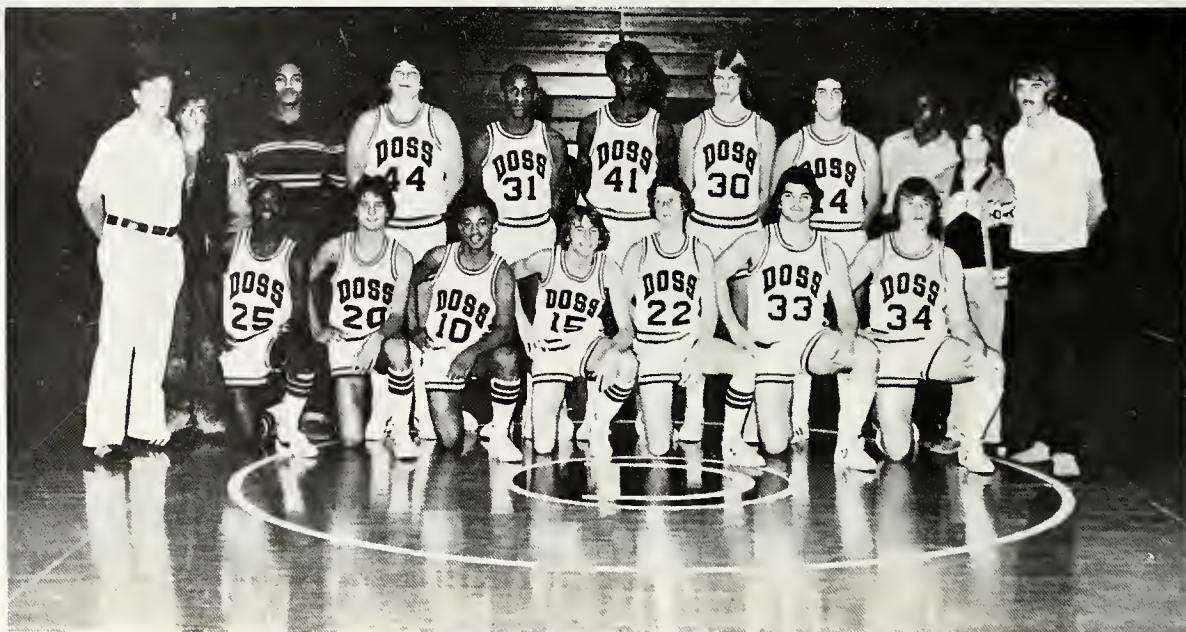

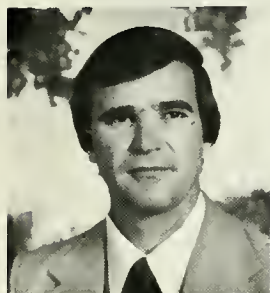

Newly Elected Board Members

The following school personnel will become members of the Board of Control effective July 1, 1980. Mr. John Brock, Superintendent of Rowan County Schools, representing Section 8; Mr. Charles D. Black, Principal of Knox Central High School, representing Section 7; Mr. Alvis Johnson, Assistant Principal of Harrodsburg High School, representing Regions 9-16; and Mr. Whaylon Coleman, Assistant Principal at Owensboro High School, representing Regions 1-8.

Mr. Walter Pickett, Principal at Valley High School, will represent Section 3 and replaces Mr. Denzil J. Ramsey who recently retired.

John Brock was born in Pineville, Kentucky, December 2, 1937, and is a graduate of Bell County High School. He received his B.A. in Biology from Lincoln Memorial University in 1960, a Masters Degree from Alabama College in 1964 and Rank I certification at Eastern Kentucky University in 1969. Mr. Brock taught and coached at Bell County High School two years and Pineville High School for two years. He served as principal of Harlan High School and Madison High and elementary schools in Richmond. He served as superintendent of the Montgomery County Schools and Director of Planning for the Kentucky Department of Education before becoming Superintendent of the Rowan County Schools in 1976. He is married to the former Susan Morgan of Pineville and they have two children, Dawne and Bill.

Charles Black is a graduate of Gulf Coast Military Academy, Gulfport, Mississippi. He attended Union College in Barbourville where he received his B.S. and Masters Degree and Eastern Kentucky University where he received his Administrative Certificate and Rank I. Mr. Black completed his military service in the United States Army during World War II and the Korean War and is a member of the U.S. Army Reserve. He coached football, track and basketball and was Athletic Director at Knox Central High School before becoming principal. He and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Susan, and sons, Charles and Scott.

Alvis Johnson, a native of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, is a graduate of Christian County High School and Western Kentucky University. Mr. Johnson taught and coached for three years in the Christian County School System before moving to Harrodsburg where he has served as the head football coach, track coach, Assistant Principal and Athletic Director. Mr. Johnson is a deacon in the

Centennial Baptist Church in Harrodsburg. He is married to the former Rosetta Cooke of Bowling Green, Kentucky. They have two sons, Derrick and Dennis.

Whaylon Coleman is a graduate of the former Western High School in Owensboro, Kentucky. Mr. Coleman attended the University of Idaho where he completed his undergraduate work. A basketball standout while at the University of Idaho, Mr. Coleman was the first Black to captain a sports team at that school and in 1976 was named to the Idaho Sports Hall of Fame. Mr. Coleman became Assistant Coach at Western High School in Owensboro where he later served as head coach for two years. Western High School in Owensboro consolidated and Mr. Coleman moved to Eastern Junior High, presently Estes Middle School, where he taught and coached basketball and football. He then moved to Owensboro High School in 1973 where he is currently the Assistant Principal. Mr. Coleman completed his Masters Degree and Rank I at Western Kentucky University. He is married to the former Birdie Dunn and they have two sons, Danny and Whaylon, Jr.

Walter Pickett is a native of Columbia, Kentucky, where he was graduated from high school. After three years of military service in World War II, he obtained his A.B. Degree from the University of Louisville. After receiving his M.A. Degree from the University of Kentucky, he joined the faculty of Valley High School in the Jefferson County School System. Mr. Pickett became Assistant Principal of Valley in 1956 and has been Principal since 1970. He has been active in community activities and clubs and is an Elder in Faith Presbyterian Church. Mr. Pickett is married to the former Ann Cantrell of Greensburg and they have a son, Lewis, and a daughter, Cathy.

Minutes of the Board Meeting

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the K.H.S.A.A. office on Thursday, April 17, 1980. The meeting was called to order by President Barney Thweatt at 3:00 P.M. with all Board members; Commissioner Tom Mills and Assistant Commissioners Brigid L. DeVries, Louis Stout and Billy V. Wise present. Conley Manning was present representing the State Department of Education. The invocation was given by Norman Passmore.

President Thweatt welcomed Prin. Walter Pickett, Valley High School, as the newly elected Board of Control member representing Regions 5 and 6. Mr. Pickett is serving out the remaining term of Denzil J. Ramsey who has retired.

President Thweatt also introduced Mike Embry of the Lexington Herald Leader, Prin. Tom Hodd and Ath. Dir. Stan Steidel of Dayton High School.

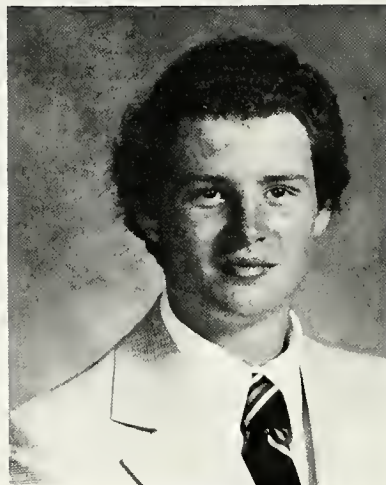
Pete Grigsby moved, seconded by Norman Passmore, that the minutes of the March meeting be approved. The motion carried unanimously.

Assistant Commissioner Billy Wise reported the attendance at the Girls' State Basketball Tournament at approximately 21,360 as compared to 28,753 in 1979. The gross receipts from the girls' tournament was approximately \$77,032 with expenses of \$48,276.42.

The Boys' State Basketball Tournament had an attendance of 85,360 and gross receipts of approximately \$343,445.00 with expenditures of \$90,993.25. A complete audit of both girls and boys tournaments will appear in the August issue of the Athlete.

Basketball Committee Chairman J. D. Minnehan presented to the Board a survey form and cover letter pertaining to classification in basketball as requested by President Thweatt during the March Meeting. Mr. Minnehan explained to the Board members that the basketball Committee does not recommend that a list of pros and cons be formulated by the Commissioner or Board of Control to accompany the survey forms. GAME GUY AWARD



Todd Burns

The Game Guy Trophy is annually awarded to the one athlete in the State of Kentucky who has overcome a physical handicap and participated in high school athletics. Todd Burns was the unanimous choice of the K.H.S.A.A. for the 1980 award.

Todd Burns is a senior at Oldham County High School and a starter on the boys' basketball team. During the winter of the 1978-79 school year, Todd was involved in a serious automobile accident wherein he sustained a fractured pelvis. The injury was so extreme the doctor stated he was not optimistic about Todd ever walking again and refused to discuss with Todd's parents the possibility of their son participating in athletics again.

Only through Todd's individual perseverance in the physical therapy program designed specifically for him was he able to overcome his disability and return to excel on this year's eighth regional championship team.

belief of the members of the Committee that each representative has his or her own opinion as to why there should or should not be classification in basketball and regardless of what is presented by the Board, they leave themselves open to charges of attempting to sway the vote one way or the other. After discussing the contents of the cover letter and survey form, Norman Passmore moved, seconded by Zeb Blankenship that the Board accept the recommendation of the Basketball Committee. The motion passed with a vote of 7 ayes, 3 abstentions.

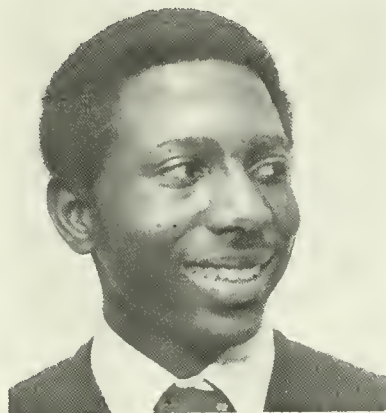
Mr. Mills read a letter from Prin. Ronald Fentress of Anderson County High School, requesting that Anderson County High School and Western Anderson High School be moved from District 29 to District 30 in basketball. After a lengthy discussion and considering the fact that a new school, Bullitt East High School, will be assigned to District 29, Jack Burkich moved, seconded by J. D. Minnehan, that the request of Prin. Fentress be granted. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mills reported to the Board that a new school, Western Hills High School will open in Franklin County beginning in August, 1980. He recommended that Western Hills High School be placed in Basketball District 41. Joe McPherson moved, seconded by Fairce O. Woods, that the Commissioner's recommendation be accepted. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Zeb Blankenship presented the Staff Committee report. The following recommendations were presented for consideration by the Board.

J.B. MANSFIELD AWARD**Jackie Bearden**

The J.B. Mansfield Award for girls was won by Jackie Bearden, Dixie Heights High School, Ft. Mitchell, Kentucky. The annual award inaugurated by the Courier-Journal and Times is presented to the player in the K.H.S.A.A. Girls' State Basketball Tournament who excels in four areas: basketball ability, academic accomplishments, sportsmanship and citizenship. The selection was made by a committee of school personnel from throughout the state.

TED SANFORD AWARD**Dicky Beal**

To foster the ideals exemplified by Ted Sanford, former Commissioner of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association, the Courier-Journal and Times inaugurated the Ted Sanford Award to be given annually to a player in the K.H.S. Boys' State Basketball Tournament who excels in four areas: basketball ability, academic accomplishments, sportsmanship and citizenship. This year a committee composed of school personnel from throughout the state selected Dicky Beal, Holmes High School, Covington.

1. That the position of Executive Assistant be created and that Billy V. Wise be employed to fill this position at a fee of \$3,000.00 per year in addition to his present salary.

2. That Commissioner Tom Mills be paid an additional fee of \$1,200.00 per year for serving as secretary-treasurer of the organization.

3. That Louis Stout be placed in Rank II on the 1980-81 salary schedule.

4. That all non-certified personnel receive a salary increase of 6.6% for 1980-81.

5. That the following administrative personnel be granted four-year contracts with the Kentucky High School Athletic Association beginning July 1, 1980: Commissioner Tom Mills, Executive Assistant Billy V. Wise, Assistant Commissioners Bridgid L. DeVries and Louis Stout.

6. That salary increases for all certified personnel be based upon the Kentucky Department of Education Foundation Program Allotment for Instructional salaries for the 1980-82 biennium.

Zeb Blankenship moved, seconded by Pete Grigsby, that the recommendations of the Staff Committee be accepted. The motion passed unanimously.

Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by J. D. Minnehan, that Barney Thweatt and Zeb Blankenship be named Delegate and Alternate, respectively, to the fourthcoming annual meeting of the National Federation. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Mills requested that the Board set the price of tickets for the 1981 State Basketball Tournaments and recommended that the price be increased 50¢ per ticket. Jack Burkich moved, seconded by J. D. Minnehan, that the Board accept the recommendation of the Commissioner to raise the price of the boys and girls state high school basketball tournament tickets from \$4.00 and \$5.00 to \$4.50 and \$5.50, respectively, for 1981. The motion passed.

The officials' fee for registration with the K.H.S.A.A. was discussed. Commissioner Mills explained that the

present fee of \$9.00 for registration for the first sport and \$6.00 for each additional sport does not cover the cost to the Board. He explained that the fee includes rule books, shoulder insignia, copy of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution and By-Laws, subscription to the *ATHLETE* and liability and catastrophe insurance while officiating or traveling to or from assigned games. The Commissioner recommended that the registration fee for officials be set at \$15.00 for the first sport and \$10.00 for each additional sport beginning July 1, 1980. Norman Passmore moved, seconded by Zeb Blankenship, that the recommendation of the Commissioner be accepted. The motion passed unanimously.

After a lengthy discussion on the amount of the annual membership fee to be paid by each member school, Zeb Blankenship moved that the following plan be adopted effective July 1, 1980: Each member school shall pay to the Commissioner on or before September 1 an annual membership fee of 10¢ per student enrolled in the upper three grades with a minimum fee of \$35.00 and a maximum fee of \$125.00. The membership figures at the close of the first month of the previous school year as received from the State Department of Education shall be used in calculating the membership fee for each school. J. D. Minnehan seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Mills reported to the Board that they needed to update Article IV, Section 3-d-4. He recommended that it read as follows: "Hold regular meetings in July, October, December, January, March and April." Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by Walter Pickett, that the changes be made in Article IV, Section 3-d-4. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mills stated that Knott County Central High School has requested permission to be placed in Class AAA, Region IV, District 2, Sub-District 1, and James A. Cawood High School asked to be changed to Class AAA, Region IV, District 1, Sub-District 1, in football. Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by Norman Passmore, that these requests be granted. The motion passed unanimously.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

The Sixty-Third Annual Meeting of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Delegate Assembly was held at the office of the K.H.S.A.A., Lexington, on Friday morning, April 18, 1980. The invocation was given by Jack Burkich.

President Barney Thweatt called the meeting to order at 11:00 A.M. and asked Assistant Commissioner Billy V. Wise to call the roll. Fifty-five elected delegates or alternates answered the roll call.

Commissioner Tom Mills then presented a report on the activities of the Association during the 1979-80 school year. Jim Pursiful moved, seconded by Luther McDowell, that the report be accepted. The motion carried unanimously. (The Commissioner's report is printed elsewhere in this issue of the "Athlete.")

President Thweatt stated that presentation of proposals was the next order of business.

Jim Pursiful moved that Proposal I be tabled. Proposal I reads as follows: Principal David S. Points, Montgomery County High School, proposes that By-Law 4, Age, be changed to read as follows: "A contestant becomes ineligible on his/her nineteenth birthday with the following exceptions: If the age of nineteen is attained after the sport season has started, he/she remains eligible for the remainder of the season in that sport. For the application of this rule, the fall sports season shall begin on **August 1**, the winter sports season on **November 1**, and the spring sports season on **March 1**." The motion died for lack of a second.

Robert Hoagland moved, seconded by Luther

McDowell, that Proposal I be adopted. The motion carried.

Joseph McPherson moved, seconded by Ronald Johnson, that Proposal II be adopted. Proposal II reads as follows: The State Board for Elementary and Secondary Education, through an adhoc committee composed of Superintendents, Principals and Coaches, proposes that By-Law 29, Requirement for Coaches, be amended to read as follows: "Coaches of athletic teams of members of this Association shall be certified teachers and members of their regular school systems. They shall be regularly employed by their Board of Education, and their entire salaries shall be paid by such boards; they shall teach a minimum of three regular periods of classes, gymnasium, study halls, or other activity assignments within the school's schedule. Whenever a local school district is unable to staff an athletic program under the above rule, the local district superintendent may request the Commissioner to approve, for one school year, an alternative staffing arrangement provided appropriate justification is given in writing on forms provided by the Commissioner. As long as a paraprofessional is acting within the scope of authority as set forth in 704 KAR 15:080 and KRS 161:010; 161:044, he/she may assist coaches.

All schools shall comply with the provisions of this rule in order to qualify for and to maintain membership in the Association.

A head coach in football, basketball, baseball and wrestling shall attend one clinic in the sport involved." The motion failed to receive the necessary two-thirds vote for passage.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned by President Barney Thweatt.

1979-80 ANNUAL REPORT (Presented to Delegate Assembly)

Three hundred fifteen schools joined the Association for the 1979-80 school year. Twelve of these schools enroll girls only and ten have only boys. In 1978-79, there were 315 schools, in 1977-78 there were 313, in 1976-77, there were 312.

There were 191 schools involved in football. The Classes A, AA, AAA and AAAA championship games were played at the Fairgrounds, Louisville. Attendance was approximately 11,719 and gross receipts were \$43,643.40. Expenses involved in conducting the state football play-offs were \$26,727.43. Interest and attendance at the regional and semi-final games continued to increase resulting in greater revenue for the schools involved.

In Cross Country 152 boys' teams entered twenty-two regional meets. One hundred and eight girls teams entered all three classes in seventeen regions. The expenses incurred in sponsoring this sport were \$9,329.17 and the receipts were \$1,540.50. The Class AAA Meet was held at E.P. Sawyer State Park, Louisville, and the Classes A and AA were held in Lexington at the Kentucky Horse Park.

The Wrestling program is going forward at a rapid pace. There were sixty-three schools in the eight regions with the winner and runner-up in each weight class advancing to the finals. The Championship tournament was held at Atherton High School. The receipts and expenditures will be listed in the audit report in the August "ATHLETE."

In Swimming, forty-two girls' teams and forty-two boys' teams competed for the championships. The meets were held at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond on February 22-23. The receipts were \$566.50 and the expenses were \$6,021.78.

There were twenty schools with boys' Gymnastics teams and twenty-two with girls. There were two girls' regional meets held at Henry Clay High School and Moore High School, but there was not sufficient number of boys' teams to justify a regional. The state meets were at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond on February 16. The receipts were \$323.50 and the expenses were \$2,681.89.

The approximate gross receipts from the boys' and girls' district basketball tournaments were \$466,352.24 while the regional tournaments took in \$354,544.81, for a total of \$820,897.05. Attendance at the Boys' State Tournament was approximately 85,360 as compared to 103,993 for last year. The gross receipts this year for the tournament is estimated at \$352,293.20, with expenditures approximately \$90,993.25. A complete audit will appear in the August issue of the "ATHLETE."

Attendance at the Girls' State Basketball Tournament was 21,360. The gross receipts amounted to \$77,875.00 with expenditures of approximately \$48,276.42. A complete report will appear in the audit.

There were thirteen co-ed teams competing in the State Rifle Marksmanship Meet in Louisville. Expenses incurred were approximately \$425.80.

Approximately thirteen teams competed in the State Fencing Meet on April 5, 1980 at Atherton High School, Louisville.

In volleyball fifty three teams competed for the first K.H.S.A.A. sanctioned tournament held at Memorial Coliseum, Lexington, on October 27, 1979. Expenses incurred were \$4,705.19.

After studying the new football alignment in districts and regions set by the Football Committee, Jack Burkich moved, seconded by Fairce O. Woods, that the recommendations of the Football Committee concerning the 1981 and 1982 football alignment be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Wise submitted to the Board copies of the minutes of the Basketball Assigning Secretaries meeting held in Louisville on March 25, 1980. These minutes contained several recommendations pertaining to standardized requirements for the establishment of Policy Committees throughout the State. A copy of these minutes, including action taken by the Board of Control, will be made available to member schools through their assigning secretary.

Joseph McPherson made a motion, seconded by Norman Passmore, that the site for the Boys' State Basketball Tournament be rotated each year between Rupp Arena and Louisville Freedom Hall. The motion failed to carry by a vote of 3-7.

The date of the next meeting of the Board of Control was scheduled for Friday, July 25, 1980, 10:00 A.M., at Kenlake State Park, Aurora, Kentucky.

Norman Passmore moved, seconded by Pete Grigsby, Jr., that all bills of the Association for the period beginning March 1, 1980, and ending March 31, 1980, be allowed. The motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business, Fairce O. Woods moved, seconded by J. D. Minnehan, that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried unanimously.

In the other sports that are to follow 270 baseball teams will compete in fifty-nine districts and sixteen regions; 238 girls' and 235 boys' tracks teams will compete in twenty four regions each; 114 girls' golf teams and 203 boys' teams will play in nineteen regions; 192 girls' tennis teams and 197 boys' teams will play in eleven regions. State Championship meets will be held in baseball at Fort Knox; the class A, AA and AAA track at the University of Kentucky, Lexington; the girls' golf at Elizabethtown Country Club, Elizabethtown; the boys' golf at the Anderson Golf Course, Fort Knox; the tennis at the University of Kentucky, Lexington.

Registering with the officials' division of the Association were 1,520 basketball officials, 768 football, 603 baseball at the present time and 70 wrestling, 26 volleyball officials, and 53 soccer officials. Assistant Commissioner Billy V. Wise conducted twelve clinics in football and fifteen in basketball for officials and coaches. Assistant Commissioner Louis Stout conducted a state clinic for baseball Assigning Secretaries. Out of 514 football officials that took the National Federation examination for advanced ratings, 157 became approved and we have 320 certified. In basketball out of 730 that took the test, 182 became approved and we have 487 certified. One hundred twenty eight took the baseball test, 75 became approved and 73 are certified.

The Board of Control, the Assistant Commissioners and I are grateful for the cooperation the superintendents, principals, athletic directors and coaches have given us in running the program for the Association.

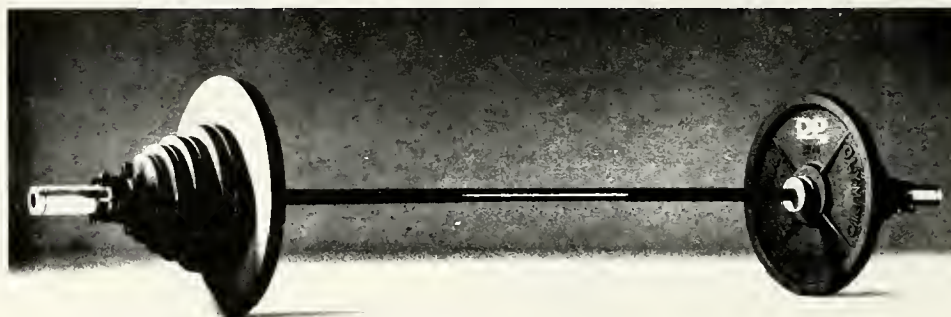
