



1948-1949 Basketball Rulings

During the early part of the season, the usual number of requests for rulings on disputed points have been received. Here are a few that contain interesting factors.

PLAY: A6 enters to replace A2. He informs teammates of several changes in player position. Should Official hold up game to permit him to give these instructions?

RULING: Official should allow reasonable time for such information and, if this can be given within thirty seconds from the time the player was beckoned, a time-out should not be charged. However, this should not be interpreted to mean that time for a pep talk by the incoming player should be taken and Official has discretionary authority to charge the team with a time-out if undue time is consumed for such purpose.

PLAY: Do the rules concerning ending of a period apply to the ending of a first or third quarter as well as to the ending of a half or extra period?

RULING: Most of the rules are the same but there is a difference in the time the free throw is thrown when a foul occurs simultaneously with or subsequent to the ending of the quarter. In such cases, the free throw is the beginning of the subsequent quarter.

COMMENT: This difference was introduced at the time the high school game was broken up into quarters (instead of halves). At that time there was a desire to reduce the number of jumps and this was one way to do it. Since that time, most of the center jumps have been eliminated and it is probable that no great damage would be done by having each quarter start with a jump. This would be consistent with what is done at the end of each half. Such a change would permit a simpler statement in 6-8.

PLAY: Is there any situation in which time expires with the ball not in flight but a subsequent goal is counted?

RULING: No. If ball is still in possession of the player when time expires, it becomes dead immediately and this applies regardless of whether the player may be in the act of throwing for goal.

PLAY: During a charged time-out, players step off the court to talk to their coach at the bench. Is this a foul for leaving the court without permission?

RULING: No. They have permission to step off the court for this purpose.

PLAY: Does throwing or batting include bouncing or rolling the ball?

RULING: Yes. It is impossible for a player to bounce or roll the ball without throwing or batting it. The four terms are used in some places in the rules but it is a type of redundance which is a holdover from the early days of the game.

PLAY: Does successive tries for goal constitute a dribble?

RULING: No. Neither is one try for goal a dribble. When a player tries for goal, it is assumed that his team immediately loses control of the ball. This is in accordance with the note under 9-7.

PLAY: A1 is involved in a double foul and it is his fifth and disqualifying foul. Scorer does not discover this until after A1 has attempted his free throw. While the ball is being taken to the other end of the court for the second free throw, the error is discovered. Should his substitute be allowed to attempt the throw or should the attempt of A1 be accepted if made or missed?

RULING: If the throw has been attempted, it is primarily the fault of the officials. If successful, the points count. If unsuccessful, no substitute throw should be permitted.

PLAY: A1 is in his front court near the division line when he receives a pass. He is hemmed in by B1 and B2. He tosses ball over the heads of these players so that it alights in the front court. To avoid contact with B1, A1 runs into the back court and then enters the front court to recover the ball. Has ball been in back court during this air dribble?

RULING: Ball was not in back court. In this respect, the division line is different from a boundary line.

Request From CARE

A letter was received recently from CARE concerning the fact that the physical needs of millions of young people in Europe and Asia must be of concern to America, that these generations are in unfortunate circumstances today through no fault of their own, and that in a few years they will be sitting across the world conference table from our own boys and girls. Mr. Milton L. Smith, Director of the Educational Unit of CARE, says: "Food conditions have improved in Europe. However, millions of these young people are hungry and live under conditions beyond our comprehension. A number of prominent men in the athletic world have suggested prominent men in the athletic world have suggested that the various state athletic associations be given the opportunity to bring this need to the attention of their membership. A school athletic department could, in many ways, raise ten dollars for one package of food or blankets, or \$5.50 for a package of badly needed lard. This could be done with a minimum of effort and the school athletic department would have the benefit of selecting the type of person or country where they wish their neekage sent. Please do not feel that your help in package sent... Please do not feel that your help in this matter will be establishing a precedent. It is CARE's hope that the emergency in Europe will be over in another year."

The Educational Unit of CARE, the address of which is 50 Broad Street, New York City 4, New York, will supply to interested school men, order blanks, posters, photographs, radio scripts, reproductions of editorials and letters, and campaign ideas.

The Athletic Institute

The Beginning Sports Series is another not-forprofit program created by The Athletic Institute in the interest of physical education, athletics and recreation. Designed as a low cost audio-visual instructional aid, this new program utilizes the highly effective, simple-to-operate, sound slidefilm technique. It is a program designed to help coaches teach the fundamental skills of a wide variety of activities to both large and small groups. Slidefilm units in Beginning Archery, Beginning Golf, Beginning Tennis, and Beginning Tumbling have been prepared to date, these being the first of many units which will follow. PLAY: Ball is directly under basket of A when A1 or B1 bats it through the basket from below. It rolls around the ring and falls back through the basket. B1 bats it to one side and dribbles down to throw a field goal in his own basket.

RULING: Legal field goal. No goal at A's basket but ball remained alive.

PLAY: What is the meaning of "last play" in the question under 5-7?

RULING: The term "a play" is indefinite and has no specific meaning in basketball. In past years, the term was frequently used but all use of it has now disappeared with the exception of this question and answer. Fortunately, in the case cited, the indefinite nature of the term is not a serious matter. Since a foul always causes Timer to stop the clock, the only situation to which this question applies is one in which the foul is simultaneous with the ending of the period.

SWIMMING

Starts

While more speed is picked up at the turns than at the start, a bad start sometimes loses a race. The normal start is "Swimmers take your marks," then the starting signal, either whistle or gun. Since the body must be in contact with the starting point until the starting signal has been given, it is imperative that perfect balance be maintained until the actual signal, otherwise some starters may be slow in giving the starting signal and catch a swimmer off balance in anticipation of the signal. At the preparatory words "take your marks" the swimmers walk right up to the edge with the toes hooked well over the edge, body in a slightly crouching position, eyes straight ahead, arms slightly back but not too far. At the starting signal the legs should give a powerful thrust as arms are flung out over the head and the entire momentum of the body aimed at the other end of the course rather than at the water. This will insure a "pancake" entry and maximum distance through the air with minimum resistance through the water as the body contacts it. As in swimming positions the minimum resistance will be attained through a rather straight body line rather than any particular arch of the back. During the first contact with the water there is more forward momentum from the weight of the body than would be obtained by an immediate pick up of the stroke. Therefore, the stroke should not be picked up until the body momentum has almost reached its maximum. On the back crawl start, the fingers should grasp the gutter at the starting point, feet planted fairly well toward the surface, legs tightly tucked, eyes straight ahead. At the starting signal both arms are flung backward over the head together as the legs drive the body into the start. In the breaststroke start a somewhat deeper entry is used since usually several strokes are taken underwater, being faster.

Individual Medley

The first part is the breaststroke, with the turn as explained under "Breaststroke," except that after both hands pull the body against the turning wall in the tuck position, the Back Crawl Start is done from this position, to go into the second part of the medley. The final leg, freestyle, is gone into from a regular back crawl turn, with the exception that, instead of going over on the back for the push off, the face forward (in the water) position is performed.

Medley Relay

The lead-off man starts with the back crawl. The next man swims breaststroke and the final man free style. See "Relay" for precautions.

Relay

Whether there is an "honor start" or a "touch off" a team member taking premature start disqualifies his team. The swimmer must have made body contact with the end of the course or any part of his body must have passed the vertical plane formed by the turning board or wall before his teammate may leave the take off. The "touch off" is usually made by a tap on the calf of the leg, or drawing fingers off the foot.

Fouls and Disqualifications

Among others, if a swimmer interferes with the forward progress of another or if there is bodily contact, he is disqualified. (He may swim out of his lane but must offer no interference with another swimmer.) The Referee's decision is final. Three false starts disqualify a swimmer. Swimming the wrong stroke disqualifies. In free style, any stroke may be used. In A.A.U. competition, and in breaststroke races, the first stroke taken above the surface after the start must be continued throughout the race (i.e., contestant may not change from "fly" to orthodox breaststroke) or vice versa.

PLAY: During a jump ball, A1 taps ball outside the restraining circle, then catches it and dribbles to the back court. Is this legal?

RULING: Taking it to the back court under such circumstances would be legal but a violation was committed when the jumper caught the ball. The rules permit the jumper to do nothing except tap the ball while the jump is in progress, hence catching is a violation. A jumper may catch the ball after it has touched the floor or the basket or backboard or has touched one of the non-jumpers. Any one of these acts brings the jump to an end and the jumper then has all the rights of any of his teammates.

PLAY: With score 30-30 in the last few seconds, A1 tries for field goal. Immediately after ball is in flight, time for the game expires. While ball is rolling around the ring, B1 pushes A2. Ball does not go in basket. Is this a personal or technical foul and, if free throw is made, is an extra period played?

RULING: Ball does not become dead until basket is made or missed. Hence, this is a personal foul. The period does not end until the free throw has been made or missed. Hence, if free throw is successful, no extra period is played.
