Commissioner's Message

The action taken by representatives of professional baseball at their recent meeting, relative to the high school rule, was very encouraging to all friends of high school baseball. National Federation Secretary H. V. Porter, reporting on the meeting in the National Press, says:

"At the 1952 meeting of Professional Baseball Clubs, the friends of the high school baseball program were successful in securing action in harmony with the desires of the high school leaders as expressed in the resolution adopted at the 1952 meeting. Discussion centered around attempts by a minority to overthrow the high school regulation 106 (h) which protects the eligibility of high school boys. A new regulation 107 which would have permitted the signing of a high school boy to a contract prior to graduation was scheduled to go into effect on January 1. It required a three-fourths majority to change this. Several factors made the renewal of the present high school rule possible. Since the 1952 meeting, high school athletic leaders have been working to prevent termination of the present rule. State executives and board of control members have contacted baseball leaders, sports writers and others to enlist their support for extension of the present rule. These contacts called attention to the need for positive action among the leaders in Professional Baseball who are friendly toward the high school program.

"Partly as a result of this activity, the Baseball Executive Council placed itself on record as recommending a continuance of the present rule. Because they were somewhat doubtful of the ability to muster a three-fourths vote, their recommendation was that the present regulation be extended for a period of one year only. Under this recommendation, the undesired regulation 107 which was a part of the By-Laws to go into effect at a specified date, would have automatically applied on January 1, 1954. When this recommendation was given pub-

licity, several club owners who have strong convictions about the value of the high school athletic program, submitted another proposal which extends the present regulation for an indefinite period and rescinded the undesirable regulation 107 which would have permitted, at a specified date, the signing of high school boys. After discussion, most of the opposition disappeared and the more favorable amendment was adopted without dissenting vote. Consequently, the high school regulation which has been in effect during 1952 now applies for an indefinite period and until rescinded or amended by a three-fourths majority vote.

"Another factor which contributed to successful action was the newly adopted bonus rule. This rule gives certain protection to young players who are paid a bonus above a stated figure. Such players, if signed to a Major League Club, must be retained on the rostrum of that club for a period of at least two years. There are similar protective measures for a player who is signed by a Minor League Club.

"Continuance of the baseball program by the Joint Baseball Committee as proposed in the baseball report which was included in the January issue of the National Press was authorized by favorable action by the American League, National League and the National Association. This program involves activities centered around publications, motion pictures, clinic aids and assistance with the summer baseball program. This action will insure continuance of the program which has been in progress since 1944 when the Joint Committee was established."

In basketball, comments on the current rules reveal differences of opinion as to the degree of success of the one and one penalty and of the double free throw penalty for the last three minutes. Early season games are seldom suitable for comparison with last season data because such data usually represent games near the end of the season when

"Approved" and "Certified" Officials

Ninety-five basketball officials have qualified for the "Certified" rating this year, and sixty-five have received the "Approved" rating. The latter rating does not carry forward from year to year, but must be earned each year. After an official has received the "Certified" rating, he keeps this rating by clinic attendance. Only officials receiving these higher ratings are eligible to work in the regional tournaments. Only "Certified" officials, who are residents of Kentucky, are eligible to work in the State Tournament.

play is better organized. Here are a few excerpts from favorable and unfavorable statements.

Forrest C. "Phog" Allen objects to the rule and states that games will be "eight to twenty minutes longer." Early game statistics indicate that Mr. Allen may have over-estimated the lengthening of the game by the new rule.

Secretary Lyle Quinn finds that the new rules are being favorably received. He states that if the extra free throws are lengthening the game, they give the player a slightly longer time to get his pulse back to normal, and that they also reduce the amount of strenuous rebounding which, in turn, creates fouling situations.

Sports editor Al Bricker of New Philadelphia, Ohio, denounces the "stupid rule change" and calls upon the National Committee to "rectify their error before they ruin the game."

New York and Illinois, after using experimental rules modifications last year, agreed to adhere to the current rules without modification. Early season reports indicate that the rules are meeting with favor.

IN MEMORIAM

Tullus A. Chambers, Superintendent of Benton City Schools for the past twenty-five years, died in the Murray Hospital, Murray, Kentucky, November 20, 1952. He was fifty-five years of age.

Mr. Chambers had been connected with public education for thirty-six years. He began his career as a teacher in the rural schools of his native Calloway County. Except for one year of service in the army of World War I, he taught in the rural schools until 1922, at which time he was made principal and coach of Almo High School, Calloway County, where he remained until July 1, 1927. He then came to Benton as Superintendent, coach and vocational agriculture teacher. In 1929 he gave up his active coaching duties to devote his full time to administration and agricultural work. He was an ardent sports enthusiast, working tirelessly for the betterment of all athletic activities. After coming to Benton he built the first indoor gymnasium in Marshall County and organized the first Marshall County basketball tournament. Even after giving up his active coaching duties he took a leading part in advancing high school sports in the state of Kentucky.

Mr. Chambers was a graduate of Western Kentucky State College, and he received his Master's Degree from the University of Kentucky. He was a life member of N.E.A., and a member of K.E.A. and F.D.E.A., and was past president of F.D.E.A. He was one

of the most outstanding superintendents in the State of Kentucky and was a tireless worker for the betterment of schools and the improvement of his community. He was an active member of the First Missionary Baptist Church of Benton, and was Sunday School teacher there for many years.

The sudden and premature death of Mr. Chambers, which on personal grounds has brought sorrow to the hearts of a multitude of friends, is to the educational world an inestimable loss. By his great courage, clear wisdom and remarkable patience, he established a record of achievement which will be a source of inspiration to all who knew him.

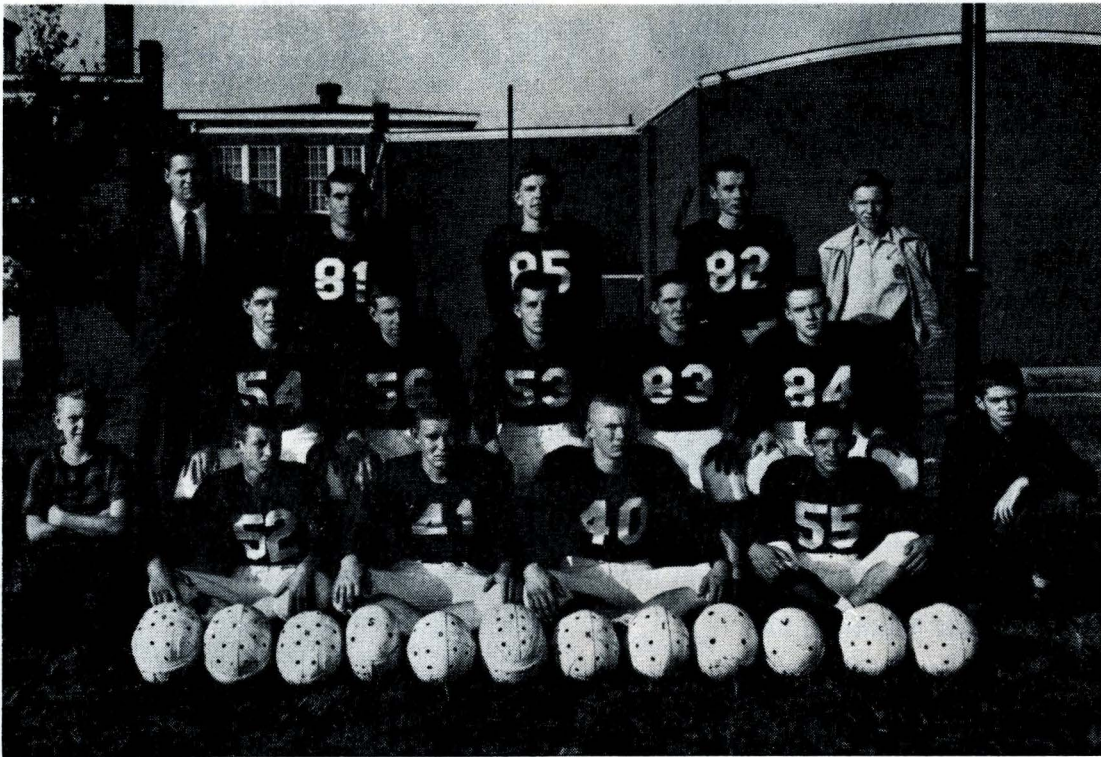

NEW EDITION OF TRACK RULES:

The 1953 edition of the Track and Field Rules Book is now being distributed. The book contains all new records, results of the track meets of last spring and the latest version of the track rules. While there are not a great many differences from the rules of last year, the following will be of interest to track coaches. (1) The list of Officials now includes a Hurdle Chief and Assistants. (2) Provision is made for tie heats when qualification for the next round is involved. When possible, all competitors who are involved in the tie should be provided a place in the next higher qualifying heat. If a limited number of lanes prevents this, the tied competitors shall run a special heat to determine which shall qualify for the next higher heat. (3) Rule 9-1 has been revised to give more specific information as to the most desirable size for groups during preliminary trials in the broad jump, shot put, discus throw and javelin throw. (4) The minimum width of the broad jump landing pit is listed as 9 ft. (instead of the former 6 ft.) (5) To eliminate hurdles which are too heavy for safety, a maximum over-turning force is now specified. The new overturning force is listed as a minimum of 8 lbs. and a maximum of 8 lbs. 13 oz.

Two new National Interscholastic Records appear in the new edition. In the 120 yd. hurdles, Bil Curtis of Waurika, Oklahoma, is listed as having tied the National Record of 14 seconds. The other two holders are Lee Miller of San Antonio, Texas, and Joe Batiste of Tucson, Arizona.

In the shot put, the new record holder is Leon Patterson of Taft, California. The new record is 60 ft. 9 7/8 in.

IN MEMORIAM

Mr. Henley L. Cash, Superintendent of the Lynch Independent Schools, died at the home of his father-in-law, Mr. Clay Hamilton, in Lancaster, Kentucky, on Thanksgiving Day, November 27. He was fifty-five years of age.

Mr. Cash had been connected with schools since 1921, beginning his career as a high school teacher in Springfield, Kentucky. He came to Lynch as teacher of Latin and history in 1924. He became principal of the Lynch High School in 1927 and superintendent of schools in 1945. A graduate of Centre College in 1921, he received his M. A. degree from the University of Kentucky in 1940.

He had a host of friends among the educators and people of Kentucky. His untimely passing resulted from a heart attack which occurred only a few minutes before his death, causing such a blow to all who knew him. His many years of sincere, unselfish, loyal and devoted service to boys and girls and to the community will make such a dent in school life that it will never seem the same. A devout Christian gentleman, he was quite active in the Lynch Community Church. He was listed in "Who's Who in American Education," and was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity, Phi Delta Kappa honorary society, American Legion, and the 40 and 8 Club.

Mr. Cash was a man of lofty ideals and deep convictions, with a high sense of honor.

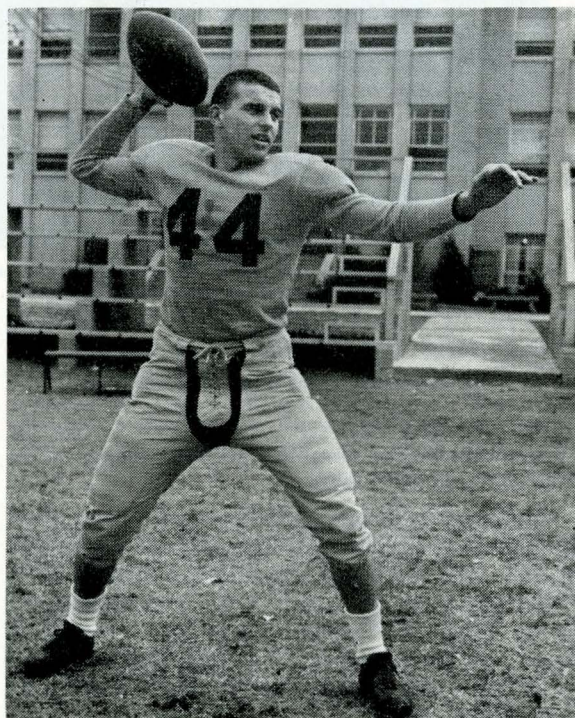
