1976 Annual Meeting

The business meeting of the K.H.S.A.A. will be held on Thursday, April 15, at 2:00 P.M., in the Roof Garden, Brown Education Building, Louisville.

As provided in Article IX, Section 1, of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution, the following changes in the Constitution and By-Laws will be acted upon by the Delegate Assembly.

PROPOSAL I

The Board of Control proposes that Article III, Membership, be changed to read: "This Association shall be composed of secondary schools which have been accredited by the Kentucky State Department of Education, and which agree to comply with the provisions of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution and By-Laws. No school shall become a member or continue to be a member whose detailed financial (athletic or otherwise), scholastic, and attendance records are not matters of public property or record. Junior high schools shall not be eligible for membership."

PROPOSAL II

Rev. Thomas Duerr, Principal (Trinity High School), proposes that By-Law 5, Section 2, be changed to read: "No pupil enrolled in any grade below the ninth shall be eligible to play on any high school team."

PROPOSAL III

The Board of Control proposes that By-Law 5, Section 4, be changed to read: "Sec. 4, Preceding Quarter, Trimester and Semester Enrollment—To be eligible during any quarter, trimester or semester a student must have been enrolled in school during the immediately preceding quarter, trimester or semester and must have passed for that quarter, trimester or semester in at least three full-credit high school studies or their equivalent in units of credit accepted for graduation; or in three-fourths of the grade school studies, or have made up any deficiencies in that amount of work, in accordance with the established custom of the school, within two weeks after the beginning of the current quarter, trimester or semester."

PROPOSAL IV

The Board of Control proposes that By-Law 5, Section 5, be changed to read: "No student who is enrolled or connected with any other school than the one he represents shall take part in any contest."

PROPOSAL V

The Board of Control proposes that By-Law 6, Section 2, be deleted in its entirety.

PROPOSAL VI

Principal Cletus Hubbs (J. M. Atherton High School), proposes to add the following to By-Law 27, Section 2, "Spring football practice in full gear shall be limited to twenty (20) days and must be completed by March 31."

PROPOSAL VII

Principal Lewis Marcum (Middlesboro High School), proposes to change By-Law 27, Section 5, to read: "Prior to the football or basketball season a team may have only four scrimmages, or four practice games, or four pan-o-rama games, or any combination of these not to exceed four with players, other than members of the squad."

PROPOSAL VIII

Headmaster Edwin B. Heile (Covington Latin School), proposes that the last sentence of By-Law 27, Section 5, be changed to read: "Prior to the opening game of regular season a basketball team may have four practice games with players other than members of the squad. For non-football playing schools these must be played after October 15. For football playing schools these must be played after November 1."

PROPOSAL IX

The Board of Control proposes that By-Law 29, Requirement for Coaches, be changed to read: "All head coaches of athletic teams of members of this Association shall be certified teachers and members of their regular school faculties. Assistant coaches shall be certified teachers and should be members of their regular school faculty. However, they may teach in an elementary, middle school or junior high school within that school district. All Coaches shall be regularly employed by their Boards of Education, and their entire salaries shall be paid by such boards; they shall teach a minimum of three regular periods of classes, gymnasium, study halls, or other activity assignments within the school's schedule. In the event a system has only one high school or does not employ male teachers, such school may make application to the Commissioner for a temporary waiver of this rule. If in the opinion of the Commissioner the request is justified, he may waive this rule, but in no case shall such waiver extend beyond the school year for which such a request was made. All schools shall comply with this provision in order to qualify for and to maintain membership in this Association."

PROPOSAL X

The Board of Control proposes that the last two sentences in the FIRST paragraph of By-Law 35 be deleted.

From the Commissioner's Office

Minutes of Board Meeting

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at Stouffer's Inn, Louisville, on Friday, March 26, 1976. The meeting was called to order by President Louie Martin at 9:30 A.M. with all Board members, Acting Commissioner Tom Mills, Assistant Commissioners Louis Stout and Billy V. Wise present. Mr. Conley Manning was present representing the State Department of Education and Darrell Wells was in attendance representing the State School Boards Association. The invocation was given by George Sauer.

Following the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, Frank Simpson moved that they be approved as read. Ray Story seconded the motion and all members voted aye.

The Acting Commissioner reported the results of the recent balloting for Board membership. In Section 7 the votes were as follows: Paul Trimble, 22; Frank Welch, 14. Jack Burkich was elected in Section 8. He was the only candidate in that Section. In the election to replace the two black members on the Board the results were as follows: The first eight regions — Charles K. Henry, 31; Joseph McPherson, 58; Caldwell Smith, 35. The second eight regions — E. R. Gray, 29; Norman Passmore, 81; Wilbur A. West, 35. The terms of the newly elected members begins on July 1, 1976.

There was a discussion of new proposals to be submitted by the Board and member schools at the forthcoming 1976 Delegate Assembly. A list of these proposals appear elsewhere in this issue of the ATHLETE, and copies have been sent to all member schools. George Sauer moved, seconded by Frank Simpson that these proposals be submitted to the Delegate Assembly. The motion was carried unanimously.

Mr. Mills presented a letter from Dr. Maurice Clay, requesting permission for the University of Kentucky Archives to conduct a project on the Oral History of Interscholastic Athletics in Kentucky. Frank Simpson made the motion that the

project be approved. George Sauer seconded the motion and all members voted aye.

Mr. Mills presented a request from Mrs. Helen L. Lang, President of the Kentucky State Tennis Association, requesting that the finals of the Kentucky High School Tennis Tournament be sanctioned by the Board of Control. Following a lengthy discussion, Ray Story moved that the request be denied. Gene Sell seconded the motion and all members voted aye.

Upon written request from Mr. Don Beckhart, the Board discussed the eligibility status of students attending school on a quarterly grading system. The question pertained to those students completing the requirements for graduation at the end of the winter quarter, which would normally end in March, and whether or not they would be eligible to complete the sport they were involved in at the time and whether or not they would be eligible for spring sports. It was the unanimous opinion of the members of the Board that these students would be subject to the provisions of By-Law 9 and therefore ineligible for further athletic competition after completing the requirements for graduation.

Chairman Jack Fultz reported that it was the recommendation of the Personnel and Policy Committee that the administrative and office staff be compensated for additional duties assumed during the absence of Commissioner Mansfield. The recommendation was \$3,000.00 for the Acting Commissioner, \$1,500.00 for each of the Assistant Commissioners, and \$500.00 for each of the secretaries. In addition Mr. Mills was instructed to obtain the salary schedules of the seven surrounding states for the purpose of assisting the Committee in setting salaries for the 1976-77 fiscal year. Denval Barriger moved that the recommendation be approved. Arthur Hawkins seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Cecil Reid moved, seconded by Eldon Davidson that all bills of the Association for the period beginning January 1, 1976, and ending February 27, 1976, be allowed. The motion carried unanimously.

The next meeting date was scheduled for 9:00 A.M., April 15, 1976, at Stouffers' Inn, Louisville.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Coaches' Corner would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Bo Davenport and his exciting Edmonson County basketball team for their tremendous performance in being crowned 1976 state high school basketball champs. An equally exciting performance and accomplishment was achieved by Sacred Heart Academy and its fine coach, Bunny Daugherty, as they captured the 1976 girls state basketball championship. Just a great job by both coaches and their fine teams.

It was during the boys state tournament that the Kentucky Coach's Association held the first of what is to be two meetings of the association this year. Of course, the second is to be held Thursday during KEA. The purpose of the state tournament meeting was to try to create more interest and enthusiasm among coaches throughout the state. It was hoped that a meeting at this time would be so well attended and received by the coaches that in the future it might become

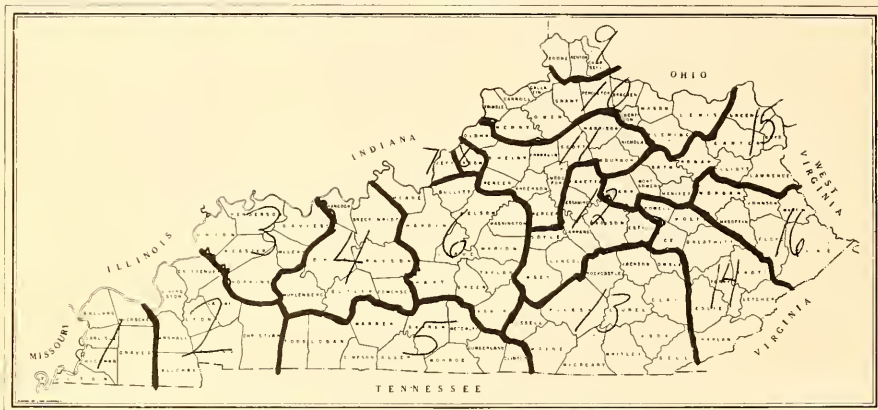

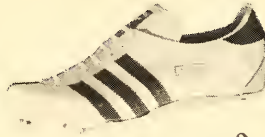

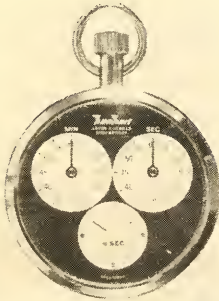
