

## **HOT WEATHER HINTS**

A Comment by the Committee on the Medical Aspects of Sports of the American Medical Association and the National Federation

Early fall football practice frequently is conducted in very warm and highly humid weather in many parts of the United States. Under such conditions, special precautions should be observed. Otherwise, the athlete is subject to:

- · Heat Cramps depletion of electrolytes
- Heat Fatigue depletion of salt and water due to sweating
- Heat Exhaustion excessive depletion of salt and water
- Heat Stroke overheating from breakdown of the sweating mechanism

Each of these symptoms is a separate clinical entity. But the development of heat stroke is progressive and definite symptoms and signs will be manifested before it occurs. If these early warning signs are ignored, the failure of the body to dispose of excess internal heat could progress from heat fatigue to heat exhaustion to heat stroke.

Heat cramps are only temporarily disabling, but the moment of occurrence may be significant.

Heat fatigue dulls the athlete's skillful alertness and makes him more vulnerable to injury. The two heat illnesses can result in serious physical harm and even death; both are preventable.

Heat exhaustion and heat stroke are preventable only by careful control of various factors in the conditioning program of the athlete. Basic, of course, is an adequate health history examination prior to participation in practice. With the start of fall practice, it is essential to provide for gradual acclimation to hot weather activity. Equally important is the need to adjust salt and water intake to weather conditions.

As the athlete becomes accustomed to hot weather activity, he perspires more freely (thus dissipating body heat) and excretes less salt (thus conserving sodium). With a graduated training regimen, such acclimation can be expected to take place over a period of about one week.

The old idea that water should be withheld from athletes during workouts has no scientific foundation. In fact, such restriction, by depleting water in the body, can lead to heat fatigue and serious heat illness. During exercise in the heat, it is essential to replace - at least hourly - the water lost by perspiration.

Salt also needs to be replaced daily, particularly during the acclimation period. Extra salting of the athlete's food within the bounds of taste will accomplish this purpose. Salt tablets, particularly on an empty stomach, can be irritating and may be poorly absorbed.

Even after acclimation, it is advisable to alternate periods of strenuous exercise with periods of rest during hot weather. Also, it is important for the coach to observe his athletes carefully for signs of lethargy, inattention, stupor, awkwardness or unusual fatigue. Symptoms of water and salt depletion may include sluggishness, headache, nausea, hallucinations, and/or weak and rapid pulse. If heat illness is suspected, prompt attention to these recommended emergency procedures may have vital importance:

Heat Stroke: Collapse - with dry warm skin and rapid weak pulse - indicates sweating mechanism failure and rising body temperature. THIS IS AN EMERGENCY: DELAY COULD BE FATAL. Immediately cool athlete by the most expedient means (spraying or sponging with cool

water is a good method). OBTAIN MEDICAL CARE AT ONCE.

Heat Exhaustion: Weakness - with profuse sweating and rapid pulse - indicates state of shock due to depletion of salt and water. Place person flat on his back in the shade with head on the ground, level or lower than body. Give sips of diluted salt water if conscious. OBTAIN MEDICAL CARE AT ONCE.

The following suggestions are offered to help coaches prevent heat exhaustion and heat stroke during hot weather athletic activity:

- Require a careful medical history and checkup prior to the beginning of practice.
- Schedule workouts during cooler morning and early evening hours in hot weather.
- Acclimate athletes to hot weater activity by carefully graduated practice schedules.
- Provide rest periods of 15 to 30 minutes during workouts of an hour or more in hot weather.
- Supply clothing that is white to reflect heat, comfortable to permit heat escape, and permeable to moisture to allow heat loss via sweat evaporation.
- Furnish extra salt and water in recommended amounts during hot weather.
- Watch athletes carefully for signs of trouble, particularly athletes who lose much weight, heavy athletes (e.g. interior linemen), and the determined athlete who may not report discomfort.
- Remember that temperature and humidity are the crucial factors. Measuring the relative humidity, by use of a sling psychrometer on the field, is advantageous in this regard. Heat exhaustion and heat stroke can occur in the shade.
- Alert the hospital emergency room medical and nursing staff of the possibility of heat illness among athletes before an emergency occurs so that they are prepared to care for a stricken athlete.
- Know what to do in case of such an emergency. Be familiar with immediate first aid practices and prearranged procedures for obtaining immediate medical, including ambulance service.
- Outlaw the hazardous warm weather use of rubberized apparel or other dehydration devices by players.

Some teams encounter hot weather during the season either through intersectional travel or following an unseasonably cool period. By this time, the athletes should be physically fit; nevertheless, they will not be environmentally fit. Coaches who face this situation are advised to schedule practices preceding the game at the warmest time of day, to diligently subscribe to the other recommendations above, and to use substitutes during the game more frequently than normal. The result will benefit the team's performance as well as the health of the athletes.

## MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at Kenlake State Park, Aurora, Kentucky, on Friday morning, July 25, 1980. The meeting was called to order by President Barney Thweatt, at 9:00 a.m. Present were Board members Zeb Blankenship, Robie Harper, Joseph McPherson, J.D. Minnehan, Norman Passmore, Walter Pickett, Fairce O. Woods, Commissioner Tom Mills, Assistant Commissioners Brigid DeVries, Louis Stout and Billy V. Wise. Conley Manning was present representing the State Department of Education. The invocation was given by Norman Passmore.

Robie Harper moved, seconded by Zeb Blankenship, that the minutes of the April meeting be accepted. The motion passed unanimously.

President Thweatt presented plaques to outgoing Board members Joseph McPherson and Norman Passmore and thanked them for their service and contribution to the Association as

members of the Board of Control. They accepted their plaques with words of thanks. Pete Grigsby and Jack Burkich were not present to accept their plaques.

The Board of Control held its election of officers for 1980-81. Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by Robie Harper, that Zeb Blankenship and J.D. Minnehan be elected President and Vice-President respectively. The motion passed unanimously.

Barney Thweatt thanked the Board members for their support during his tenure as President of the Board and then turned the meeting over to the newly elected President, Zeb Blankenship.

President Blankenship introduced the following new members of the Board of Control: Mr. John Brock, Morehead; Mr. Whaylon Coleman, Owensboro; Mr. Alvis Johnson, Harrodsburg. Mr. Charles Black of Barbourville was not present.

President Zeb Blankenship asked the members of the Board that attended the Annual National Federation Meeting in July to report on the meetings they attended. After comments by each member, they all agreed it was an excellent meeting and that each Board member should make special effort to attend the Annual National Federation Meeting.

Commissioner Mills presented to the Board copies of the material completed for the auditor and copies of the 1980-81 budget report. He explained the form the State Board asked the Association to use in reporting receipts and expenditures for the past year and the budget form for the upcoming school year. Following a discussion of the proposed budget, Walter Pickett moved, seconded by J.D. Minnehan, that the budget and audit report be approved. The motion carried unanimously.

J.D. Minnehan presented the report of the Basketball Committee on the results of the recent balloting on classification. He reported that 144 Board appointed representatives voted in favor of classification in basketball while 149 opposed. Following a lengthy discussion of the report, J.D. Minnehan moved, seconded by Barney Thweatt, that since a majority of those Board appointed representatives voting opposed classification, the present playoff system in basketball be continued. The motion passed with 8 voting in favor of the motion and one abstention.

President Blankenship appointed the following committees:

East Eligibility Committee — Chairman Zeb Blankenship, Vice Chairman Fairce O. Woods, Charles D. Black, John Brock, Alvis Johnson

West Eligibility Committee — Chairman Barney Thweatt, Vice Chairman J.D. Minnehan, Whaylon Coleman, Robie Harper, Walter Pickett

Commissioner Mills asked that the Board not act on agenda item 8, setting the site for the 1981 Girls' State Basketball Tournament, until the next meeting of the Board of Control. J.D. Minnehan moved, seconded by Fairce O. Woods, that item 8 on the agenda be tabled. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Mills called attention to some of the major changes in the 1980-81 Constitution and By-Laws. Article III, Membership, will now read as follows: "This association shall be composed of public secondary schools which are accredited by the Kentucky State Board of Education, and non-public secondary schools which voluntarily comply with accrediting standards of the Kentucky Department of Education or comply with 704 Kentucky Administrative Regulation 6:010 (Non Public Schools). Member schools are required to comply with the provisions of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution and By-Laws. No school shall become a member or continue to be a member whose detailed financial (athletic, or otherwise), scholastic and attendance records are not matters of public property of record. Junior high schools shall not be eligible for membership."

Mr. Mills also explained the addition to Article X directing the principals of each school to require all participants of interscholastic athletics and their parents or guardians to acknowledge receipt of the eligibility rules as promulgated by the Association and State Board regulations.

Mr. Mills presented a request from several schools in Jefferson County that the Board consider

changing certain sports seasons from the spring to the fall. He also presented a letter requesting that the member schools be surveyed to determine their interest in sponsoring softball as an inter-scholastic sport. President Blankenship referred these two items to the Minor Sports Committee for further study.

Mr. Mills presented a letter from Mr. Louis Schneider, a representative of the Victory Athletic Club in Louisville, requesting that the Joe Binks Cross Country Runs be sanctioned by the Board. Following a discussion of By-Law 20, which stipulates that no meet, tournament, post-season game, or all-star contest will be sanctioned by the Board of Control unless it is sponsored by a member school, conference, group of schools, or coaches association, which shall have full control of planning, supervision, and disposition of finances, it was agreed that the event could not be sanctioned by the Board under the present arrangement.

Mr. Mills presented correspondence received from Attorney John Bankemper, appealing the ruling of the commission on the eligibility status of Matthew Robert Kinsella, a student who is ineligible to represent Fort Thomas Highlands High School in athletics under the provisions of By-Law 6, Section 1, Transfer Rule. Following a discussion of the contents of the correspondence, Barney Thweatt moved, seconded by J.D. Minnehan that By-Law 6, Section 1, Transfer Rule, not be waived in this case. The motion passed with a vote of 8-0 with one abstention.

Following a discussion of the fact that the University of Kentucky has scheduled a basketball game with a team from Russia on November 14, 1980, and after noting that this date conflicts with high school regional football playoffs in Kentucky, the Commissioner was instructed to contact the athletic officials at the University of Kentucky, requesting that the basketball game be scheduled on another date thereby eliminating the conflict and possible financial loss to member schools should the game be played as scheduled.

The next meeting of the Board of Control was scheduled for October 18, at the K.H.S.A.A. Building, Lexington, at 9:00 a.m.

J.D. Minnehan moved, seconded by Walter Pickett, that all bills of the Association for the period beginning April 1, 1980, and ending June 30, 1980, be allowed. The motion passed unanimously.

Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by Robie Harper, that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried unanimously.


