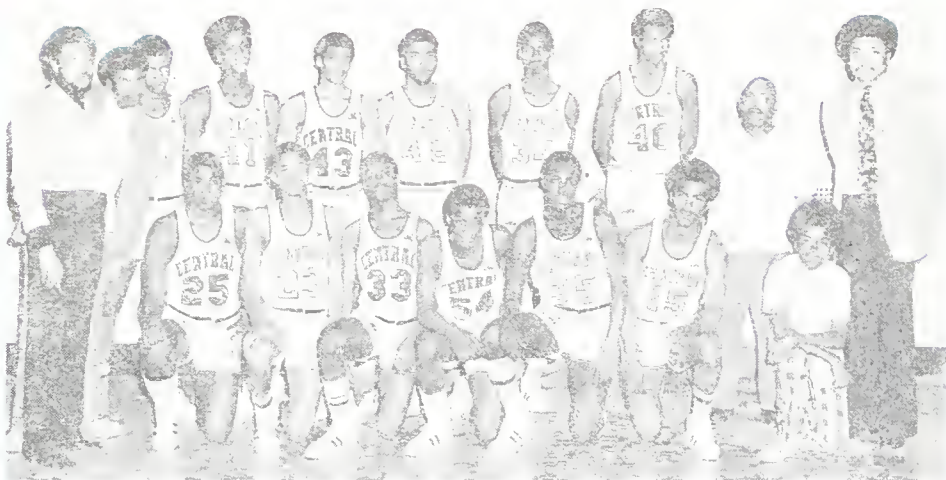

1974 Annual Meeting

The business meeting of the K.H.S.A.A. will be held on Thursday, April 18, at 2:00 P.M., in the Stouffer's Inn, Louisville.

As provided in Article IX, Section 1, of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution, the following changes in the Constitution and By-Laws will be acted upon by the Delegate Assembly.

Proposal I

The Board of Control proposes that the Constitution, Article VIII, Section 3 Item d, be changed to read "all contracts between member schools shall contain a specific date for each contest covered in the contract. A contract in which the words 'corresponding date' appears, rather than a specific date, can not be enforced."

Proposal II

The Board of Control proposes that in By-Law 24, Section 5, be added, "when a contest is cancelled for any reason stated in the contract the Board of Control shall determine if either school is liable in cases where the two schools can not reach a satisfactory agreement even though the forfeit fee is not due."

Proposal III

The Board of Control proposes that By-Law 38 be changed to read, "No member school enrolling only one sex shall have a vote on any phase of the Association's work not involving or pertaining to that school. Schools enrolling only boys shall not vote on matters pertaining to girls' athletics only and vice-versa."

Proposal IV

Prin. Albert Wall (Frankfort H.S.) and the Board of Control propose that By-Law 19 be changed to read, "All contests involving member schools shall be governed by National Federation of State High School Associations' rules if an official set is issued for that sport."

Proposal V

Rev. Robert H. Nieberding, Principal (Lexington Catholic H.S.), proposes that By-Law 5 be changed so that "six" in the second sentence be replaced with "nine."

Proposal VI

Prin. Dawson Orman (Atherton H.S.) and the six other principals of the Louisville school system propose a new By-Law to read: "Any officials, basketball and/or football, who calls a technical foul (basketball) or unsportsmanlike conduct (football) on a coach or on the bench as a result of the coach's action, will, upon request from the principal of the offending schools, supply a written account of events leading to and causing the foul or penalty to be called."

Proposal VII

Prin. Leo Brewsaugh (Bryan Station H.S.), proposes that By-Law 8 be changed by eliminating "gymnastics," and in By-Law 27 consider the season for gymnastics to begin on the opening day of school and end with the State Championship Meet.

Proposal VIII

Prin. J. Thomas Creamer (Maysville H.S.)

and all principals of the 39th District propose that By-Law 21 be amended by adding: "In any two county, conference, or invitational tournaments, the games played by a member school shall count as one game each for a school that maintains a football team."

Proposal IX

Prin. J. Thomas Creamer (Maysville H.S.) and principals of the 57th District propose that the last sentence be changed to read: "In any two county, conference or invitational tournaments, the games played by a member school shall count as only one game."

Proposal X

Prin. Claude Purvis (Pleasure Ridge Park H.S.) proposes that By-Law 4 be changed so that the fall sports season shall be considered to begin on August 1, rather than September 1.

LOUISVILLE, Ky.—The State Tournament, which just ended for the 57th time, meant many things to many people.

For some, it has been the drama of a team struggling to win four games and earn the immortality rewarded the champion.

For some, it has been the pleasure of watching remarkable individual performances although there was nothing to compare to the show provided by Kelly Coleman almost two decades ago. King Kelly's 68 points in one game is legend.

It has been thrilling to see the hustle and crowd-pleasing play of "cinderella" teams like Greenup County and Warren East.

It has been watching a small mountain team from Pikeville stay close to powerful Male before losing to the metropolitan school.

It has been students trying to take advantage of all the activities planned by tournament officials.

Brief Interlude

For these students, it has been a brief interlude of a tournament session here or there but mainly it has been a chance to escape classroom routine. And meet new friends of the opposite sex.

Basically, though, the State Tournament has been a "social" period and a time to relax and enjoy a few days in the "big town." To see old friends again, swap lies and raise a little "cain." There are people working though.

The State Tournament tries the patience of any newspaperman who has much to do and little

Minutes of Board Meeting

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at Stouffer's Inn, Louisville, on Friday morning, March 15, 1974. The meeting was called to order by President Frank Simpson at 9:00, with all Board members, Commissioner J. B. Mansfield and Assistant Commissioner Tom Mills present. Mr. Conley Manning was present representing the State Department of Education. The invocation was given by J. C. Cantrell.

Roy Winchester moved, seconded by Howard Crittenden, that the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting be waived since the members of the Board had received copies of these minutes. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Commissioner reported on the results of the recent balloting for Board membership for Section 3 and 4. In Section 3 the votes were as follows: Ray Story, Principal of North Hardin High School, 22; T. G. Florence, Principal of Nelson County High School, 13. In Section 4, George E. Sauer, Principal of Manual High School received 21 votes and James O. Gatewood, Principal of Westport High School received 18.

Mr. Paul Young, Mr. Gene Minton and Mr. Andy Hopkins came before the Board to express their opposition to changing soccer from a fall to a spring sport as recommended by several participating schools. Following their presentation President Simpson thanked them for their interest and assured them that the Board would consider their request in making a final decision. Following their departure, the Commissioner was instructed by the Board to make a full study of the situation and present the findings at the next meeting of the Board.

There was a discussion of new proposals to be submitted by the Board at the forthcoming 1974 Delegate Assembly. Roy Winchester moved, seconded by Jack Fultz, that the following proposals be submitted to the Assembly:

Proposal I—that Constitution, Article VIII, Section 3, Item d, be changed to read; "All contracts between member schools shall contain a specific date for each contest covered in the contract. A contract in which the words 'corresponding date' appears rather than a specific date, can not be enforced."

Proposal II—that By-Law 24, Section 5, be added, "When a contest is cancelled for any reason stated in the contract the Board of Control shall determine if either school is liable in cases where the two schools can not reach a satisfactory agreement even though the forfeit fee is not due."

Proposal III—that By-Law 38 be changed to read "No member school enrolling only one sex shall have a vote on any phase of the Association's work not involving or pertaining to that school. Schools enrolling only boys shall not vote on matters pertaining to girls' athletics only and vice-versa."

The motion concerning the proposals was carried unanimously.

Commissioner Mansfield reported that it was the opinion of Attorney Ray Corns, who is Legal Counselor for the State Department of Education, and Attorney Calvert Roszell, who is the lawyer for the K.H.S.A.A., that the Board proposal passed in the January meeting would be in violation of the Federal Court Decree of 1971. The proposal was to be presented to the Delegate Assembly for action and would have increased the number of Board of Control members from

Earl L. Collins

Earl L. Collins, 65, retired high school Athletic coach, died March 4, 1974. He was affectionately known as "Pop" Collins by all his students and players. After his retirement in 1972, he resided at Scotts Terry Road, Versailles, Kentucky. Prior to his retirement he had taught and coached at Ghent, Eminence, Hazard, Versailles and Fern Creek high schools.

"Pop" graduated from Georgetown College where he was awarded the Charles Dudley Athletic Cup. He was a member of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and president of G Men's Club.

The Coach was life member of the Kentucky High School Coaches Association, National Education Association, Kentucky Education Association, Kentucky Retired Teachers Association, Rotary International and the Versailles Baptist Church.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Margaret Baker Collins; one daughter, Mrs. Mary McGohon, Carmel, Indiana; one son, Bill Louis Collins, Versailles; and three sisters.

ten to twelve. The Decree says the Board shall be composed of ten members, etc. Based upon this report, J. C. Cantrell moved that the motion adopted at the January meeting be rescinded. The motion was seconded by Arthur Hawkins and all members voted aye.

The Board then considered possible changes in the basketball districts for 1974-75. Each Board member explained how recent consolidation had affected districts in their section and submitted recommendations for re-alignment where necessary. It was decided that the Principal of each school involved would be advised of the proposed changes so that he may appear before the Board to express his view. The changes will be finalized at the April meeting of the Board of Control after all parties have been heard.

The State Tournament is also a businesslike, serious talent hunt by the college coaches who, of necessity, are looking to the future and hoping to find the answers in a high school senior.

The State is a time of pleasure, too. And there are plenty of places to find it.

Tears Of Joy

The State Tournament touched all who attended. While the mass of some 17,000 (give or take a couple) tried to comprehend Male's upset of Bryan Station Friday night, a group of cheerleaders were in tears (of joy) at center court. The "yell corps" from Louisville Butler had been selected the best from 16 region representatives. And some measure of consolation went to the Defenders when their girls were named best of the 16 cheerleading teams competing in the tournament.

The State finally reached its apex as the championship game neared.

The outcome already may have been assured after the past performance chart has been studied. But the drama's final act must be played.

And soon a champion was crowned and lasting fame has descended on a Kentucky high school because, one realizes, that's the way it is here.

No matter what ill fortune may befall a champion in the future, the days of winning the State Tournament are never forgotten. That's how it is here.

Emotions Cooled

Finally, it is now Sunday morning and the vast exodus has begun. Emotions have cooled and hangovers hopefully slept off. Fifty-five miles an hour may prolong the trip home but so it goes.

The mass cleanup has started with hopes the damage is not too expensive.

"Wait 'Til Next Year" now has a special meaning for anyone uttering the phrase whether it's a losing coach with most of his team back or the average fan already making plans to return for another March holiday.

Whatever the State Tournament means to any Kentuckian, one should take time to enjoy it because just about everybody else is.

That's how it is here.
