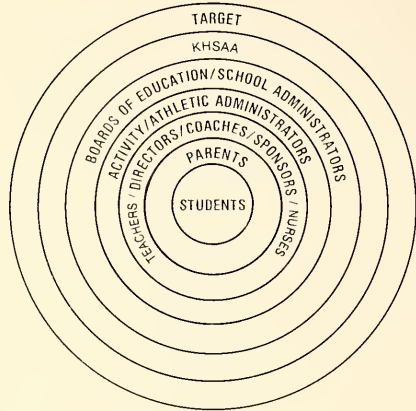

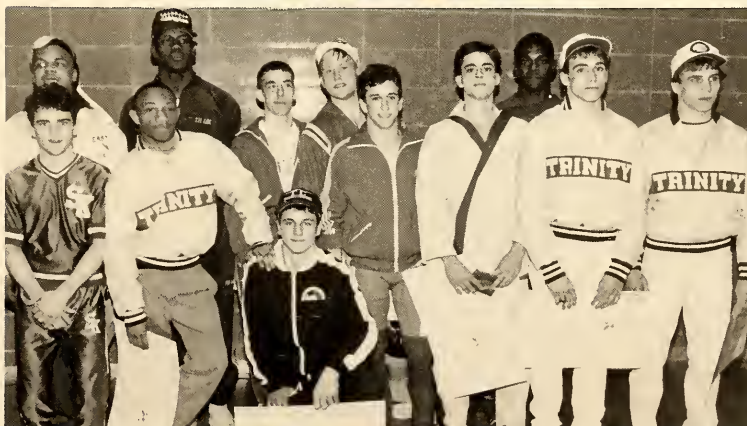

STATE SOCCER COMMITTEE MEETING

January 26, 1990

The State Soccer Committee met in the KHSAA office at 10:00 AM on January 26, 1990. Members present were: Rick Kazee, Jeff Lindon, Steve Son, Roy Wilder, John Hannon, Cy Tucker, Sarah Weaver, Brother Charles Cully. The meeting was chaired by Assistant Commissioner Louis Stout.

Mr. Stout introduced the Committee members to Mr. Jack Wise; Mr. Wise will be representing regions 9-12 as one of the Sectional Directors who will be working with the local associations and the Policy Boards in each of the four regions.

Mr. Stout informed the Committee that the KHSAA will mandate clinic attendance for all coaches and officials beginning with the 1990 soccer season. A working school for officials will be required for all officials by the summer of 1991. Every official must attend the first year; those officials who have attained the rating of certification will be required to attend every two years. The soccer committee has been asked to search for a person(s) that would be qualified to instruct the training school for officials.

The soccer clinic dates for 1990 have been set as follows:

- Aug. 11 - Madisonville-N. Hopkins H.S. 11:00 AM
- Aug. 13 - Louisville Trinity H.S. 7:00 PM
- Aug. 14 - Elizabethtown H.S. 7:00 PM
- Aug. 15 - Covington Holmes H.S. 7:00 PM
- Aug. 16 - Lexington Lafayette H.S. 7:00 PM
- Aug. 17 - Ashland Paul Blazer H.S. 7:00 PM

The clinics will be conducted by Ms. Sara Weaver. She will be assisted by one of our soccer officials. (to be named at later date)

The committee recommended the following fees schedule for soccer officials:

DISTRICT TOURNAMENT - \$25.00/man for 3 man crew; \$35.00/man - 2 man crew.

REGIONAL TOURNAMENT - \$30.00/man for 3 man crew (all regionals will be required to use the 3 man system).

SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT - \$40.00/man for 3 man crew (all sectional tournaments will be required to use the 3 man system). The motion to adopt the above schedule was made by Rick Kazee, seconded by Jeff Lindon, and passed unanimously.

The committee requested that the starting date of July 15, 1990 for soccer be listed in the minutes.

The committee has asked the KHSAA to survey the soccer schools to determine the overtime rules for the regular season. The survey should contain the recommendation of the committee that in case of a tie in the regular season, the teams shall progress directly to penalty kicks. In invitational tournament play during the regular season, the Federation tournament progression rules will be followed. This recommendation in the form of a motion was made by John Hannon, seconded by Jeff Lindon, passed unanimously.

Rules and Regulations: Recommended by the committee for Board of Control consideration:

IV - A "Shall read: The district meetings shall be held no later than the last Sunday prior to the district tournament."

V - "Shall read: A school may enter an unlimited number of players in uniform in the district, regional, or state tournament with reimbursement for only twenty-four (24) players.

In the tournament information that goes out soliciting sites for tournament play, the committee recommended that the sites meet minimum requirements as set by the National Federation.

Cy Tucker shared a letter written by Alex Chater of Atherton High School regarding the limitation of season rule.

Jeff Lindon made a motion, second by Rick Kazee, that the 1990 state finals be held at Woodford County High School. The motion passed unanimously. Brother Cully moved, seconded by Sarah Weaver, that the committee look at Western Kentucky University as a possible site for future state tournaments. The motion passed unanimously.

Meeting adjourned at 2:00 P.M.

IMPORTANT NOTICE CONCERNING DISQUALIFICATIONS

By Board of Control action, all participants and/or coaches who are ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be suspended from competition for a minimum of one game.

It also should be noted that officials who disqualify participants, and then do not report that disqualification to the Association office in a timely manner may face suspension from officiating!!

With this in mind, it is important to adhere to the following procedure should a representative of your school be ejected for unsportsmanlike conduct. 1) Be sure you receive a disqualification card from the contest official; 2) Contact this office in writing to request reinstatement of the participant; 3) Inform the participant/coach of the suspension. You will be notified by return mail as to the end of the suspension, and the date or day when the player/coach will be eligible to return to competition. Contest officials also are reminded to use an ink pen and to press hard as the third copy is often illegible if done in pencil.

NOTE Any person who is suspended from a contest may not dress for that contest in game uniform. They will however be covered by the catastrophic insurance policy insofar as practice is concerned unless you are otherwise notified.

REMINDER TO SCHOOLS CONCERNING LIMITATION OF SEASONS

All schools are reminded of the Limitation of Seasons Rules, K.H.S.A.A. By-Law 27, as it applies to competition after the conclusion of the regular season. ALL SPORTS are affected by this rule, which states that following the teams' last regular season match, there shall be no further practice or play as a team for the remainder of the school year, with the exception of the K.H.S.A.A. tournament. Please be sure your coaches are aware of this important rule, and that they are not involved in coaching the team in an outside league, or other competition. *For the high school coach, be they the Head Coach or an assistant coach, to coach members of the high school team in a league outside of the school's legal regular season competition, regardless of the type of league, would be a violation of the rules governing the Limitation of Seasons.*

1990 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

The business meeting of the Delegate Assembly of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association will be held on Friday, April 20, 1990 at 11:00 a.m. at the K.H.S.A.A. Office Building, 560 East Cooper Drive, Lexington, Kentucky.

As provided in Article IX, Section 1, of the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution, the following proposals for changes in the rules of the Association, to be acted upon at the Annual Meeting, are hereby submitted to all members of the K.H.S.A.A. for their information. No proposals other than these may be considered at the Annual Meeting, except by a two-thirds vote of the delegates.

PROPOSAL I

Principal Tom Swartz, Pikeville High School proposes that the following be added to By-Law 6, Transfer Rule: "Students who are ineligible under the provisions of this rule may not practice until they are ruled eligible by the Commissioner."

PROPOSAL II

Principal Peter Flaig, Trinity High School submits the following proposal for consideration: **PROPOSAL:** To amend By-Law 25, Nos. 1.(5), 2.(5), 3.(5), 4.(5), 5a.(5), 5b.(5), 6.(5), 7.(5), 8.(5), 9.(5), 10.(5), 11.(5), 12.(5). **AMEND** "The season ends at all levels of play (9-12) at the conclusion of the varsity team's last regular season contest..." **TO READ:** "The season ends at all levels of play (9-12) ON THE SATURDAY PRECEDING THE FIRST K.H.S.A.A. TOURNAMENT (District, Region, or State). **PURPOSE:** To establish a uniform end of season for all levels for all schools, not dependent on an arbitrary varsity scheduling date. As the By-Law now stands, if the last Varsity game is on a Tuesday, although a game could have been scheduled on the following Saturday, the Freshman and Junior Varsity teams are not permitted to play after that last Varsity game. This amendment would allow the non-varsity teams to play up to the last date a Varsity game COULD BE SCHEDULED.

PROPOSAL III

Principal George Johns, Dayton High School proposes that the following changes be made in the Constitution of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association. **ARTICLE IV: ADMINISTRATION AND LEGISLATION - Section 1. Officers** (Be changed to read:) "The officers of the Association shall be a Commissioner and a Board of Control composed of twenty-two (22) members, at least four (4) of whom shall be black and two (2) of whom shall be female.

B. BOARD OF CONTROL

1. Members of the Board of Control shall be elected for a period of four (4) years by a vote of the representatives of member schools in each region.
2. There shall be one (1) member from each of the sixteen (16) Basketball Regions.
3. In addition there shall be four (4) blacks and two (2) females elected (Federal Court Decree), two (2) blacks shall be elected to represent Regions 1 through 8 and two (2) blacks shall be elected to represent Regions 9 through 16.
4. All Board of Control members shall be full-time certified employees of their respective Boards of Education.
5. Notifications to the Representatives of each school in each REGION, in which the member is to be elected, must be made by the Commissioner not later than January 1.
6. To be eligible for membership to the Board of Control, one must be a certified employee of an accredited K.H.S.A.A.

member school or system in the region he / she is to represent and must remain in that region during his / her term of office. Serving in a part-time capacity or on leave of absence or on sick leave in any of these capacities will terminate the eligibility of the member and the remaining members of the Board shall fill the vacancy within sixty (60) days in the same manner as that prescribed for the regular election of the Board Members.

7. Nominations for membership on the Board of Control, signed by five (5) representatives, of their REGION, shall be in the hands of the Commissioner, for REGIONS that elect during the year, not later than midnight January 31.

8. Ballots for election shall be distributed by the Commissioner before February 15, and returned on or before March 1.

9. Results of the election be tabulated by the Commissioner, announced at the meeting of the Delegate Assembly, and published in the May issue of the *Athlete*.

10. Terms of Board Members shall be staggered so that five (5) or six (6) will be elected each year.

11. At the Organization Meeting in July, the members of the Board of Control shall elect from their membership a President and Vice-President to serve for one (1) year. They shall not be eligible to serve for more than two (2) one-year terms in succession. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall designate a liaison person to meet with the Board of Control but to have no vote as a member of the Board of Control.

* Note: At the direction of the Board of Control, the Commissioner has sought and obtained a legal opinion from counsel for the K.H.S.A.A. that the proposed increase would be in violation of the Federal Court decree which establishes minority representation.

PROPOSAL IV

Principal Waymond Morris, Daviess County High School, proposed that the following sentence be added to Article IX, Section 3, Referendum at the end of paragraph.

"All votes received in a referendum shall be opened and counted at the same meeting."

PROPOSAL V

The K.H.S.A.A. Board of Control proposes that By-Law 25, Section 11.(3). Limitation of Seasons - Volleyball, be changed to read as follows: "The first match shall not take place prior to the fourth (4th) Monday in August."

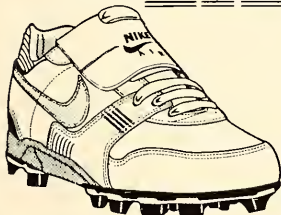
