Ruby's Basketball Argument Settlers

(From Ruby's Record Book)
By EARL RUBY, Sports Editor, Courier-Journal

Basketball is the only major sport of our own origin played in the United States today. All other games are direct importations or are adaptations . . . The first real game was contested on January 20, 1892.

In fifty years basketball has grown in popularity so fast that it now out-draws all other school and spectator sports (with the doubtful exception of softball) by many thousands. . . . Softball is rated first, unofficially, with something like 140,000,000 admissions per year. Basketball is next with about 110,000,000. . . . Then follow baseball and football.

Basketball's Hall of Fame for coaches sponsored by the Helms Foundation includes **Adolph Rupp**, coach of the U. K. Wildcats, **Henry P. Iba**, **Howard Cann**, **Dr. W. E. Meanwell**, **George E. Keegan**, **Nat Holman**, **Osborne Cowles**, **Justin Barry**, **Dr. Forrest C. Allen**, **Clair Bee**, **Clarence Edmundson**, **Ward Lambert**, and **Lon Walter Jourdet**. . . . The Players-Hall of Fame includes **Vic Hansen**, **Charles Hyatt**, **John Schonmer**, **George Mikán**, **Edward McNichel**, **Paul Endacott**, **Ashworth Thompson**, **Angele Luisetti**, **George Glamack**, **Harland Page**, **John Wooden** and **Robert Kurland**.

Player of the year in '46 was **Bob Kurland** of Oklahoma A. and M. . . . In 1944 and '45 it was **DePaul's George Mikán**. . . . **Purdue's John Wooden** took this award in 1932, **Kentucky's Leroy Edwards** in '35. . . . **Notre Dame's John Moir** was so honored in 1936.

Oklahoma A. and M. ranked No. 1 in America last year, as it did in 1944-45, winning 31 games and losing 2. Coach **Henry Iba's** outfit won the N. C. A. A. Championship as it did in 1944-45. . . . **Bob Kurland**, in sparking the season, totaled 643 points in 33. . . . **Kentucky** was rated No. 1 by Helm in 1933. . . . **Purdue** merited top placement in 1932, **Notre Dame** in 1936. . . . Last season **North Carolina** was No. 2 and **U. K.** No. 3.

N. C. A. A. tournament champions have been: 1939-Oregon, 1940-Indiana, 1941-Wisconsin, 1942-Stanford, 1943-Wyoming, 1944-Utah, 1945 and 1946 Oklahoma Aggies.

National Intercollegiate champions—1938-Warrensburg, Mo., 1939-Southwestern, 1940-Tarkio, Mo., 1941-San Diego State, 1942-Hamline, 1943-Cape Girardeau, 1944-(no tournament), 1945-Loyola of New Orleans, 1946-Southern Illinois Normal.

National Invitational champions—Temple, 1939-Long Island, 1940-Colorado, 1941-Long Island, 1942-West Virginia, 1943-St. John's, 1944-St. John's, 1945-DePaul, 1946-Kentucky.

Kentucky has won the Southeastern championship 8 times. Tennessee 3 times and Georgia Tech and Alabama once each.

The K. I. A. C. title has gone to Western 11 times, to Georgetown, Louisville and Berea twice, and to Murray and Eastern (defending champion) once each.

Jack Parkinson was high scorer for U. K. last year with 339 points. **Wah Wah Jones** was next with 290 and **Ralph Beard** third with 279, one point ahead of **Jack Tingle**. . . . The Wildacts totaled 1,821 points, an average of 61 2/3 a game, to opponents' 40.

Ashland and Lexington have participated in more Kentucky high school championships than any other schools. Each has been in 13. . . . Lexington has won the tournament five times and Ashland three. . . . **St. Xavier** and **Hazard** have played in 11 each, and **Danville** in 10. . . . **Louisville Manual**, **Owensboro** and **Central City** in nine each, **Manual** is second to Lexington in tournaments won with four.

The highest single game total by any player in the high school tournament is 28, scored by **Frank Fraley** of Breckenridge against Dawson Springs last year.

The highest single game total for a team is 68 scored by Breckenridge against Dawson Springs last year.

Second highest team total on record is 64, scored by Louisville Manual against Ogden College in 1923 tournament. . . . Somerset tallied 63 against Covington in 1918.

Widest margin of all time in the annual school boy tourney is 50 points (54 to 4) tabbed by Lexington over Columbia in 1922. . . . Second widest, 49, (63-14) by Somerset over Covington in 1918.

The lowest winning total is 13, tallied by Ashland over Carr Creek in 1928, and by Ashland over Hazel Green in 1934.

The highest losing total in a championship game is 42, scored by Central City against Male High in 1945.

The lowest losing total in a championship game is 7 scored by Frankfort against Lexington's 55 in 1922 tournament finale.

The shortest winning margin in a championship contest is one point, scored by Lexington over Somerset (16-15) in 1918.

The longest game—four overtimes by Ashland and Carr Creek in 1928 title game.

Veterans' Eligibility

The secretary continues to get numerous letters from member schools of the association concerning the eligibility of returning veterans. All such inquiries should be addressed to President Bridges. By-Law XXXIV states that "The President of the K. H. S. A. A. shall have the authority to waive the 'twenty day' and the 'preceding semester' rules in establishing the eligibility of any boy discharged from military service, provided that such boy shall enter school not later than twenty days after the beginning of the semester immediately following the date of his discharge from the service." In each case, the principal should state the name of the boy, his birth date, the semester he was in at the time he left for service, the number of subjects in which he was passing, the date he left school, the date he entered the service, the date he returned from service, and the date he re-entered school. Each case much be ruled on individually and no veteran should be allowed to play until he has been declared eligible by the president unless the boy is under twenty-one and has already been in school for one semester since returning from the service. No veteran can be declared eligible after he has reached his twenty-first birthday, according to By-Law II.

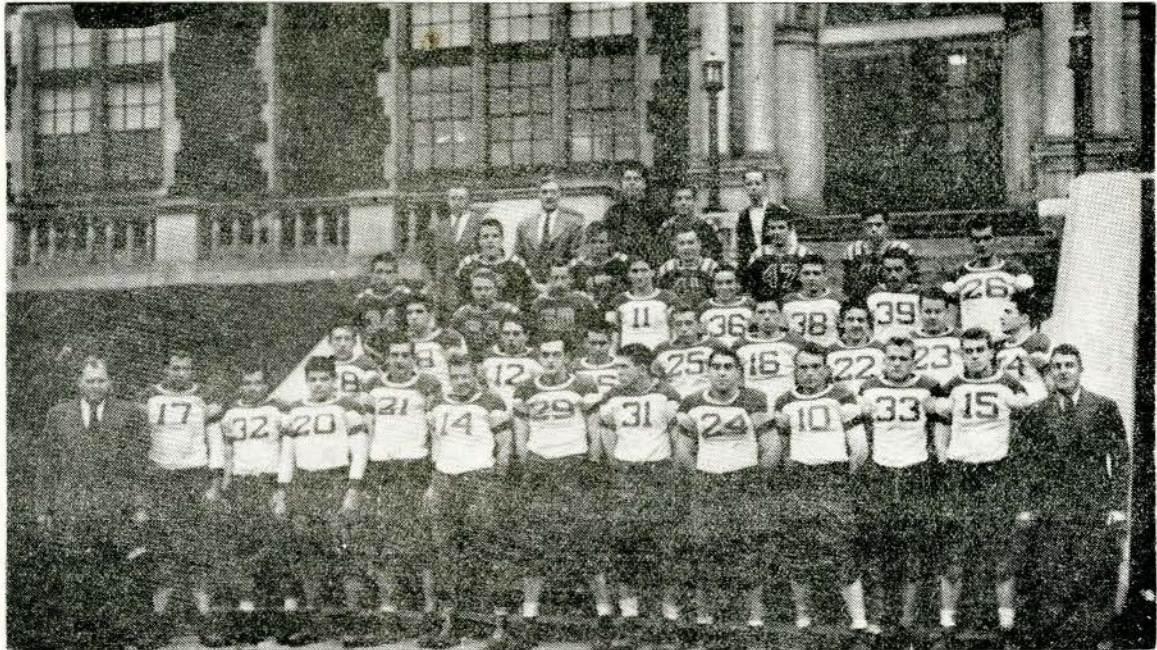
You see what I mean, Herb and Dillard, that sausage and those pumpkins could revolutionize our entire system of payment of officials.

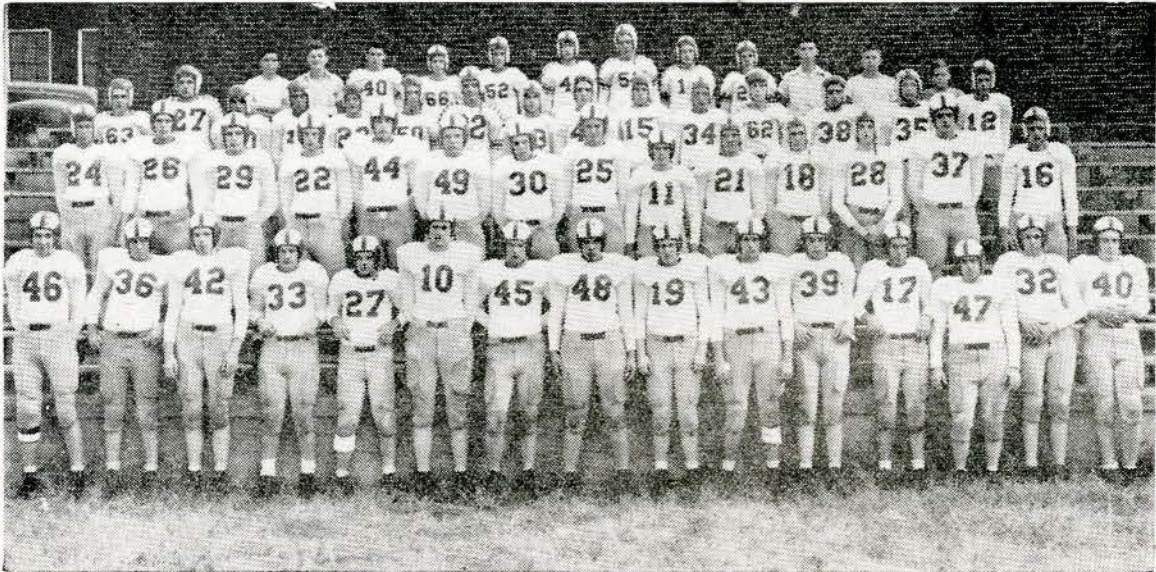

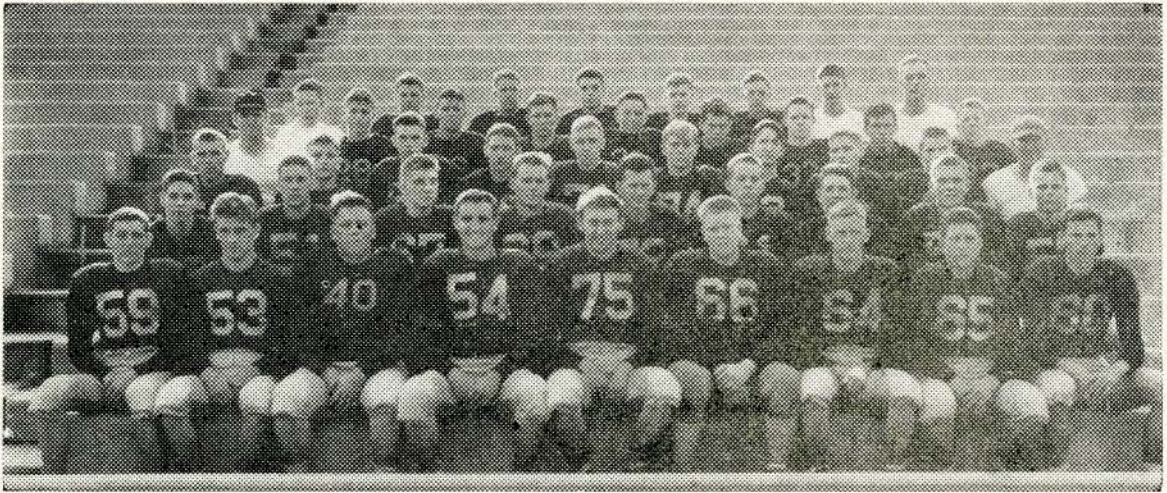

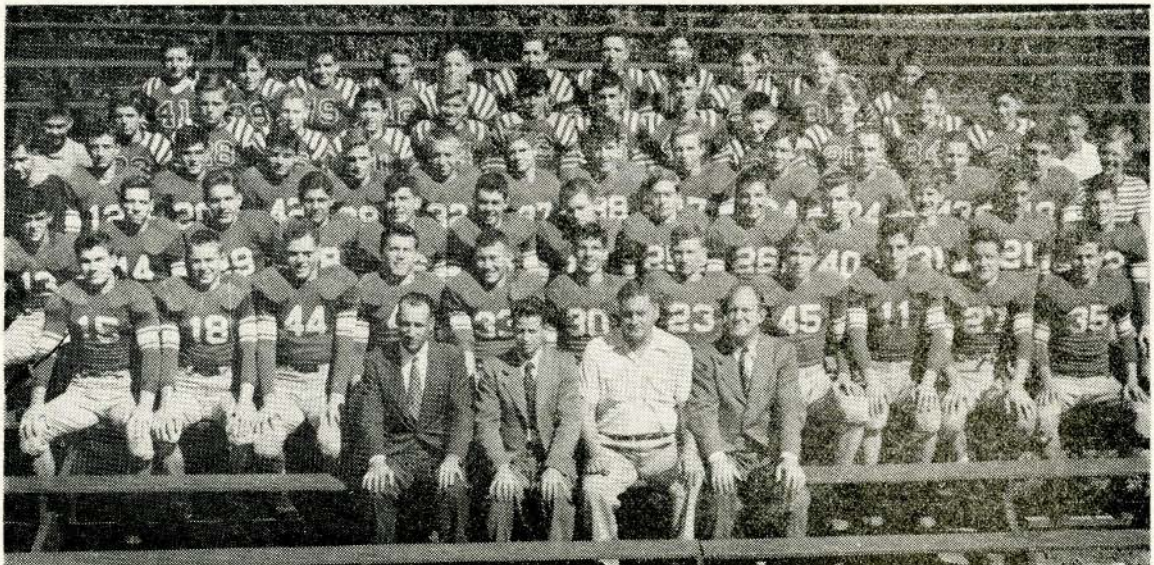

Girls In Athletics?

Jefferson County Is Providing Swimming, Softball, Track, Hockey

The luckiest girls in Kentucky, athletically, live in Jefferson County, outside the limits of Louisville . . . **Charley Vettiner**, director of recreation in the County doesn't subscribe to the theory that Sister is to be seen and not heard . . . "The girls have been demanding a part in the recreation program ever since I've been connected with the



County," he said. "We listened, but weren't convinced that they meant what they said. We tried them out with swimming. They went for it in a great big way. Then we tried softball, and they took such an interest that we've been making plans to expand more than ever next spring. Then came track and field events. The girls did so well in track that when we went to Cleveland for the National Junior Olympics, 17 of our 36 representatives were girls—and the young ladies scored most of our points! So now we're taking up hockey."

Anchorage and Okolona High girls opened the hockey season for the county at Seneca and fought to a 2-2 deadlock . . . It was a whale of a game, with **Miss Mary Swenck** (who went to Cleveland with the track team) scoring both goals for Okolona, and **Misses Mary Dan McClaskey** and **Martha Routh** tabbing for Anchorage.

" . . . We've got five girls' teams so far," Mr. Vettiner continued, "and we expect several more to come in pretty soon. Anchorage, Okolona, Jeffersontown and Valley are represented by high school teams. The fifth outfit carries the Cane Run Grade School banner. A community team is in process of organization in St. Matthews."

The program is directed by **Oakley Brown**, Charley's assistant, who formerly coached at St. Xavier High . . . With the help of the high school principals, **Coach Mudge Charmoli** of Valley, **Zera DuVall** of Anchorage, and **Mary Morgan** of Okolona, he drew up a tentative schedule and got play under way.

After watching the opener yesterday he was convinced more than ever that the girls want athletics, and that they prefer to compete without special girls' rules . . . He did
