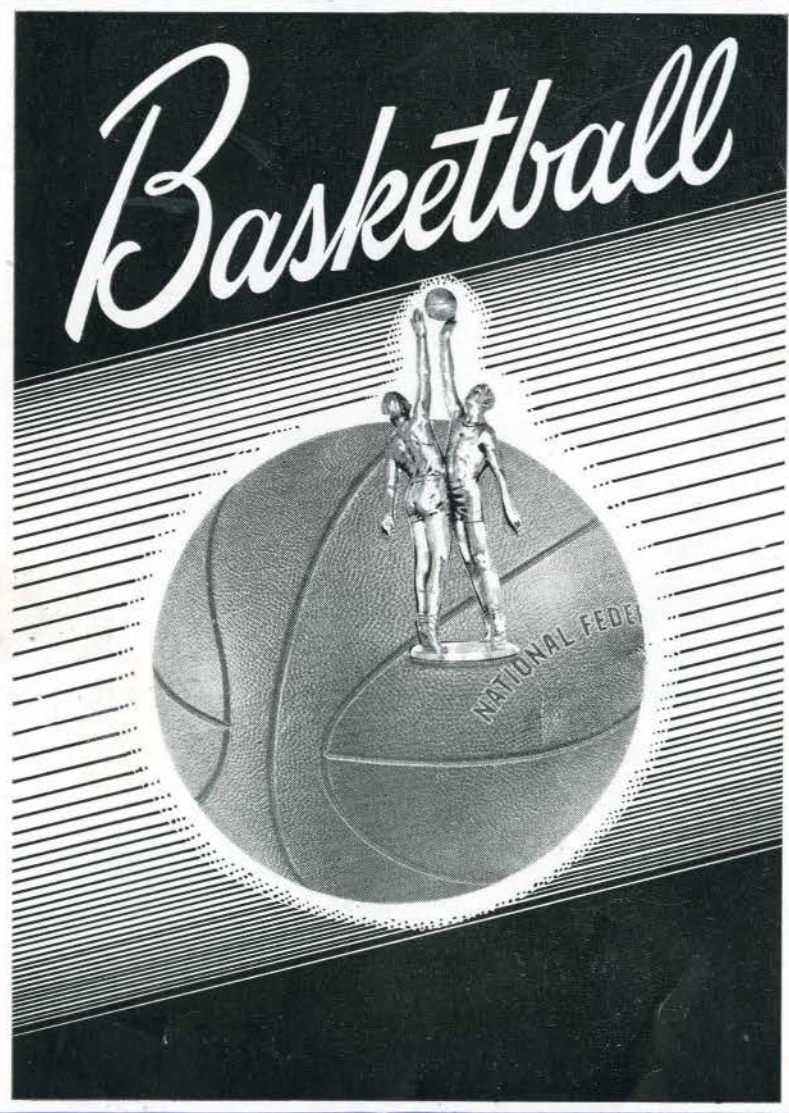

Herndon Chosen Coach of Year

Frankfort Mentor Brought Panthers 'Won-Lost' Championship

A man who has had only one losing season in the eight years he has been in the profession has been chosen as the "Coach of the Year" for The Courier-Journal's annual award by coaches, officials and sports writers from all over Kentucky.

He is Raymond "Red" Herndon, who directed the Frankfort High School Panthers to a season of ten victories, no loss and one tie and the "Won-Lost" championship of the Commonwealth's 83 football teams.

In 1938, he inaugurated an athletic program at Cumberland. While he was teaching, he was doing work at Eastern Kentucky Teachers College and was graduated in 1937.

At Cumberland his record was 25 victories, 16 losses and three ties and at Frankfort in three years it has been 17-8-2, for a total coaching record of 42-24-5, or a percentage .633.

BEST RATING

Frank Camp of Henderson, whose team finished the Western Kentucky Conference season with the best Dickinson System rating, but could not win the Championship because it was beaten by undefeated Owensboro, ran a close second to Herndon in the balloting for the honor.

Others who were nominated for the honor were Bob Eison of Georgetown, Paul Jenkins of Male, Dave Evans of Covington, Tiny Jones of Dayton, James "Peanuts" Johnson of Owensboro, whose team was the only undefeated-untied team in the state, Lloyd Patterson of Pineville, Roy Holbrook of Catlettsburg, William McClure of Ludlow, Fayne Grone of Newport and Vernon Tucker of Mt. Sterling.
