MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the Hyatt Regency, Lexington, on Friday, March 26, 1982. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. by President J.D. Minnehan. Board members Charles Black, John Brock, Whaylon Coleman, Eldon Davidson, Robie Harper, Bob Rogers, Charles Miller, and Fairce Woods; Commissioner Tom Mills, Executive Assistant Billy V. Wise, Assistant Commissioners Brigid DeVries and Louis Stout were present. Conley Manning was present representing the State Department of Education. Robie Harper gave the invocation.

Bob Rogers moved, seconded by Fairce Woods, that the minutes of the January meeting be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Mills gave a report on the results of the election for new Board members to represent Section 3 and Section 4. Prin. Ray Story, North Hardin High School, was elected by receiving 32 votes, and Prin. Patrick Crawford, Ballard High School, was elected by receiving 33 votes.

President Minnehan discussed with the Board members the training session to be held at Pine Mountain State Park on Saturday, April 24, 1982. Mr. Minnehan reported that he had contacted Consultant Jim Huges to speak at the training session.

After a discussion by Mr. Minnehan on the value of featured articles of recognition to be run in the Athlete, John Brock moved, seconded by Charles Miller, that the Board approve the running of featured articles in the Athlete. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Wise gave a brief report on the progress of the Boys' State Basketball Tournament stating that the attendance at this point in the tournament is up slightly over the 1981 figure. He stated that he would have a more detailed report at the April Meeting. The girls' tournament held on the Campus of Eastern Kentucky University was very successful with the attendance being consistent with the last few years. A financial audit of both tournaments will appear in the August issue of the "Athlete."

President Minnehan discussed at length the assigning of officials and the fact that he had investigated the possibility of going to a computerized method of assigning officials. He reported that he had discussed this with representatives of other state associations and found that it had worked well in their states. Mr. Minnehan suggested that a committee be formed to study this phase of the Officials' Division. Bob Rogers moved, seconded by Eldon Davidson, that a committee be formed to study the Officials' Division and that Mr. Minnehan be named Chairman. The motion carried unanimously. Board members who volunteered to be named to the Committee with Mr. Wise and Mr. Minnehan were: Whaylon Coleman, John Brock, Robie Harper, and Bob Rogers.

After a discussion on the eligibility case of Tommy Smith who was ruled ineligible under By-Law 6, Transfer Rule, John Brock moved, seconded by Whaylon Coleman, that By-Law 6 be waived in this case and that Tommy Smith be considered eligible immediately to represent Paintsville High School in interscholastic athletics providing he meets all other eligibility requirements. The motion passed unanimously.

President Minnehan presented a letter received from Principal Bill Van Winkle, representing the schools in the Big 8 Conference recommending that the K.H.S.A.A. discontinue the practice of presenting free passes to each member school for the Boys' and Girls' State Basketball Tournaments. Mr. Van Winkle further recommended that the Board of Control consider adopting the semi-state plan for basketball playoffs as is presently being done in Indiana. Following a discussion on each of the recommendations, Robie Harper made the motion that the suggestions be referred to the All-Sports Committee and the Basketball Committee for consideration. Whaylon Coleman seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Robie Harper moved, seconded by Whaylon Coleman, that item 2 "the boys and girls basketball tournaments adopt the Indiana semi-state system. The basis for this is that it is less disruptive, less expensive and more educationally sound," be referred to the Basketball Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

Bob Rogers presented a request from the Western Kentucky Conference Officials' Association that the same mileage fee be paid to all football officials. John Brock moved, seconded by Eldon Davidson, that the request be referred to the Football Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

Bob Rogers request that Ballard Memorial High School be given permission to play a benefit basketball game between their seniors and teachers for a husband of a teacher who has Lou Gehrig disease. Eldon Davidson moved, seconded by Fairce Woods, that By-Law 32 be waived in this case. The motion carried unanimously.

Following a suggestion that the runner-up in the basketball district tournament play not be allowed to continue on to the regional tournament, John Brock moved, seconded by Charles Miller, that this be referred to the Basketball Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Conley Manning reported to the Board that the State Department of Education will conduct a survey of the member schools on classification of schools in basketball.

After a discussion on the mileage allowance for the Board of Control and K.H.S.A.A. staff, Fairce Woods moved, seconded by John Brock, that the amount be changed to 20¢ per mile. The motion carried unanimously. Charles Miller moved, seconded by Charles Black, that the motion be amended to read "to be effective as of July 1, 1982." The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor and 1 abstention.

Upon a request by Louis Stout, John Brock moved, seconded by Robie Harper, that the Board approve the use of one umpire in areas where there is a shortage of umpires for 1982 with the fee of \$27.50 plus mileage and beginning in 1983 that the one umpire system not be used. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor and 3 opposed.

Following a discussion on the recent legal action filed by the Dayton Independent Board of Education, et al, in the Franklin Circuit Court on classification in basketball, Fairce Woods moved, seconded by Whaylon Coleman, that the matter be referred to Board Attorney Phillip Scott

The next meeting of the Board of Control was scheduled for April 15, 1982 at 9:00 A.M., at the K.H.S.A.A. Building, Lexington.

There being no further business, John Brock moved, seconded by Whaylon Coleman, that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried unanimously.

1982 K.H.S.A.A. Annual Meeting

The business meeting of the Delegate Assembly was held on Friday, April 16, at 11:00 A.M. at the K.H.S.A.A. Building.

As provided in Article IX, Section 1, of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution the following proposals for changes in the rules of the Association, to be acted upon at the annual meeting, are hereby submitted to all members of the K.H.S.A.A. for their information. No proposals other than these may be considered at the annual meeting, except by a two-thirds vote of the delegates.

PROPOSAL I

Prin. Teddy White, Grayson County High School, proposes that By-Law 4, Age, be changed to read as follows: "A contestant becomes ineligible on his/her nineteenth birthday with the following exception: If the

age of nineteen is attained after the sport season has started, he/she remains eligible for the remainder of the season in that sport. For the application of this rule, the fall sports season shall begin on August 1, the winter sports season on November 1, and the spring sports season on January 1."

PROPOSAL II

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association proposes that By-Law 6 (1), Transfer Rule, be changed to read as follows: "If there has been a simultaneous change in the residence of the parents into the school district where the school the student now attends is located, except that the student may delay joining his/her parents until the end of the semester in which the change of residence occurred or the end of the current sports season if the student is a participant."

1981-82 ANNUAL REPORT (Presented to the Delegate Assembly)

Three hundred five schools joined the Association for the 1981-82 school year. Eleven of these schools enroll girls only and eight have only boys. In 1980-81 there were 314 schools, in 1979-80 there were 315.

There were 199 schools involved in Football. Classes A, AA, AAA, and AAAA Championship games were played at the Fairgrounds, Louisville. Attendance was approximately 17,049 and gross receipts were \$62,453.25. Expenses involved in conducting the state football playoffs were \$27,438.07. Interest and attendance at the regional, semi-final and final games continued to increase resulting in greater revenue for the schools involved.

In Cross Country 142 boys' teams entered twenty-two regional meets. One hundred twenty-three girls' teams entered all three classes in seventeen regional. The expenses incurred in sponsoring this sport were \$10,672.36 and the receipts were \$3,972.00. Classes A, AA and AAA were held in Lexington at the Kentucky Horse Park.

The Wrestling program continues to move forward at a rapid pace. There were sixty schools in the eight regions with the winner and runner-up in each weight class advancing to the finals. The championship tournament was held at Atherton High School with receipts for the meet of \$8,982.00 and expenditures of approximately \$10,282.61.

In Swimming forty-five girls' teams and forty-four boys' teams competed for the championships. The meets were held at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond, on February 26-27. The receipts were \$927.00 and the expenses were \$7,019.05.

The approximate gross receipts from the boys' and girls' district basketball tournaments were \$567,331.30 while the regional tournament took in \$445,530.50, for a total of \$1,012,861.80. Attendance at the Boys' State Tournament

was approximately 129,467 as compared to 112,856 for last year. The gross receipts this year for the tournament is estimated at \$592,683.68, with expenditures of approximately \$182,229.59.

Attendance at the Girls' State Basketball Tournament was 27,235. The gross receipts amounted to \$99,586.00 with expenditures of approximately \$55,032.86. A complete report will appear in the audit.

There were nineteen teams competing in the State Rifle Marksmanship Meet in Louisville. Expenses incurred were approximately \$850.56.

Approximately fourteen teams competed in the State Fencing Meet on April 3, 1982, at Atherton High School, Louisville.

There were fourteen schools with boys' Gymnastics teams and twenty-two with girls. There were two girls' regional meets held at Paris High School and Kentucky Country Day School, but there was not sufficient number of boys' teams to justify a regional. The state meets were held at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond, on February 20. The receipts were \$779.00 and expenses were \$2,872.01.

The number of schools competing in Volleyball was fifty-four. The K.H.S.A.A. sanctioned tournament was held at Memorial Coliseum, Lexington, on October 30-31, 1981. Expenses incurred were \$8,502.67 with receipts of \$3,555.00.

In the other sports that are to follow 261 baseball teams will compete in fifty-nine districts and sixteen regions; 190 girls' and 194 boys' track teams will compete in twenty-four regions; 121 girls' golf teams and 181 boys' teams will play in nineteen regions; 173 girls' tennis teams and 180 boys' teams will play in eleven regions. State championship meets will be held in baseball at Somerset; Classes A, AA, and AAA track at the University of

The number of officials who registered with the Officials' Division of the Association for 1981-82 and the number of approved and certified officials in each sport are as follows: Football - 741 registered, 176 approved, 365 certified; Volleyball - 38 registered, 6 approved (only second year registration of officials); Wrestling - 69 registered, 8 approved, 9 certified; Basketball - 1,527 registered, 334 approved, 500 certified; Baseball - 659 registered, 146 approved, 109 certified; Track - 13 registered, 2 approved (only second year registration of officials); Soccer - 79 registered, 20 approved, (Part II test not available last year). Executive Billy V. Wise conducted twelve clinics in football and sixteen in basketball for officials and coaches. Assistant Commissioner Louis Stout conducted twelve baseball clinics for officials and coaches throughout the state.

The Board of Control, the Assistant Commissioners and I are grateful for the cooperation the superintendents, principals, athletic directors and coaches have given us in running the program for the Association.

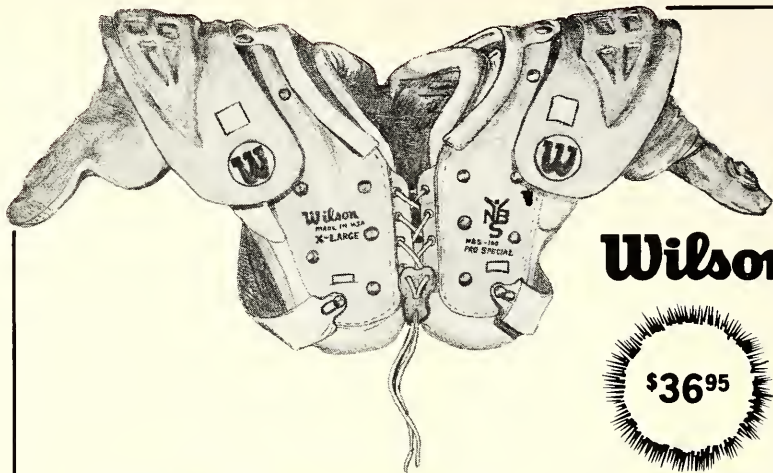

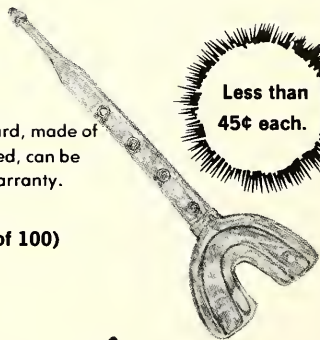
