



**1981-82 NATIONAL FEDERATION BASKETBALL**

**EARLY SEASON QUESTIONS**

**PUBLISHER'S NOTE:** These interpretations of the 1981-82 National Federation Basketball Rules do not set aside nor modify any rule. They are made

and published by the National Federation of State High School Associations in response to situations presented.

13.

**PLAY:** B1 fouls A1 with 9 seconds remaining in a tied game. Team A is in the bonus. The foul is B1's 5th personal. B1 is disqualified and the coach notified. B6 apparently reports to the scorer within the 30 seconds and is beckoned to enter. A1 makes the 1st attempt but misses the bonus. B1 secures the rebound, takes the ball downcourt and scores a field goal just before time expires. The scorer then indicates that the coach of Team A wants a conference to consider a correctable error. The coach asks the official to determine whether B6 reported properly. The coach contends a technical should have been charged and that a merited free throw was not awarded. The scorer, who had not notified the official that B6 failed to report, now states B6 did not report properly.

**RULING:** This is not a correctable error as covered under the provisions of rule 2-10. Team A is charged with a time-out. If an error had been made which is correctable, the time limit would not have expired. However, no correctable error was made at the time B6 entered. B6 was not charged with a technical foul for failing to report properly. Had a technical foul been assessed but not enforced, it would have been correctable. A substitute must specifically report to the scorer even though it may be obvious who he or she is replacing. (3-3;10-8-1)

14.

B1 fouls A1. The scorer indicates it is Team B's 5th personal foul in the 1st half. While A1's attempt is in the air, B2 commits a common foul on A2. It is B2's 5th personal foul. B2 is replaced by B6. The attempt by A1 was unsuccessful. At this point, the scorer notifies the nearer official that A1 should not have been given a free throw as Team B had only 4 personal fouls at that point.

**RULING:** The error of awarding A1 a free throw is correctable. However, since no free throw was scored, there is nothing to cancel regarding A1's attempt. B2's common foul and penalty which occurred during A1's unmerited free throw is cancelled. B2 is allowed to reenter the game. Team A is awarded the ball out-of-bounds nearest the spot of the original foul by B1. (2-10-2)

15.

**PLAY:** A1 jumps to throw the ball. B1 prevents the throw by placing one or both hands firmly on the

ball so that: (a) A1; or (b) A1 and B1 both return to the floor holding it.

**RULING:** Held ball in both (a) and (b). However, if A1 voluntarily drops the ball before returning to the floor, and A1 then touches the ball before it is touched by another player, A1 has committed a traveling violation. (4-27-4 Ques. 3)

16.

**PLAY:** A1 is disqualified with 5 fouls. A6 reports and replaces A1. Team A asks for and is granted a time-out. During the time-out, A7 replaces A6.

**RULING:** Legal procedure. The incoming substitute is not required to remain in the game a certain length of time, nor is it required that the ball must become alive or the clock must run before such incoming substitute is replaced. However, A1 may not reenter until the next opportunity for substitution after the clock has started. (3-3)

17.

**PLAY:** A1 dribbles the ball into Team A's frontcourt, however, the ball is taken away by B1. B1 dribbles the length of the court and attempts a layup. The ball does not go in the basket. The momentum of B1 carries him or her out-of-bounds. B1 recovers, comes back inbounds, grabs the rebound and puts it through the basket.

**RULING:** Two points for B1. The fact that B1 went out-of-bounds as a result of playing action does not prevent B1 from coming back inbounds, securing the rebound and scoring. The ball was not in B1's control during the time B1 was out-of-bounds. (7-1-1;10-6-8)

18.

**PLAY:** A technical foul is charged to B1. The captain of Team A indicates to the official that A1 will attempt the free throw. Team A then requests and is granted a time-out. Following the time-out, the Captain indicates to the official that A2 will attempt the free throw.

**RULING:** A2 should be allowed to shoot the free throw. The fact that Team A changed their mind is not confusing nor does it create an advantageous situation for Team A. (10-10 Penalty)

19.

**PLAY:** A1 is holding the ball in Teams A's frontcourt

near the division line. B1 is between A1 and A2. (a) A1 tosses the ball into the backcourt with considerable reverse spin. The ball touches the floor in the backcourt and rebounds to A2 in the frontcourt; or (b) A1 bounces the ball off the leg of an official who is in the backcourt and it rebounds to A2 in the frontcourt.

RULING: Violation in both (a) and (b). A2 was the first to touch the ball which a teammate caused to go from frontcourt to backcourt and the teammate was last to touch the ball before it went into the backcourt. It is a violation whether the touching by A2 is in the backcourt or the frontcourt. (9-9)

20.

PLAY: A1, is Team A's frontcourt, passes the ball to A2 who taps the ball so it strikes the floor on the division line and rolls into Team A's frontcourt where A3 touches it.

RULING: Regardless of whether the first touching is in the backcourt or the frontcourt, it is a violation. (9-9)

21.

PLAY: When does a disqualified player officially become a part of the "bench personnel" provision which dictates an automatic 2 shots for a technical foul?

RULING: A player becomes a disqualified player and under the influence of the "bench personnel" rule as soon as the official notifies the coach that the player has been disqualified. Obviously, a 2-shot penalty could be invoked prior to that time if warranted, but after notification it is automatic. (10-10 Penalty)

22.

PLAY: A1 is handed the ball for a throw-in following a 3-second violation. May either: (a) Team B; or (b) Team A be granted a time-out after the throw-in starts?

RULING: Once a throw-in starts (the official begins the count) it is too late, in (a) for Team B to be granted a time-out. In (b), Team A may have a time-out request granted until the count of 4 is reached by the official or until the ball is in flight on the throw-in by A1. (4-6-1)

23.

PLAY: Team A begins the game with 5 players and 3 substitutes. Early in the 3rd quarter, 3 Team A players have fouled out. Thereafter, A1 is injured and the coach is beckoned onto the court to determine the extent of the injury. After 3 minutes, the coach decides that A1 cannot continue. A1 goes to the bench.

RULING: Since there is no replacement available for A1, no time-outs are charged for the 3 minutes consumed in determining the extent of the injury to A1. If A1 had remained in the game, the 3 time-outs would have to be charged to Team A. A1 may later come back into the game as is possible with any player who leaves because of injury. (3-1;5-9)

COMMENT: Team A has complied with the exception that prevents charging a team with a time-out(s) if the injured player leaves the game. The fact that a replacement is not available does not alter this exception. The safety of players is of prime concern and this is supported by allowing the players removal even though no replacement is available.

24.

PLAY: A1 attempts a shot at his own basket from approximately 20 feet out. As soon as the ball is released on the try, B1 vibrates the backboard. The vibrating of the board does not appear in any way to interfere with the try. Should this be a technical foul?

RULING: Yes. Whenever the conditions of a try in flight have been met and the board is vibrated, a technical foul must be called. It makes no difference whether or not it appears that the vibrating will influence the success of the try. (10-6-7)

25.

PLAY: Five seconds remain to be played near the end of the 2nd quarter. Team A is ahead by 1 point and is shooting a free throw. The free throw is missed and both Team A and Team B members have instructions from their coaches not to touch the ball. The ball bounces from the rim to the floor and rolls to a stop with no players of either team attempting to gain possession.

RULING: The official will wait momentarily for a player of either team to gain possession of the ball. However, if no one does this, the official will blow the whistle and signal a jump ball at the nearest jumping circle. Since the clock does not start after a missed free throw until the ball is touched by a player, the jump ball will be administered with 5 seconds still remaining on the clock. (5-10-2;6-3-5)

26.

**PLAY:** Team B has already been warned for lack of sufficient action during the 4th period. In the 1st overtime period, with the score tied, Team A has 3 players in its midcourt area. B1 is continuously and aggressively attempting to get the ball from A1 and A2, as it is thrown back and forth from one to another. B2 is also in the midcourt area but makes no attempt to either cut off passing lanes or to initiate any other type of legitimate defense. A1 and A2 continue to pass the ball back and forth to each other and B1 rushes from one to the other.

**RULING:** At the end of 5 seconds, a technical foul would be charged to Team B for failing to comply after having been warned for lack of action. B2 must be positioned and react in such a way that either passing lanes are being cut off or legitimate defense is being played, otherwise a technical foul must be charged to Team B. (10-2-3)

27.

**PLAY:** B1 is occupying the 5th lane space during a free throw attempt by A1. Is this considered to be an unmarked space and what are the restrictions?

**RULING:** The 5th space is an unmarked lane space. A player occupying it may not break the plane or leave the space until the ball touches the ring, backboard or until the free throw ends. In addition, it is perfectly legal to be positioned in that space even though the imaginary free throw line extended actually would be directly under such player. (9-1-8)

The prices of tickets per set (8 sessions) for the girls' tournament are as follows: side chair seats are \$44.00; all bleacher seats are \$36.00. Only complete sets of tickets may be ordered by mail. Your certified check or money order should be made payable to "State Tournament Ticket Sales-Girls." Mail orders will be accepted on or after December 1, 1981. Tickets for individual sessions may be purchased at the tournament site any time during the tournament. All mail orders must include a remittance of \$1.00 for postage and insurance.

On or after December 1, 1981, K.H.S. Boys' State Tournament, P.O. Box 22280, Lexington, KY 40522, will accept mail orders for complete sets of tickets for the tournament.

The prices of tickets per set (8 sessions) for the boys' tournament are as follows: Lower Arena seats, \$44.00; Upper Arena, \$36.00. Each order must include a remittance of \$1.00 for postage and

insurance on the tickets, and your certified check or money order should be made payable to K.H.S. Boys' State Tournament. ### **Basketball**

**BASKETBALL FUNDAMENTALS—INDIVIDUAL TECHNIQUES**, j-s-c-a, 1 1/4 reels, \$2.50.

Branch McCracken, Indiana University basketball coach, used his team to demonstrate the fundamentals of basketball. Slow motion photography is used to break the various court techniques down into easily grasped essentials.

**BASKETBALL KENTUCKY STYLE**, j-s-c-a, 2 reels, \$3.00 (in state), **\$5.00 (out of state)**

This is the revised edition of the film "basketball by Rupp," prepared under the personal direction of Mr. Rupp especially for coaching use.

**BASKETBALL TECHNIQUES FOR GIRLS**, j-s-c-a, 1 reel, \$2.00

Basic movement skills (running, starting, stopping, turning) passing (finger control, movement with the pass, leading the receiver, choice of the right pass), catching (side pass, high

pass), shooting (finger control, arm extension, wrist flip, choice of the right shot), dribbling, taking and pivoting are demonstrated and explained in this film.

**BASKETBALL TODAY**, e-j-s-c-a, 3 reels (33 min.), color, \$1.00

This film differentiates between goal tending and basket interference. Why can't there be goal tending during a free throw? It takes all other questionable situations and simplifies them for the fans, players, coaches and officials in this new film. **RUPP'S PARADE TO THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP OF 1958**, j-s-c-a, 4 reels, \$4.50

This film presents the highlights of all the games, both regular season and tournament games, which led up to the U of K's Wildcats winning the NCAA basketball crown.

**SHOOTING IN BASKETBALL**, j-s-c-a, 1 reel, \$2.00

Concentrating on the set shots, this film pictures the action of the throw, stance, aim, trajectory, and fingertip control. Special attention is given total body coordination, especially inward rotation of the hand and arm making the throw.

**WINNING WAYS**, 16mm (28 min.) color (or black and white)

The film is designed to provide the viewer with a better understanding of the rules and a finer appreciation of basketball played at the interscholastic and intercollegiate level. Through the use of slow motion photography, stop action and instant replay, colorful and informative play situations are demonstrated by both boys' and girls' teams to illustrate the guidelines used by officials in making those tough judgment decisions that constantly occur in basketball.

### **Wrestling**

**WRESTLING OFFICIATING ILLUSTRATED**, j-s-c-a, 2 reels, color \$1.00

Interpretations given in Wrestling Officiating Illustrated have been made by the National Federation members of the Joint Rules Committee. The film covers takedowns, reversals, escapes, leaving the mat, stalling, scoring and illegal holds such as body slam, bar slam, full nelson and chicken wing. Guidelines for officiating and interpreting the rules are provided. In all there are sixty separate scenes of wrestling. This film will provide the much needed guidance and proper interpretations for interscholastic competition.

**WRESTLING TODAY**, 16mm, (17 min.), color

This film displays the starting position on the mat, for the defensive and offensive man and also the referee's position. Also when control is gained, takedown, when control is lost or the escape, when control change is reversed. The near fall and pinning situations from a takedown standpoint, stalling tactics in neutral positions.

This is a brief synopsis of the pertinent areas of rules code illustrated in this color film. The movie was produced by the National Federation of State High School Associations.
