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

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at Barkley Lodge, Cadiz, Kentucky, on Friday, July 19, 1985. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by President Eldon Davidson. Present were all Board Members, Commissioner Tom Mills, Assistant Commissioners Brigid DeVries and Louis Stout. Also present was Julian Tackett, Sports Information Director and Lloyd Redman representing the State Department of Education. The Invocation was given by Bob Rogers.

Frank Welch made the motion, seconded by Chester Turner, that the minutes of the April 19th Board Meeting be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

Chester Turner moved, seconded by David Webb, that the minutes of the Called Meeting of June 14-15, 1985 be approved. The motion carried unanimously.

President Davidson gave a brief report on his attendance at the National Federation Meeting held in Lexington, Kentucky. He stated that visiting states had commented on the Hospitality Room hosted by the K.H.S.A.A. Board of Control and Staff. He also stated that he enjoyed the many good speakers and programs.

David Webb moved, seconded by Tony Olinger, that Patrick Crawford be elected President of the Board for the 1985-86 school year and that Chester Turner be elected Vice President. Mr. Crawford and Mr. Turner were elected by acclimation. Mr. Davidson then turned the meeting over to Mr. Crawford.

President Crawford called on Bowling Green to make their presentation to the Board regarding their bid on the 1987 Girls' State Basketball Tournament. Making presentations were Pam Hereford, representing Western Kentucky University; Horace Shrader, Bowling Green Tourist Commission; Jim Holton, Bowling Green-Warren County Chamber of Commerce: Dee Gibson, Western Kentucky University; and Gerald Borders, Greenwood, Executive Inn.

Following a brief question and answer period, Chester Turner made a motion, seconded by Ray Story, that the 1987 Girls State Basketball Tournament be held in Bowling Green. The motion carried unanimously.

President Crawford then called on representatives of Lexington and Louisville who had requested to appear before the Board to present proposals regarding the 1987 Boys' State Basketball Tournament sites. Following presentations by Lynn Ashton, Account Executive of the Louisville Convention & Visitors Bureau, and Jim Sauer of the Kentucky Fair & Exposition Center, Louisville; and Mayor Scotty Baesler, John Alexander, Tom Minter, Jim Smither, Doug Gibson and Ralph Hacker of Lexington, Chester Turner moved, seconded by Ray Story that the Board of Control go into Executive Session. The motion carried unanimously.

Following a lengthy Executive Session, Chester Turner made the motion, seconded by Tony Olinger, that the Board go back into Open Session.

Chester Turner made the motion the site of the 1987 Boys State Basketball Tournament be in Lexington. Ken Tippett seconded the motion, which carried by a vote of 9 in favor and 1 abstention (Webb). President Crawford thanked the Lexington and Louisville representatives for their interest and presentations.

Following a discussion of the condition of equipment in the K.H.S.A.A. Office, Charlie Wilson moved, seconded by Frank Welch, that the Commissioner be authorized to secure bids and purchase equipment as needed. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Mills then distributed copies of the 1985-86 Working Budget for discussion. Frank Welch made a motion, seconded by Chester Turner, that the Board accept the Close Estimate Working Budget as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Ray Story moved, seconded by Charlie Wilson, that all bills of the Association for the period beginning April 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1985, be allowed. The motion carried unanimously.

The Board adjourned for lunch.

Following a lunch break, President Crawford called on Principal Bill Van Winkle of Owensboro High School who had requested to appear before the Board to appeal the decision of the Commissioner regarding Maurice White, a student who was in violation of By-Law 32, Post-Season and All-Star Games. Basketball Coach Randy Embry also appeared before the Board. Following their presentations and questions by Board members, David Webb made a motion that By-Law 32 be waived in this case and Maurice White's eligibility be restored, but that he be placed on probation for the 1985-86 school year. Ray Story seconded the motion, which carried by a vote of 9 in favor and 1 opposed.

Commissioner Mills distributed a new Foreign Exchange Student Transfer Form he had developed to be used beginning with the 1985-86 school year. He asked for comments by the Board members. Following a discussion of same, Ray Story made a motion that the Foreign Exchange Student Transfer Form be accepted for use as presented. Frank Welch seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Commissioner Mills recommended a new procedure for distribution of basketball tournament tickets to member schools. Ray Story moved, seconded by Frank Welch, that the new procedure be approved on a one-year trial basis. The motion carried unanimously. Commissioner Mills stated that the order forms would be mailed around September 1.

Mr. Mills presented a request received from Principal Prentice Stanford that Monroe County High School (formed through the consolidation of Gamaliel and Tompkinsville High Schools) be permitted to remain in Class A in football through the remainder of the present classification period. Following a discussion of the request, Ray Story moved, seconded by Tom Buchanan that Mr. Stanford's request be denied. The motion carried by a vote of 8-1 with David Webb abstaining.

Assistant Commissioner Stout presented the following

tournament sites to the Board for consideration:

Ray Story made a motion, seconded by Grant Talbott, that the tournament sites be accepted as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Asst. Commissioner DeVries distributed a Track realignment which would be presented to the All-Sports Committee for consideration and approval.

Commissioner Mills presented a letter from Mr. Ernie Denham, Executive Director of the Kentucky Golf Association, requesting that the Board change high school golf season from Spring to Fall. Following a lengthy discussion by the Board and due to the fact that the Board is very concerned about the loss of school time not only for golf but all other sports as well, and the fact that the 1985-86 calendar has been changed to prevent the loss of school time, Frank Welch moved that golf remain a Spring sport at this time. Chester Turner seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Sports Information Director Julian Tackett requested that schools submit suggestions to be included in K.H.S.A.A. publications for High School Activities Week which will be in October. He will be mailing packets regarding same to the high schools in the near future.

It was decided that the Official Board of Control Handbook be voted for acceptance at the next meeting which will be held on October 11, 1985 at the K.H.S.A.A. Office. Any appeals would be heard on Saturday morning, October 12.

There being no further business, Charlie Wilson moved for adjournment. Tony Olinger seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

ANNUAL MEETING FOOTBALL ASSIGNING SECRETARIES

May 13, 1985

The Annual Meeting of the Football Assigning Secretaries for the Kentucky High School Athletic Association was held at the Association Office, 560 East Cooper Drive, Lexington, Kentucky, on May 13, 1985. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Billy V. Wise, Executive Assistant. Those answering roll call were:

Mr. Wise made an announcement that he attended a sectional committee meeting in Columbus, Ohio, for the purpose of discussing reciprocity for officials among the states of Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan and West Virginia. This proposal hopefully will be finalized in January, 1986, and will begin with the 1986-87 school year.

There was a lengthy discussion concerning assigning officials to regular season and bowl games. Some of the problems that the assigning secretaries brought out were (1) not enough personnel in region; (2) lack of security for officials working in certain areas; (3) school officials not cooperating with officials; (4) schools not wanting officials from their home region; (5) some regions not using proper rating system; (6) complaints from officials concerning mileage (rate of .15/mile in areas where they must travel long distances); (7) officials cancelling games at the last minute for various reasons; (8) lack of communication from this office concerning action taken against school officials, such as disciplinary action against a coach for a violation; (9) non-uniformity in using four or five man crews. Ray Canady made a motion, seconded by Joe Russell, that all game assignments, excluding KHSAA play-off games, be made by the Assigning Secretary of the Region/Association in which the designated "home" team belongs. The motion passed 9-0.

Jack Goodman made a motion, seconded by Stan Steidel, that a copy of **all** communication from this office concerning violations by schools, coaches, etc., be sent to

the assigning secretary in that region or association. The motion passed 9-0.

Joe Russell made a motion, seconded by Harold Mischel, that the mileage rate be raised to .20/mile. This would be subject to the Board of Control's approval when they meet in July. Motion passed 9-0.

There was no action taken concerning the evaluation sheet that is now in use. The Secretaries decided that this form was adequate for their needs to evaluate each official properly. The Observer's Report that the Basketball Assigning Secretaries adopted for aiding in their evaluation of their officials was passed out and the Secretaries were asked to look it over, make the necessary changes they felt were necessary in order to adapt it to the evaluation of football officials and make the suggestions at the next meeting. It will also be decided at that time if they wish to use such a form.

There was a lengthy discussion concerning the officials' concern because state play-off officials were chosen mostly from the Lexington, Northern Kentucky and Louisville area. A motion was made by Harold Mischel, seconded by Don Stacy to leave the choice of state play-off officials as is presently done. A committee composed of Joe Russell, Chairman, Don Metzger and Frank Firestine was appointed to evaluate various methods of assigning officials to state play-off games and to bring their report back to the body at the meeting for the 1986-87 season. A decision will be made at that time whether or not there will be a change.

There were short discussions concerning scratch lists by coaches and the number of scratches they are allowed, official's handbook and how it can aid the assigning secretaries and schools, and also the need for 5 man crews to be used at all games. No action was taken on these topics at this time.

Mr. George Mercker, an attorney who is also an official, made a short talk. He reviewed some past and present litigation concerning negligence of officials in the performance of their duties; negligence of supervisors in the training and assigning of officials; and negligence of the officials' association in training of officials.

Additionally, there was discussion and review of the advantages and disadvantages of an unincorporated association versus an incorporated association, current tax laws were again reviewed and the assigning secretaries were reminded that there are criminal statutes concerning athletic contests in Kentucky.


There being no further business or discussion, Layne Tackett made a motion, seconded by Joe Russell that the meeting adjourn. The motion passed 9-0.









VOLLEYBALL COMMITTEE MINUTES

The Volleyball Committee met at the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Office in Lexington, Kentucky, on Wednesday, June 26, 1985. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Brigid L. DeVries, Assistant Commissioner. Committee members present inluded John Bancroft, Bunny Daugherty, Ann Karrick, Margi McKenna, Sally Meng, Joan Mitchell, John Smith and Donna Wolfe.

The first item on the agenda was a discussion of regional tournament and sites. Ms. DeVries advised the Committee of the changes in the teams in regions. Committee members will check in their area and report back so that sites can be determined in the near future.

Following a discussion of the items on the Regional Tournament Information Sheet, a change in the regional tournament format was suggested. John Smith recommended that the format be changed to a double elimination tournament, which carried unanimously. This format would eliminate the need for a tie-breaking procedure on the information sheet.

A discussion followed regarding the site for the 1985 State Volleyball Tournament to be held November 1-2, 1985. Written requests to host the tournament had been received from Fairdale High School and the University of Kentucky. Due to the fact that the University had two courts available for pool play, Ann Karrick recommended that the 1985 State Volleyball Tournament be held at the University of Kentucky. The recommendation carried.

There continues to be a severe shortage of volleyball officials in the state and especially in the Northern Kentucky Region. It was suggested that former volleyball players, physical education majors, etc., be recruited to get involved in officiating. The Committee felt an assigning secretary for volleyball would help in this endeavor.

The clinic dates for 1985 are as follows:

August 20-Louisville-Iroquois High School - 7:30 p.m. August 22-Alexandria-Campbell County High School 7:30 p.m.

August 27-Lexington-Sportsworld - 6:00 p.m.

Mike McDaniel requested that the Committee develop a policy on forfeits. The following procedure will be in effect for the 1985-86 season. A team that is 15 mintues late will forfeit one game. After one-half hour, the match is forfeited upon mutual consent of both coaches and officials, the match can be played as scheduled. If a match has to be scheduled at a later date, the offending school must pay the officials fee for the forfeited match.

Ms. DeVries briefly discussed the National Federation rule changes. Changes to be made in the Constitution and By-Laws under Volleyball Rules and Regulations would be changing the type of tournament from round robin play to double elimination for regional tournaments.

Following a discussion of various miscellaneous items, the meeting was adjourned.

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
