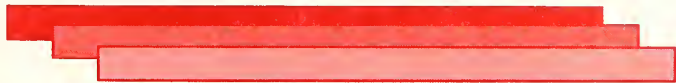

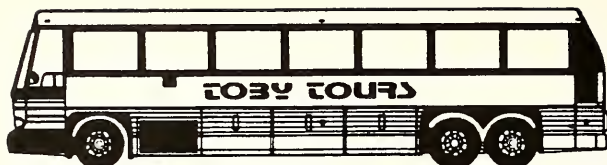

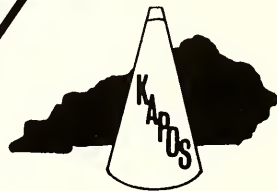

STATE TOURNAMENT  
INFORMATION**

Participating cheerleader and cheerleading coaches registration: all cheerleading squads and/or coaches are asked to stop by the KAPOS table to:

- 1) Register your squad.
- 2) Pick up important information and materials for you and your school.

Along with a KAPOS board member, there will be high school cheerleaders on hand to assist you. They can be identified by their hostess armbands. Feel free to ask them for help, and in turn they may seek you and your cheerleaders to be interviewed by one of the radio commentators. In order to make their task easier, we are asking that you register your seat, row and section number. A possible radio interview is often missed because the guides could not locate the desired person in time for the interview.

Hospitality Room: May we remind all cheerleading coaches and cheerleaders. We cordially invite you to have refreshments, socialize with friends, exchange ideas and perhaps get help with your problems.

"Sweet 16 Cheerleading Squads: ATTENTION PRINCIPALS! If your team will be participating in the State Tournament, included in the packet sent to you by the KHSAA will be a letter pertaining to your cheerleading squad. Be sure to look for this and relay all information to your cheerleading coach. We request that you cheerleaders be chaperoned by a well qualified, school approved adult. Verification of this, along with your cheerleading coach's name, must be contained in the letter of confirmation which you will receive. This letter must be in the hands of the KAPOS officer prior to the time that your cheerleaders take the floor.

**IMPORTANT!** Please be sure that your school is a paid member of KAPOS or pays the fee before their first game in order for your squad to compete for the cheerleading awards in the State Tournament. The winners of these will be determined by use of the KAPOS Judging Sheet, a copy of which appears in the KAPOS Handbook.

**AWARDING OF TROPHIES**

KAPOS is pleased to honor outstanding cheerleading squads with the recognition they so well deserve. All cheerleader awards will be presented between games on Friday night of the State Tournament. The awards are as follows:

The winning cheerleader squad in the Boys' Sweet Sixteen will receive the Ted Sanford Trophy; in the Girls' Sweet Sixteen the Tom Mills Award. The runner-up cheerleading squad will receive a trophy, with the third and fourth place squads being awarded plaques. In addition, the special K-Pep Award will be presented. All tournament cheerleading squads and their coaches are asked to be located close to the playing floor so they can easily come on the floor should they be called for an award.

**GOVERNOR JONES  
DECLARES GOOD  
SPORTSMANSHIP MONTH**

While every month should be Good Sportsmanship Month, KAPOS has always tried to put special emphasis on being a good sport at tournament time. Being a good sport is part of being a good citizen. We don't believe that good citizens need to be reminded to exemplify good sportsmanship. However, it is especially fitting at tournament time to remind all citizens that it is a privilege to be able to attend the games and that each individual can contribute to the success of the tournament if he will abide by the KAPOS Sportsmanship Creed proclaimed by Governor Jones. The Governor's proclamation is on display at the KAPOS table.

Recognition is annually given to cheerleading squads other than those sixteen fortunate enough to participate with their teams in the State Tournament. The winner will receive the Jane Meyer trophy, while the runner-up will receive the the KAPOs President's Trophy. Plaques will be given to the third and fourth place squads.

Beginning at the district level, all squads that are KAPOs members are eligible to be judged for the honor of representing their district in the KAPOs Region-at-Large cheerleading competition. The winner and runner-up of each district will progress to the region. In turn the girls' varsity winner and runner-up and the boys' winner and runner-up from each region is allowed to compete for the title of State-At-Large Cheerleading Champions.

Judging for the Boys' State-At-Large winners will take place at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 28 in Shepherdsville at Bullitt Central High School.

Judging for the Girls' State-At-Large winners will take place at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 21 in Lexington at Memorial Coliseum. The public is invited to these outstanding events. The admission charge of \$4.00 will go toward the expenses of KAPOs scholarship award, details of which are supplied below.

At the conclusion of the judging, trophies will be awarded to the top squads, in addition to several special awards.

**NOTES TO ALL ADMINISTRATORS**

Many of you have responded to our SOS in releasing teaching personnel to assist with the many tasks necessary to keep this organization functioning effectively.

Again, we need judges and personnel help at the tournament. This involves at least 12 to 15 people. It is also backbreaking, tiresome work. However, we have many dedicated persons who have indicated a willingness to help share these duties provided they get a release from their administrators. Therefore, the KAPOs board is seeking your understanding and cooperation should you be asked to release a teacher from his or her duties to help carry on the work that KAPOs is doing to make cheerleading a worthwhile educational experience in the State of Kentucky.

**STELLA S. GILB SCHOLARSHIP**

KAPOS is happy to annually award the Stella S. Gilb Scholarship to outstanding cheerleaders from Kentucky. In 1991, KAPOs awarded 10 \$500 scholarships to well-deserving cheerleaders. One of your cheerleaders may be a potential scholarship winner, so get your applications in early. Applications must be turned in no later than April 30. Contact a KAPOs board member or officer for application forms, or pick them up at the State Tournament KAPOs Table.

**KAPOS SERVICES**

- \* Maintains an affiliation with the KHSAA in order that we may help them and they may assist us in any way possible to promote good sportsmanship in the state of Kentucky.

- \* Maintains continual communication with cheerleading coaches in the state to ascertain their needs, problems, suggestions and criticism.

- \* Publishes The Handbook of the Kentucky Association of Pep Sponsors.

- \* Holds judging clinics to promote better understanding between cheerleading coaches and judges, and to encourage consistency in interpretation of KAPOs rules and recommendations.

- \* Sponsors awards to outstanding cheerleading squads at the district, regional and state levels.

- \* Sponsors the judging of outstanding cheerleading squads at the State Tournament for the "Sweet 16" Competition.

- \* Sponsors Sportsmanship Month during the month of March.

- \* Hosts the KAPOs table and the KAPOs Hospitality Room at the State Tournament both Boys' and Girls'.

- \* Sponsors the Stella S. Gilb Scholarship, an educational scholarship awarded each year to outstanding and deserving cheerleaders in Kentucky.

- \* Presents Cheerleading Coach of the Year Award" for both Girls' and Boys' Coaches.

- \* Presents the "Pat Dooley K-Pep Award" in each region and state tournament.

- \* Members serve as instructors and judges as requested by the various groups (KHSAA, YMCA, NCA, schools, etc.)

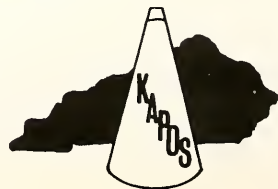
- \* Sponsors the Kentucky Cheerleading Coaches Conference annually during July or August in Lexington.

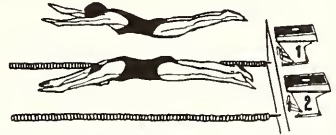
- \* Sponsors a Medical Symposium designed for cheerleading coaches.

**MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS**

Membership in KAPOs is open to all schools who are affiliated with a school system in Kentucky. Dues are \$2.00 per varsity cheerleader plus \$2.00 for the coach, and entitle the school to membership in the organization for the fiscal year from July 1 through June 30.

Dues should be paid to the treasurer of KAPOs by December 15. A membership card will then be returned to you. A KAPOs handbook is mailed to all high school principals at the beginning of each school year.

The events for the State Swimming Meets will be the same as those listed in the K.H.S.A.A. Constitution and By-Laws. Swimming Regulation, on page 57. **NOTE:** There will be a cutoff time for the 500 Freestyle for the regional meets. Boys - 6 minutes, 30 seconds; Girls - 7 minutes.

# MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER BOARD MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the Executive Inn, Louisville, Kentucky on Thursday, December 5, 1991. The meeting was called to order by President Alvis Johnson at 1:00 p.m. with all Board members present. Also present were Commissioner Billy Wise, Assistant Commissioner Larry Boucher and Business Manager Julian Tackett. The invocation was given by Ray Story.

Stan Steidel made a motion that the Agenda be amended to move the Committee Meetings to Friday at 8:00 a.m. Jack Portwood seconded the motion. Ray Story moved to table the motion, seconded by Marvin Moore. The motion to table passed unanimously.

Claudia Hicks made a motion, seconded by Harry Jansing, that the minutes of the October 12, 1991 meeting of the Board be approved. Gene Brooks called for the following correction: "In the event the school plays an out-of-state school (in a Hall of Fame Basketball Contest), the payment shall be \$150." The motion passed unanimously with the minutes being corrected as requested.

Roland Williams made a motion that the minutes of the November 6, 1991 meeting be approved. Gene Brooks seconded the motion which passed. Eddie Saylor moved to approve the minutes of the November 22nd East Eligibility Committee Meeting. Stan Steidel seconded the motion which passed.

Following a discussion of the October 1 through November 30 bills, Ray Story made a motion to accept. Harry Jansing seconded the motion which passed.

President Johnson then called on Marvin Moore, Chairman of the Basketball Committee for their report. Mr. Moore discussed the following items:

a) Request that Casey County be moved from the 48th to the 45th District. The Commissioner was requested to notify all schools in the 45th & 48th Districts and invite them to attend the January meeting for discussion.

b) Assignment of Officials for the District & Regional Tournaments. Upon the recommendation of the committee, officials will stay within their district for district tournaments and go out of the region for the regional tournaments. Eddie Saylor made a motion to approve the recommendation. Stan Steidel seconded the motion which passed.

The following Basketball Tournament Report was given:

- Girls ticket sales through this date: \$21,250.00

It was reported that the boys ticket sales were ahead of last year and the girls ticket sales were slightly below sales at this same period last year.

President Johnson then asked for the All-Sports Committee report. Sandy Allen, Chairperson, made the following recommendations to the Board:

a) Request from Owensboro Catholic H.S. that Henderson County be moved out of the present soccer district. The committee recommended that the request be denied and that the district alignment remain the same in Regions 1 & II.

b) Request from Owen County to move Walton Verona from District #32 to District #33 in baseball. Stan Steidel moved to table this request. Frank Cardwell seconded the motion which passed.

Following is the Football Committee's report by Chairman Ray Story.

a) Recommend that no action be taken on moving Lexington Catholic to another District.

b) Allow Eminence to design a plan for the Class A schools and present it to the Board at its January meeting. Sandy Allen moved to approve the Football Committee's recommendations. Frank Cardwell seconded the motion which passed 11-1.

The Board next discussed the K.H.S.A.A. sports committees and how they are structured. Asst. Commissioners Boucher, DeVries and Stout informed the Board how the members of each committee were chosen. President Johnson appointed Stan Steidel and Claudia Hicks to serve on a committee to work with Larry Boucher, Brigid DeVries and Louis Stout for the purpose of setting up a structure for sports committees.

Commissioner Wise then discussed with Board members proposals submitted by member schools which are to be considered by the 1992 Delegate Assembly. Topics included in the proposals are: a) Board members shall be principals; b) Board members shall hold a valid teaching certificate; and c) Change in By-Law 8 and By-Law 25.

Roland Williams moved to go into Executive Session. Stan Steidel seconded the motion which passed. Following a closed session, Gene Brooks moved to return to Open Session, seconded by Roland Williams. Motion passed.

Commissioner Wise advised the Board of the status of the new K.H.S.A.A. Office and Hall of Fame Building. Stan Steidel made a motion giving the Commissioner the authority to write a letter to KET giving them until December 12 to respond to a proposal to purchase the present facilities. If no bid is forthcoming at that time, the K.H.S.A.A. will assume they are not interested in purchasing the property. Frank Cardwell seconded the motion which passed.

The next meeting of the Board will be held in Louisville at the Executive Inn during the Louisville Invitational Tournament. Committee meetings will be held on Thursday, January 16, and the regular meeting will be held at 8:30 a.m. on Friday, January 17.

There being no further business, Roland Williams made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. Jack Portwood seconded the motion which passed.

## MINUTES OF SPECIAL CALLED MEETING

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met in a Special Called Meeting on Monday, December 23, 1991, at the K.H.S.A.A. Office in Lexington, Kentucky. The meeting was called to order by President Alvis Johnson at 9:00 a.m. with all Board members present except Gene Brooks and Harry Jansing. Commissioner Billy Wise and Business Manager Julian Tackett were also present. The invocation was given by Julian Tackett.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the following items: Member Schools Dues, Regional Basketball Sites and the sale of the K.H.S.A.A. headquarters on Cooper Drive.

Commissioner Wise discussed the possibility of obtaining sponsorships for the Boys and Girls Basketball Tournaments, gave a status report on the new building including a move in date around the first of February, and the Association's need to recognize an additional \$300,000. in receipts beginning with the 1992-93 fiscal year.

A lengthy discussion ensued regarding avenues to raise the needed revenue. Regarding the option of restructuring the member schools dues, Frank Cardwell made a motion that a new fee schedule be implemented for the 1992-93 school year and leave the billing procedure open. Claudia Hicks seconded the motion. Roland Williams moved to table the vote until the January meeting giving Board members an opportunity to discuss the matter within their regions and get feedback. Ray Story seconded the motion. The motion to table passed by a 5-4 vote. Following further discussion, Frank Cardwell made a motion to send the Board's recommended procedure for raising additional funds--that being to increase Membership Dues and provide multiple payments for such--to member schools and advise them that the plan will be implemented at the January meeting of the Board. Schools may call their respective Board member with input and recommend an alternate plan. Eddie Saylor seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 6-2 with 2 abstentions.

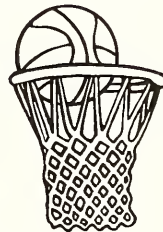
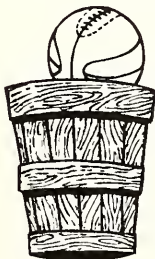

## ENCROACHMENT PROCEDURES AMONG HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL RULES CHANGES

Beginning with the 1992 high school football season, encroachment restrictions will begin when the center places his hands on the football rather than when the center makes the final adjustment of the ball.

This was one of seven rules changes approved by the National Federation Football Rules Committee at its January 6-8 meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Dick Schindler, assistant director of the National Federation and editor of the high school football rules, said although the encroachment procedure probably ranked as the most important rules change, the committee did not make any huge changes.

"We are extremely satisfied with the game of high school football as it is today, and that is reflected with only seven rules changes," Schindler said. "The committee is concerned with illegal contact and sportsmanship, and it addressed those concerns in the Points of Emphasis."

With encroachment restrictions previously beginning when the center made the final adjustment of the ball, Schindler said problems had surfaced in determining when the final adjustment occurred. Henceforth, centers will not be able to take their hands off the ball after placing them on the ball.

In a related change, the committee voted to prohibit linemen between the two ends from moving off the line after having placed their hands near the ground. This would be a false start.

Schindler said teams no longer will be able to re-huddle to change signals. "As a result of these changes, I think teams will send their linemen to the line of scrimmage before the center puts his hands on the ball."

The committee also addressed running the "fumblerooskie" or "guard around" made famous a number of years ago by the University of Nebraska. The rules group said teams may not play similar to the fumblerooskie, i.e., a planned loose ball, without first informing the referee prior to the play.

"this change was made so that officials will be prepared to properly call such a play," Schindler said. "If officials have no foreknowledge of the play, they would not be able to identify a planned loose ball."

In another rules change, if a player on the offensive or kicking team goes out of bounds prior to change of possession and returns, it becomes a foul at the time of his return. The illegal participation foul would be a 15-yard penalty.

Schindler noted, however, that if the player is pushed out of bounds and returns at the first opportunity, it would be a legal play. He said the intent of the change is to penalize players who intentionally go out of bounds to gain an advantage.

Another option was given to the receiving team on a kickoff when the ball is kicked out of bounds. In addition to the options of a five-yard penalty and re-kick, or putting the ball in play at the in-bounds spot, teams also will have the choice of putting the ball in play 15 yards behind the receiving team's free-kick line, which would be the 35-yard line in most cases.

In a safety move, which is the No. 1 priority of all National Federation rules committees, the Football Rules Committee mandated that rib pads and back protectors, if worn, must be covered by a jersey. Schindler said exposed pads could cause injury.

The final change approved by the rules committee involves the official end of a period. Henceforth, when a period officially ends, any obvious errors in timing no longer may be corrected.

"the rules committee continued its strong stance towards safety and against illegal contact," Schindler said. "Other points of emphasis were pass interference and identifying eligible receivers."

In its continuing emphasis on sportsmanship, the committee passed a resolution recommending that the National Federation Sportsmanship, Ethics and Integrity Committee study the possibility of state associations adopting specific penalties for unsportsmanlike conduct. The Football Rules Committee recommended that such policy for unsportsmanlike conduct cover all activity programs, not just football.

Eligibility for the KHSAA Hall of Fame is based on high school accomplishments and contributions only. Any player who has been out of high school eight years or any coach, administrator or official with 20-plus years of service is eligible.

### **Nominations**

Anyone can nominate a person for the Hall of Fame. Nomination deadline this year is March 15. Starting in 1992, the nomination deadline will annually be February 1. An official KHSAA Hall of Fame nomination form must be completed for each nominee. Additional information can also be submitted with the nomination form.

### **Selection**

Fifteen people will be inducted into the Hall of Fame each year. A selection committee will meet the third Friday of April in Lexington to pick the inductees.

Provided there are enough nominations to meet the criteria, a minimum of two women, two minority and one each from Regions 1-4, 5-8, 9-12 and 13-16 will be among the 15 inductees.

All information on this form must be completed and received by the Kentucky High School Athletic Association before March 15. The completed nomination form and support materials should be sent to 2280 Executive Drive, Lexington, KY 40505. Once the nomination form is received by the KHSAA, all actions necessary to the selection process shall remain confidential. All information submitted shall be retained by the Hall of Fame.

Please include a limited number of newspaper clippings, magazine articles and other supportive materials that would be helpful to the Hall of Fame Screening Committee.

Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and moral character.

Athletes would be former student participants who are being nominated for their achievements in interscholastic athletics. Coaches would be considered on the merits of their high school coaching achievements only and officials on the basis of their service as a high school official.

**ALL CANDIDATES WILL BE JUDGED ON THEIR SIGNIFICANT AND/OR LONG-TERM CONTRIBUTIONS TO INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS.**

Accomplishments at the college or professional will not be considered by the selection committee.

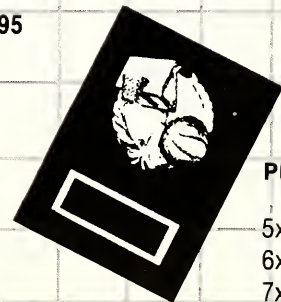

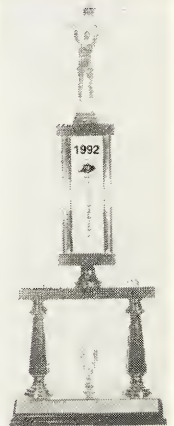
