## DUE PROCESS PROCEDURES

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association adopted the following Due Process Procedure for appealing decisions of the Commissioner or Board of Control, effective July 1, 1976.

1. Aggrieved Parties May Appeal Decision If a participant, parent, contest official, coach or member school is dissatisfied with a decision of the Board of Control or the Executive Secretary's interperting a provision or pro-visions of the Constitution, By-Laws or rules and regulations of the Association, and such individual or school is an aggrieved and affected party, such a party may within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of the decision, submit in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, a notice of appeal of the decision and a request for a formal hearing.

#### Investigation 2.

The Executive Secretary or his staff, or such representative of the Association designated by the Board of Control shall investigate all matters upon which the appeal is based. Investigations shall be performed so as to bring the matter to hearing, unless for cause other-wise shown, no later than the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.

#### 3. Notice

After completion of the investigation, the Executive Secretary shall notify the appealing party, by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the time and place set for a hearing on the appeal. The notice shall be given at least seven (7) days in advance of the time set for the hearing. The hearing shall be conducted in conjuction with a regularly schedul-ed meeting of the board, provided that the matter may be heard at a special meeting of the Board in the event that the appealing party agrees to pay all the costs incidental to such special meeting.

#### 4. Attendance at the hearing

Representatives of member schools, contest officials, students, parents and coaches who are appealing parties are entitled to attend hearings. In the instance of a student submitting the appeal, such student may be rep-resented by the member school that the student attends. Any person entitled to be in attendance at such hearing, may represent themselves. Such persons are also entitled to be represented by counsel, provided that they notify all other parties involved in the appeal of the name, address and telephone number of such counsel at least three (3) days in ad-

# vance of the hearing. 5. Board of Control to Hear Appeals

The Board of Control of the Association shall hear all appeals brought under the provisions of these rules. The President of the Board of Control may appoint a hearing officer to preside over the hearing or he may act as the hearing officer himself. The hearing officer may, at the beginning of the hearing, ask for statements clarifying the issues involved or upon which factual matters the appealing party will stipulate and agree to. The Executive Secretary shall make available written copies of his investigation, and may give testi-mony relative thereto. The appealing party shall present its defense and proofs. The parthe provide the state of the provide the particulation of the state of shall be afforded the opportunity to examine all documents introduced.

#### Closing of Hearing 6.

The hearing officer shall specifically inquire of all parties whether they have further evi-dence. Upon receiving negative replies, the hearing officer shall declare the hearing closed.

## Hearing in Absence of a Member

The hearing may proceed in the absence of any party, who after it is shown has received due notice thereof, fails to be present or fails to request an adjournment. Adjournments may be requested of the hearing officer upon the request of a party or upon the initiative of the hearing officer. However, a decision shall not be made solely upon the default of a party, but shall be based upon the evidence in the matter before the Board.

### Decision of Board

The decision of the Board of Control shall be made within seven (7) days of the closing of the hearing. The decision shall be in writing, signed by the Executive Secretary and shall state the findings and conclusions of the Board. It shall be mailed to the appealing party by certified mail, return receipt re-quested. All decisions of the Board shall be final and nonappealable except as provided by these rules.

### **By-Law Clarification**

K.H.S.A.A. By-Law 27, Section 2, states that in spring no member school shall engage in football practice. Therefore, if your school is no the 9-12 high school plan, your ninth grade is con-sidered a part of your high school and may not participate in spring football practice. Article III of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution

states that junior high schools shall not be eligible for membership of the Association and are not for membership of the Association and are not eligible for membership, junior high schools are not subject to the rules and regulations of the K.H.S.A.A. Therefore, the decision to conduct spring football practice at the junior high school level would be left up to the local school district. By-Law 5, Section 2, provides that pupils en-rolled in grade school may play on the high school team. If a grade school pupil participates on a high school team he then becomes subject to the rules and regulations of the K.H.S.A.A. There-fore, any grade school student who has participated

The following is a proposed high school winter physical conditioning program:

- I. Open to all students: Sophomores, juniors, seniors Monday, Wednesday, Friday Freshmen Tuesday, Thursday

Supervised by representatives from the coaching staff.

- II. A. Total of thirty minutes:
  - 1. Quickness drills warm-up exercises 2. Grass Drill — run in place and on the whistle jump to your back or fall on your stomach
  - 3. Money Rolls three man roll on the mat
  - 4. Bear Run run on all fours length of mat
  - 5. Whirly Birds turn in full circle on
  - mat two times 6. Seat Roll drop on your seat and roll 7. Running Drills - run from one end of mat to other
  - 8. Wrestling two people wrestle for two 20 second periods staying on the mat knees down at all times

9. Quickness Drills - same as number 1

## The Image of Your Association

a part of the answer.

You are part of the problem if:

. you hide behind your Association when invoking a penalty or explaining a rule to a stu-dent and his parents by inferring that if it were up to you things would be different. You pass the buck by saying that your hands are tied be-cause these are the Association's rules and you cannot do anything about them.

... you make statements to the public and to members of the news media that are not correct. (You do this because you are naive, uninformed, covering for a personal mistake, seeking some kind of personal gain or supporting an outside interest.)

. . you coach, manage, or direct your program in the gray or fringe area as you search for and attempt to exploit loop-holes in the rules and regulations.

. you exploit students, parents, or community programs for your personal gain.

. . . you do things in front of your students that are against the rules for them.

. you fail to attend association meetings, workshops, etc.

... vou fail to study the Official Handbook, the "Athlete" and the various rule books that pertain to your responsibilities.

. you fail to join and take an active part in the professional associations relating to your responsibilities.

You are part of the answer if:

. you provide a student and his parents with clear explanations of rules and advise them that these are written, agreed upon, and admin-istered for all of the students throughout the State and that you support this procedure.

. you follow a simple two-step procedure Association rule or policy. First, you make an honest appraisal of the rule to understand how it relates to the best interests of students, member schools and their personnel throughout the state within the overall objectives of secondary edu-cation. Second, if you believe that change is needed, you utilize the appropriate avenue available for proposing amendments or seeking revisions.

. you have an understanding of the rules, regulations and policies of the Association so that you are able to provide knowledgeable answers to questions as logical explanations to false allegations.

. . . you take an active part in association meeting, rule interpretation meetings, workshops, etc.

Our staff is vitally concerned for each member school, each activity, and all of the students. We are dedicated to serving their best interests. We welcome the opportunity to assist you in the continued growth and development of the As-sociations to improve it - to protect it - and defend it.

Two prime ingredients of any successful or-

ganization are loyalty and pride. Let us resolve to make a positive contribution by being loyal to each other and the principles, standards, and ideals for which we stand, and by demonstrating that we have great pride in our profession, our Association, and the young people we serve.

AND WE QUOTE . . . "The Association is a voluntary organization, composed of member schools which voluntarily elect to participate in the various competitions. It is essential that ad-ministrators, coaches, and faculty support the Association rules and regulations, since the schools themselves, through democratic process of ballot and referendum, have made those rules and regu-lations. lations.

"If the time ever comes when member schools become party to law suits and continually criticize the Association's rules, then the very foundation of the Association s rules, and an origination, will be undermined. In this day of law suits and threats of law suits, school administra-tors and coaches and all faculty sponsors should support the Association and its rules, to prevent as much as possible any threatened litigation.

"If school people extend sympathy to those critical of Association rules, suggest or admit that its rules are stupid, antiquated, unfair, or make other disapproving remarks, then the schools will find themselves more often subject to law suits and legislative maneuvering.

"The Association is supported primarily by gate receipts from the State tournaments in Foot-ball and Basketball; if the Association is required to use these funds to defend itself and its rules against law suits, this just does not make sense. The money so spent could be better used improving Association undertakings.

"School administrators should caution spon-sors to use great care in the future in support and defense of Association rules and regulations and thus discourage and avoid expenditure of monies in court costs and attorney's fees.

"Any administrator or sponsor who feels a rule is not desirable has other avenues for providing a change. Opinions can be expressed to school administrators and by administrators to Legislative Council members to the Association office on removing rules or amending them. The Association has elective democratic processes whereby changes can be made at any time the majority of school administrators so desire. So, let's not encourage outsiders to attempt to change the rules by court action, - especially when it is YOUR money which is paying the cost of litigation.
